CELTIC SWING STILL POSSIBLE FOR EPSOM **DERBY** Sunday's French Derby winner Celtic Swing (GB) (Damister) is one of the 17 colts left in this weekend's £850,000 Vodafone Derby at Epsom. But connections of the colt have already stated that "only if something were to happen to Pennekamp (Bering {GB}) and the ground become bottomless" would he attempt a classic double in the space of six days. The Epsom probables are: Court of Honour (Law Society), Daffaq (Unfuwain), Fahal (Silver Hawk), Humbel (Theatrical {Ire}), Korambi (Kris {GB}), Lammtarra (Nijinsky II), Maralinga (Simply Great), Munwar (Kalaglow), Pennekamp, Presenting (Mtoto {GB}), Rivadian (Polish Precedent), Salmon Ladder (Bering {GB}), Sebastian (Sadler's Wells), Spectrum (Rainbow Quest), Tamure (Sadler's Wells) and Vettori (Machiavellian). Undefeated Pennekamp is listed as the early favorite at 11-8 odds, with Spectrum second choice at 11-4.

SERENA'S SONG WORKS Serena's Song (Rahy), nine-length winner of the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. at Pimlico in her last start, drilled five furlongs in a sharp :58 2/5 Sunday at Churchill Downs in preparation for Friday's GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont. The three-year-old filly will be flown to New York Tuesday morning along with several Belmont Stakes hopefuls.

HBS CEASES OPERATIONS Horsemen's Blood-stock Services LLC President Milton J. "Laddie" Dance announced Monday that the auction firm which he started two years ago with the late John M.S. Finney will cease operations immediately. "We are obviously disappointed, but we feel it was a valiant attempt that unfortunately did not work," said Dance. "We overestimated the need for a second auction firm in the mid-Atlantic states. There are those who still believe there is a need for a second company in Ocala; however we could not muster enough support after our initial effort there to warrant further expenditures."

LUKAS PAIR WORKS Trainer D. Wayne Lukas' Belmont Stakes-bound duo of Timber Country (Woodman) and Thunder Gulch (Gulch) both worked Monday morning at Churchill Downs. Kentucky Derby winner Thunder Gulch went five furlongs in 1:02 2/5, while Preakness victor Timber Country drilled six panels in 1:12 2/5. "Timber Country's work is about as good as it can get," said Lukas. It's very significant." Lukas said he was equally pleased with Thunder Gulch's move, and noted he did not expect as much from the Derby winner's work. The pair will be flown to NY Tuesday morning along with fellow Belmont S. hopefuls Knockadoon (Dixieland Band) and Wild Syn (Wild Again). The plane is scheduled to depart Louisville at 8 a.m. for the two-hour flight to New York.

winner Petionville (Seeking the Gold) will bypass the Belmont S. in favor of the June 17 Ohio Derby, trainer Randy Bradshaw said Monday from Hollywood Park. "This horse has only had one race at 1 1/8-miles and had a bad trip," said Bradshaw. "I'd hate to send him 1½-miles against horses who have already gone 1¼-miles and 1 3/16-miles and probably have more seasoning and depth. I couldn't see any advantage to it."

CITADEED BREEZES Peter Pan S. winner Citadeed (Shadeed) made his move over Belmont's main track yesterday, and trainer Rick Violette liked what he saw. "He went a half in :49 2/5, exactly the way I wanted to see him go," said Violette. "He's as fit as we're going to get him. Now we just want to keep him happy and keep him in his feed tub. Eddie Maple was on him today and he told me he never used him at all."

WILD SYN WORKS IN COMPANY Blue Grass hero Wild Syn (Wild Again) worked a half-mile yesterday at Churchill Downs. "He worked in company with another horse, relaxed about a length and a half behind the other for the first half, and then opened up on him by three by the end," said trainer Tom Arnemann. "He went the half in :49 and galloped out in 1:03. I liked what I saw, especially the way he relaxed the first part. Randy (Romero) was real happy with it too."

OFF'N'AWAY ARRIVES IN NEW YORK Irish import Off'N'Away (Be My Guest) arrived at Aqueduct's quarantine barn at 2:30 a.m. Monday morning after his trip from Ireland. "He traveled great," said Peter Russell, assistant to trainer Dermot Weld, yesterday. "Probably better than we did. He walked today and will do the same tomorrow. We're hoping to leave quarantine tomorrow evening to go to Belmont. We'll take him to the track Wednesday morning and Mike Smith will be on to gallop him. He's finished with all his major work for the race. He's coming off a good race on the all-weather track at Lingfield, and he worked this past Friday (1½-miles) and he did it very well."

KNOCKADOON HAS FINAL PREPARATION

Knockadoon (Dixieland Band) posted his final prep for Saturday's classic over the Churchill Downs strip Monday. "He went five-eighths in 1:01 2/5, and galloped out three quarters in 1:14 2/5. He came out of it in good order," trainer Tony Reinstedler said. "I'll say that he'll just gallop up to the race, but we may do a little something with him by the end of the week to let him get a run over the surface."

KRONE LIKELY TO RIDE STAR STANDARD Trainer Nick Zito reported Monday that Joseph Cornacchia and William Condren's Star Standard (Risen Star) will most likely be ridden by Julie Krone in Saturday's Belmont S. "I'd like Julie to ride the horse," said Zito, who was critical of Krone's ride aboard Suave Prospect in the Kentucky Derby. The trainer noted it wasn't the first time he'd been critical of Krone--or any other jockey--and probably wouldn't be the last. "I didn't like the first quarter-mile of the race," he said of the Derby. "The outcome could have been the same (if she had ridden him differently), we don't know."

COLONIAL SECRETARY WORKS FOR BELMONT Colonial Secretary (Pleasant Colony) worked six furlongs Monday in 1:15 4/5 over the wood-chip track at Fair Hill, Maryland. Trainer Eugene Weymouth Sr. said the horse will be vanned to Belmont Saturday morning to compete in the Belmont S. Colonial Secretary has won two of eight career starts for earnings of \$31,950. In his last outing May 28, which was also his turf debut, the bay colt finished seventh in an allowance at Pimlico.

COMPOSER HITS THE RIGHT NOTES Trainer Bill Mott said yesterday of Composer (Easy Goer), "He's doing fine. He went three-quarters today in 1:13, went seven in 1:26 and galloped out the mile in 1:40. He looked good, went smooth, did everything right. If he looks like he comes out of it okay tomorrow, then we'll be looking at the Belmont."

OHIO DERBY FIELD TAKES SHAPE Donald Kroeger and Chateau Ridge Farm's Dazzling Falls (Taylor's Falls), who has already left a wake of Derby victories through Oklahoma, Arkansas and Alabama, arrived at Thistledown late Monday evening to begin his preparation for the \$300,000 GII Ohio Derby, to be contested Saturday, June 17. Preakness runner-up Oliver's Twist (Horatius) is scheduled to arrive in Northeast Ohio from his Maryland base June 16 for the race. Pat Pavlish's I Still Believe (Believe It), who prepped for the Ohio Derby with a victory in the Southfield S. at Detroit Race Course May 29, is already on the Thistledown backstretch awaiting race day. The colt will be looking to make amends for his sire's disappointing effort in the 1978 Ohio Derby, when he was a badly beaten sixth at odds of 1-2. "Well, hopefully he doesn't know about that," said trainer Alan Sobol. "But if he does, I hope he uses it as motivation." Also joining the field of probables is Petionville (Seeking the Gold), who will skip the Belmont S. in favor of a trip to Thistledown.
