STRAWBERRY ROAD DESTROYED Brookside Farm manager Ted Carr reported that multiple champion and sire Strawberry Road (Aust) (Whiskey Road) was humanely destroyed at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital Thursday, June 1, after a two-month battle for his health. Strawberry Road was taken to the equine hospital near Lexington April 1 after suffering a severe diarrhetic reaction to the antibiotics he was given to combat a bacterial infection he had received from a mare. A few days later, it was necessary to conduct emergency surgery to alleviate problems in his intestine. Strawberry Road had been mending well from the surgery, but then contracted pneumonia and peritonitis. He responded well to treatment of those two ailments and was again well along toward successful recovery. However, a second surgery was performed Sunday, May 21 to correct serious rectal adhesions that had developed. By this time, the stallion was in a weakened condition and had other complications he could not overcome. Brookside owner Allen Paulson was the owner of Strawberry Road throughout his stud career, which began in 1987. The 16-year-old stallion, a graded stakes-winner in four countries, sired nine stakes winners from five crops to date, including Grade I winners Fraise, Fowda and Dinard.

Sunday, Hollywood Park: CALIFORNIAN S.-GI, \$250,000a, 3yo/up, 1 1/8m Concern (Broad Brush) worked a mile in 1:39 4/5 over Pimlico's fast main track Tuesday in his final preparation for the Californian. Trainer Richard Small plans to ship the Breeders' Cup Classic winner to Monmouth Park Wednesday, and then have the colt fly non-stop from Newark to LAX Saturday. GSW Lottery Winner (Apalachee), who breezed five furlongs in 1:00 3/5 at Santa Anita Tuesday, will run in the Californian, according to reports from trainer Darrell Vienna's barn. The six-year-old gelding, who took the GII Goodwood H. at Oak Tree in 1993, hasn't won since April 24, 1994, when he won the Bates Motel H. at Santa Anita. Californian probables Tossofthecoin (Magesterial) and Blumin Affair (Dynaformer) worked Monday at Hollywood Park; Tossofthecoin covered six furlonas in 1:14 2/5. while Blumin Affair went a mile in 1:37 3/5. Other expected runners include Best Pal (*Habitony), Let's Be Curious (Air Forbes Won) and Tinners Way (Secretariat).

Saturday, Epsom Downs: VODAFONE CORONATION CUP-G1

Last year's Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Carnegie (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Breeders' Cup Turf hero Tikkanen (Cozzene) are set to clash head on in Saturday's Coronation Cup. Carnegie, who has not run since his Arc victory last October 2, will again be ridden by Thierry Jarnet. "The horse seems very well," said Andre Fabre, who trains him for Sheikh Mohammed. Tikkanen will have the services of iockey Cash Asmussen, who piloted him to a secondplace finish in the G2 Madagans Jockey Club S. at Newmarket in his last start May 5. "Tikkanen is fine," said trainer Jonathan Pease. "He has been working well, and (owner) Mr. Strawbridge was present to see his most recent gallop." Only Royale (Ire) (Caerleon), the six-year-old mare who defeated Tikkanen a month ago, is also an intended runner. Other probables are group stakes-winners Broadway Flyer (Theatrical {Ire}), Environment Friend (GB) (Cozzene), Sunshack (GB) (Rainbow Quest), Time Star (Manila) and Zilzal Zamaan (Zilzal), as well as the multiple group stakes-placed Ionio (Silver Hawk).

LUKAS CONTINGENT, OTHERS ARRIVE AT BELMONT Belmont Stakes hopefuls Timber Country (Woodman), Thunder Gulch (Gulch), Knockadoon (Dixieland Band) and Wild Syn (Wild Again) arrived at Belmont Park shortly after 10:30 a.m. Tuesday following a one hour and 34 minute flight from Louisville, Kentucky. While D. Wayne Lukas-trainees Timber Country and Thunder Gulch grazed outside Belmont's Barn 10, Lukas said, "This might be a bold statement, but I feel both Timber Country and Thunder Gulch are better going into the Belmont than going into the Derby. This track fits them both well. We're going into a very good situation with a 1½-mile track with big sweeping turns they've both won on, with two world-class riders."

STAR STANDARD WORKS Star Standard (Risen Star) worked three-eighths around the turn at Belmont in :35 Tuesday morning, galloping out the half-mile in :47. "He went great," said trainer Nick Zito, who also confirmed that Julie Krone will ride Star Standard in the Belmont.

AMERICAN HORSE COUNCIL TAKES ON

INDIANS According to an article in the *Fort Worth Star Telegram*, American Horse Council President James J. Hickey Jr., speaking at the AHC's annual convention in Fort Worth, Texas, said Indian gaming is detrimental to the horse racing industry. Hickey told the *Star Telegram*, "Indian gaming in most cases hurts tracks. It's just not a level playing field for racetracks, horse owners and breeders." Hickey added that the AHC is pushing for legislation in Congress that would limit tribes to offering only the types of gambling permitted by their specific states.

BELMONT STAKES GOES ONLINE Hugh Finn's Horse Racing News, which appears on the world-wide web, will provide live coverage of Saturday's Belmont Stakes, with race coverage beginning June 7. In addition to actual race coverage, users will have access to information provided daily by reporters and photographers on location. They will cover the workouts, barn notes, post positions, morning-line odds, track conditions, interviews with jockeys and trainers and an analysis of horse performances. Through their home page, users will also have access to the Handicapping Column and an Industry Column, which will address the latest issues in the horse racing industry.
