

CECIL COLT COULD MISS DERBY Sebastian (Sadler's Wells), heavily backed for Saturday's Epsom Derby following a 10-length victory in his latest start, could be forced to miss the Classic. The Henry Ceciltrained colt, ridden by Pat Eddery in search of his fourth Derby win, had a good work on Newmarket's gallops yesterday but connections later revealed he was "sore across his back" and doubtful for the \$1.3 million event. "We don't know the full situation yet," said Cecil, "but unless he is 100 percent, Sebastian will not run at Epsom. We'll have to see how he is on Thursday morning." This year, runners for the Derby must be declared 48 hours in advance.

BRACH CONSPIRATOR SENTENCED Following a two-week hearing, U.S. District Court Judge Milton Shadur has decided that Richard Bailey should spend the rest of his life in prison because he "more probably than not" conspired to kill Helen Vorhees Brach, a suburban Chicago Thoroughbred and show horse owner, in 1977. In his 41-page decision, Judge Shadur found Bailey had a "powerful motive" to solicit the murder of the candy heiress after she threatened to report to authorities that he had defrauded her in a series of show horse purchases. The judge, who delayed formally imposing sentence until next week because of a legal question raised by Bailey's attorney, cited a "preponderance of evidence" and told the courtroom "this calls for a sentence of life imprisonment." Bailey, a 65-yearold former suburban Chicago equestrian stable owner, had pleaded guilty to defrauding rich women in the purchase of show horses but denied any involvement in the disappearance of Brach, last seen alive Feb. 17, 1977. "This is a tremendous win for the United States government," said the lead prosecutor, Assistant U.S. Attorney Steven A. Miller, after the judge ruled in the government's favor on virtually all points. "It is the first time since her mysterious disappearance that anyone has been held accountable for her demise."

"You will see a very special filly Friday," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. No one would doubt it. **Serena's Song** (Rahy) comes into the Mother Goose off a nine-length win in the May 19 Black Eyed Susan S., just 13 days after a fast early pace caused a 16th-place finish for the lone filly in the Kentucky Derby field. "I wouldn't have passed the Derby," said Lukas, "but I would have advised Corey Nakatani to take off the pace. She can rate, as she showed in the Black Eyed Susan, but with 120,000 people screaming, you get caught up in the situation."

Sunday, Hollywood Park:

THE CALIFORNIAN S.-GI, \$250,000a, 3yo/up, 9f The newest addition to the Californian field is Stoller (El Gran Senor), third in the 1 1/16-mile Inglewood H. (GIII) in his last start May 6. "He just ran the best race of his life," trainer Lewis Cenicola said. "And I don't think he'll have any trouble getting the mile and an eighth. Whether he's good enough to beat these horses, I don't know. Sometimes you've got to take a shot, though, and he's awfully good right now." In other Wednesday developments, **Tinners Way** (Secretariat) drilled six furlongs in 1:13 4/5 over Hollywood's main track, while jockey G.F. Almeida was named to ride Jack Van Berg-trainee **Blumin Affair** (Dynaformer).

SAM HOUSTON DEADLINE SET The federal bankruptcy court judge handling the case of Sam Houston Race Park has established June 15 as the deadline for the racetrack's officials to file reorganization plans, according to a report in yesterday's *Fort Worth Star-Telegram.* U.S. Judge Letitia Clark has scheduled an Aug. 8 hearing on the reorganization plans for the \$85 million racetrack. Gary Reibschisger, an attorney for a group that hopes to seize control of the track, said his group likely will file a reorganization plan, according to the paper.
