JACK PRICE DIES Jack Price, the owner of 1961 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Carry Back, died of congestive heart failure Wednesday night. He was 87 years old. Price was born in Cleveland, Ohio in 1907, where he worked as a candy butcher. He went into business with his brothers during World War II manufacturing vital equipment for the government. He retired in 1955 to devote his life to Thoroughbreds. The breeder, owner and trainer of Carry Back, Price retired when his Derby winner did, building a farm in Ocala. Price resumed his training career at age 64.


