TIMBER COUNTRY OUT OF BELMONT

Preakness winner Timber Country (Woodman), who had been installed as the morning-line favorite for today's Belmont S., was withdrawn from the race Friday after developing a fever. "When we came back to the barn after Serena's Song's win this afternoon, Timber Country had spiked a fever," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas yesterday. "After waiting about an hour to see if the temperature would come down, and it didn't, a decision was made to medicate him. There was no recourse. He is fine now. All of the owners were in agreement. All were in concurrence with the decision. The horse is too valuable to everybody concerned. He will be declared from the race. It may be a small virus that may be over in 24 hours. We'll go over there tomorrow and see what we can do with Thunder Gulch (Gulch)."

POULE D'ESSAI RESULT STANDS Matiara (Bering (GB)) has been confirmed the winner of last month's G1 Dubai Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp. Connections of runner-up Carling (Fr) (Garde Royale {Ire}) had lodged an appeal claiming that winning jockey Freddie Head had crossed their filly and caused her to check on the home turn. French Jockey Club stewards, after viewing recordings of the incident, have concluded that the finishing order should be allowed to stand. However, they have suspended three jockeys--Head, Cash Asmussen (who rode Piquetnol) and Olivier Peslier (Shaanxi)--for four days each. The suspensions, officially for "rough riding," will prevent the trio from taking mounts June 17 through 20 inclusive. The punishment will probably affect Asmussen most of all, as it means he is now forced to miss the first day of Royal Ascot's prestigious annual fixture.

FIRST WIN FOR HOUSEBUSTER At Ruidoso Downs June 8, two-time Champion Sprinter and freshman sire Housebuster (Mt. Livermore) had his first winner from his first starter when the two-year-old colt Houseafire went wire-to-wire to win his debut by 10 lengths. Out of the In Reality mare Red Bordeaux, Houseafire, owned by Buck Abbott, covered the 5½-furlongs in 1:05 2/5. Housebuster stands at Jonabell Farm in Lexington, Kentucky.


CASINO GAMBLING ON FLORIDA BALLOT--

AGAIN Just seven months after Florida residents voted 2-1 against casino gambling in their state. Bally Entertainment convinced the Florida Supreme Court to put its own proposed amendment to the state constitution on the 1996 ballot. If the proposal passes, it would bring casino gambling to selected counties in the Sunshine State. The Chicago-based company's amendment calls for a maximum of 20 casinos and riverboats, and only in counties that approve the amendment. Voters rejected the 1994 casino amendment which called for casinos in the state's 35 pari-mutuel establishments plus at selected hotels. Last year only South Florida's Broward (Fort Lauderdale) County residents voted in favor of the constitutional change, and it was narrowly defeated in Dade (Miami) County.
