### PENNEKAMP'S CAREER THREATENED

Pennekamp (Bering {GB}), sent of the 11-8 favourite for Saturday's Epsom Derby, sustained an injury during the race which could bring about an end to his racing career. Sheikh Mohammed's colt, previously winner of Newmarket's 2000 Guineas, trailed in 11th at the end of the Derby and jockey Thierry Jarnet was quick to express fears that his mount was seriously lame. Monday, the rider's concern proved to be well-founded; X-ray's revealed a hairline fracture of a fetlock joint. Sheikh Mohammed's racing manager Anthony Stroud said, "Pennekamp will be box-rested for four weeks before further tests are taken to assess his progress."

KENTUCKY CUP II SET FOR SEPTEMBER The second annual \$1 million Kentucky Cup Day of Champions is set for Saturday, September 23 at Turfway Park. The six-race event will feature three races televised nationally on ESPN2's new "2Day at the Races." The colt is scheduled to have a serious breeze today or tomorrow. Jockey Eddie Maple will ride Pat Pavlish's I Still Believe (Believe It) in the race. A winner of five of his last six starts, the colt drilled a sharp five furlongs in :58 2/5 Sunday. "This horse is good right now," said Chuck Burneson, assistant to trainer Alan Sobol. "He's as right as he can be." The speedster, a winner at a mile and a sixteenth, tries nine furlongs for the first time. "The farther he goes. the faster he seems to get," said Burneson.
