TEXAS HORSEMEN SUPPORT LONE STAR

According to a story in Tuesday's *Dallas Morning News*, Texas horsemen have agreed to lend their support and money--up to \$5 million--toward the construction of Lone Star Park, the Class 1 race-track proposed for Grand Prairie, Texas, near Dallas. The Executive Committee of the Texas Thoroughbred Breeders' Association has already agreed to a plan that would contribute up to \$5 million to Lone Star's construction pool. The plan must now be agreed to by the Race Committee of the Texas Quarter Horse Association and the Board of Directors of the Texas Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, which are both likely to give their stamps of approval. Then, if the Texas Racing Commission sanctions the plan, it would go into effect. The proposal states that during pre-opening simulcasting at Lone Star, horsemen will contribute 80 percent of their seven percent share in the handle from interstate simulcasting to the track's construction. In addition, all of the horsemen's share of the money bet on races within Texas would go back to the sending tracks--Sam Houston, Retama and Trinity Meadows. If the plan is implemented, the pre-opening simulcasting at Lone Star is projected to generate about \$5 million for construction, \$2 million for purses at other Texas tracks and \$1.25 million for purses at Lone Star. Once Lone Star is open for live racing, it would reimburse horsemen for half of their contributions through increased purses.

CHURCHILL RAISES PURSES Beginning with Wednesday's races, Churchill Downs has raised its purse structure by 3½ percent for the rest of its meeting. That means at the lowest end of the purse structure the races will be worth another \$500, and at the top end the value will go up \$1,000. In addition, the money put into purses by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF) will rise by the same percentage. Though this is the first raise since the meet began, Churchill Downs had raised the purse structure originally laid out for the meeting before the meeting's races even began.

Dazzling Falls (Taylor's Falls) zipped three furlongs in :37 2/5 yesterday at Thistledown, galloping out the half-mile in :49 2/5. "He went quicker than I expected," said trainer Chuck Turco. "But today's drill was just what I wanted. With a lot of speed in Saturday's race, we needed to shake him up a bit. There's no doubt we're going to have to stay closer to the pace than usual Saturday. He likes to come from out of it, but we can't allow someone to steal away from us." Louisiana Derby winner **Petionville** (Seeking the Gold), fourth in the GII Illinois Derby in his last start May 13, arrived at Thistledown Tuesday afternoon from his Southern California base. **I Still Believe** (Believe It) has won five of his last six starts, including the Southfield S. at Detroit Race Course in his last outing May 29. "We've kept saying, 'OK, let's try him here, and then try him again there,' and he's done everything we've asked of him," said trainer Alan Sobol. "So we looked at the (Ohio) Derby and, although we knew it was a huge step up in class, we said 'Why not?' He's earned the chance."

MGSW **Personal Merit** (Turkoman), fourth to Cigar in the Massachusetts H. in his last start, worked a half-mile in a bullet :46 4/5 yesterday at Rockingham Park in preparation for Sunday's Sweepstakes. In his only prior career effort on the grass, Personal Merit finished fourth in the GIII Choice H. at Monmouth last September.
