#### KENTUCKY DERBY PURSE INCREASED TO MINIMUM OF \$1 MILLION The Churchill Downs Board of Directors yesterday voted to increase the minimum purse for the Kentucky Derby to \$1 million. and raise the minimum purse for the Kentucky Oaks to \$500,000 guaranteed. Entry and starter fees for the Derby were increased to \$15,000 each, up from \$10,000. Depending on how many starters go to the post, the total purse could top the million dollar mark. This year's Derby purse was worth \$500,000-added, with nomination and starting fees bringing the total to \$957,400. The Oaks purse was \$300,000-added in 1995, with a total value of \$361,600. "The Committee members felt strongly that purses for both the Derby and Oaks should be increased," said Tom Meeker, Churchill's president and C.E.O., "and they were especially interested in providing a more lucrative financial reward for the first four finishers of the Kentucky Derby. The Committee members believed the Oaks purse deserved a boost because it is the premier threeyear-old filly race in the nation, and Oaks Day has grown into one of Churchill Downs' biggest days in terms of attendance and handle."

# TIMBER COUNTRY BACK ON TRACK Preakness winner Timber Country (Woodman) returned to the track yesterday morning at Belmont Park for the first time since a fever kept him out of last Saturday's Belmont S. He had missed five days of training. "It was just a light jog," said Todd Pletcher, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas, "but his temperature remains good, his blood count is good and he is off all medications. Everything is going as well as expected." Pletcher said that Lukas is still considering the July 2 Dwyer for the colt's next start, but has not made any final decisions. "We'll decide that after watching him train for a few days," Pletcher added. Timber Country is expected to make the July 30 Haskell, with or without a prep in the Dwyer.

Connections of both horses have already declared their intention to run. Eltish will have the assistance of Britain's former champion jockey Pat Eddery, while reigning title holder Frankie Dettori is set to continue his double Classic-winning partnership with Balanchine.

BLUES TRAVELLER TO STUD? Blues Traveller (Ire) (Bluebird), a MGSW of \$742,132, may have made his swan song as a racehorse in last Saturday's \$200,000 Early Times Manhattan S. at Belmont. The five-year-old, who was beaten a nose by Awad in the Grade I event, is being considered for a stud career in New Zealand, trainer Rodney Rash said. "The syndicate that bought half of the horse (from Gary Tanaka) early this year is going to meet in the next few days and make a decision," Rash said. "I can't say for sure, but my guess is that he's headed to New Zealand."

CHURCHILL DOWNS CONDUCTS ANNUAL STOCKHOLDER MEETING At their annual meeting yesterday, Churchill Downs' stockholders were given an update by track President and CEO Thomas H. Meeker on the Company's activities. Meeker revealed that work continues on \$3.6 million in capital improvements to ready Hoosier Park in Anderson, Indiana for the state's first Thoroughbred race meet, slated to begin Sept. 1. In other action, stockholders elected three new members to Churchill Downs' Board of Directors. Elected to the Board were G. Watts Humphrey Jr., W. Bruce Lunsford and Thomas H. Meeker. Four directors, Catesby W. Clay, J. David Grissom, Seth W. Hancock and Frank B. Hower Jr. were reelected as Class II directors to serve terms of three years.

#### BANDERA DOWNS REQUESTS SHORTENED

MEETING Bandera Downs Chairman of the Board William Allan and CEO Stan Scruby announced yesterday that a letter requesting that Bandera Downs be allowed to shorten its 1995 live race season is on its way to the Texas Racing Commission. According to the letter, the closing date for live racing would be July 9, to accommodate the trials and finals of the Bandera Six Flags Futurity and Derby. Track officials believe the commission will approve the request. Poor attendance and handle figures were cited for the reason the request was made. At a horsemen's meeting Wednesday at Bandera Downs, Scruby confirmed that track management wanted to cut the live meet short (the previous ending date was August 20) and drop purses 30 percent; the horsemen indicated they would accept the plan. Scruby stated, "We are doing the best we can and we will get everything worked out as soon as possible."

#### AGA KHAN'S BRITISH BOYCOTT TO END

Adjareli (Nishapour), runner-up in last month's Irish 2000 Guineas, is set to break the Aha Khan's longrunning boycott of British racing in next Tuesday's G1 St. James's Palace Stakes at Royal Ascot. The Aga withdrew his 90-strong team of horses from Britain as a result of Aliysa's disqualification from the 1989 Epsom Oaks. But trainer John Oxx has said that Adjareli has done well since finishing second to Spectrum at the Curragh and is now "on course" for Epsom. Other entries for the race, run over a mile on the first afternoon of the Royal meeting, are: Annus Mirabilis (Warning), Atticus (Nureyev), Bahri (Riverman), Charnwood Forest (Warning), Desert Courier (Naevus), Muhab (Lyphard), Options Open (Then Again), Petit Poucet (Fairy King), Star of Zilzal (Zilzal) and Vettori (Machiavellian).

WEIGHTS RELEASED FOR CAESARS INT'L A pair of Grade I winning California invaders, Red Bishop (Silver Hawk) and Sandpit (Braz) (Baynoun {Ire}), have been assigned co-highweight of 122 pounds for the GI \$500,000 Caesars International H., to be run next Sunday, June 25 at Atlantic City Race Course. With the connections of Red Bishop expected to pass the 1 3/16-mile turf fixture, Richard Mandella-trainee Sandpit is likely to be the topweighted horse to go postward. Next at 120 pounds is The Vid (World Appeal), winner of the GII Early Times Dixie H. at Pimlico May 20.
