TABASCO CAT RETIRED Owners William T. Young and David P. Reynolds yesterday announced that their Classic winner Tabasco Cat (Storm Cat) has been retired. The decision was made after it was learned the four-year-old sustained a slight tendon injury during a morning workout. The winner of last year's Preakness and Belmont S. will stand stud at Young's Overbrook Farm in Lexington, Kentucky.

CALDER POSTPONES SIMULCAST TEST Officials of AmTote (American Totalisator), the totalisator provider for Calder Race Course and the three tracks originally to be included in a full-card simulcasting experiment at Calder later this month, have revealed that AmTote cannot conduct net pool pricing as had been expected, resulting in a postponement of the experiment. Net pool pricing would have allocated the same percentage of each dollar wagered on full-card simulcasts as on live races to fund purses and operating capital. The experiment was set up to benefit Calder's purse structure in the event of a decline in the on-track handle of Calder's live racing. "This experiment could have been one of the answers to providing our fans with what they wanted and...increasing the purses for our horsemen," said Calder President Ken Dunn. "However, I want to emphasize that we are actively pursuing a way to go forward with full-card simulcasting."

FLORIDA HORSEMEN HEADED TO COURT The Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association expects to go into Federal Court next week to sue the more than 80 racetracks that they charge violated the 1978 Interstate Horse Racing Act; the tracks named in the suit had taken the simulcast signal from Hialeah this season despite an FHBPA boycott. "We would have filed sooner, but we are still counting the number of tracks that took the signal," said FHBPA President Kent Sterling. "We've found that some tracks rebroadcast the simulcast signal to other tracks, who then rebroadcast the signal. We want to be sure we get every track, but we also want to be sure we don't name a track and find out later they weren't taking the signal." The FHBPA tried to pull the plug on Hialeah simulcasting May 9 after repeated efforts to get the track to live up to the purse levels agreed upon in their contract failed, but an ad hoc horsemen's group, the Florida Owners' and Horsemen's Association, signed a contract with the track for simulcasting purposes.


