VICE REGENT DEAD Vice Regent (Northern Dancer) died at Windfields Farm near Oshawa, Ontario Sunday, June 18, according to Windfields President Charles Taylor. The 28-year-old stallion was humanely destroved due to the infirmities of old age, and was buried alongside his sire. Ironically, Glenbarra won Laurel's Sir Ivor S. the same day to become Vice Regent's 90th stakes winner. "Vice Regent was a much beloved member of the Windfields family in Canada," Farm Manager Bernard McCormack said. "We consider him to be one of Northern Dancer's best sons at stud--he was to Canadians what Northern Dancer was to the world at large." Winner of two of five starts in a career compromised by an early training accident, Vice Regent earned a place in the Windfields stud barn mainly because of the racetrack success of his full brother, Canadian Horse of the Year Viceregal. He far surpassed Viceregal at stud, however, leading Canada's General Sire List for 11 straight seasons. His 21 crops of racing age include 388 winners of 1,801 races and over \$34,000,000, among them 90 stakes winners, 154 stakes performers and nine champions. Vice Regent's leading runners include Eclipse Champion Deputy Minister, millionaire champions Regal Classic, Regal Intention and Bessarabian, Canadian Horse of the Year Ruling Angel, MGSW Excellent Tipper and Grade I winners Trumpet's Blare and Twice the Vice. Perennial leader among Canadian broodmare sires, Vice Regent was both the Leading Juvenile Sire and Leading Broodmare Sire in Canada last season. His daughters have produced 55 stakes winners, including millionaires Marquetry and Benburb.

RETIREMENT POSSIBLE FOR SKY BEAUTY

Following her disappointing third-place finish in Sunday's GI Hempstead H. at Belmont, trainer Allen Jerkens said **Sky Beauty** (Blushing Groom {Fr}) may be retired. Jerkens discussed the possibility with owner Georgia Hofmann immediately after the race. "I don't know if Sky Beauty will run anymore," said Jerkens. "Mrs. Hofmann is in Europe now, but I talked to her before she left and she said maybe Sky Beauty has done enough. I don't know if we'll bring her back." The only excuse Jerkens could find for the Eclipse Award winner's lackluster performance was some minor bleeding; he said an alternative course of action would call for the mare to be freshened until the fall, then brought back once Lasix is legal in New York, but added that he didn't believe Hofmann would be in favor of that plan.

HOLLYWOOD GOLD CUP PURSE TO \$1

MILLION? The Grade I Hollywood Gold Cup could be worth more than the advertised purse of \$750,000 when run Sunday, July 2. Hollywood Park and the Thoroughbred Owners of California, who jointly determine purse allocations, have agreed to boost the purse to \$1 million if top handicap horse Cigar (Palace Music) and '94 Breeders' Cup Classic winner Concern (Broad Brush) start in the 56th running of the race. "The Hollywood Gold Cup has historically brought together some of the best horses in America," said Hollywood Park General Manager Eual G. Wyatt Jr. "With Cigar and Concern in the Gold Cup, it would be one of the best races of the year." TOC President Ed Friendly added, "It is a goal of the TOC to make California horse racing the best in the world. The confrontation between these two great horses would generate tremendous exposure for the game and spark the interest of fans nationwide."

EPSOM OAKS WINNER SIDELINED Moonshell

(Ire) (Sadler's Wells), winner of Epsom's G1 Vodafone Oaks June 9, has suffered a training setback which will keep her out of action until later this season. The Godolphin-owned filly will therefore miss next month's Irish Oaks at the Curragh, for which she had been considered the early favorite. Simon Crisford, racing manager to Godolphin, said, "Moonshell has a slight problem and, as a result, will not be able to run in Ireland. It's not too serious and, all being well, she'll be back later in the summer."

JOHN OXLEY IS TOBA OWNER OF THE

MONTH The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association Owner of the Month award for May has been granted to John C. Oxley of Tulsa, Oklahoma. Oxley's three-year-old filly Gal in a Ruckus (Bold Ruckus), winner of Sunday's Canadian Oaks, scored two impressive victories at Churchill Downs in the month of May. The first came in the GI Kentucky Oaks at odds of 34-1. Just three weeks later, she went on to capture the \$82,350 Dogwood S. Other May runners for Oxley included GSW's Jambalaya Jazz (Dixieland Band) and Pyramid Peak (Mt. Livermore), who finished 15th and 17th respectively in the Kentucky Derby.
