BANDERA DOWNS CLOSED Bandera Downs Chairman of the Board William Allan and President Stan Scruby announced Tuesday afternoon that they had met with Executive Secretary of the Texas Racing Commission David Freeman to advise him that Bandera Downs must cease operations immediately. Allan and Scruby stated that operating funds, as well as a portion of horsemen's funds, had been depleted to the point that the track was unable to continue, due largely to competition from Retama Park in San Antonio which opened in April. Bandera Downs had previously requested that the Commission consider allowing the track to move up the closing date of its live racing season from August 20 to July 9, and Freeman had indicated that the request would be granted. Freeman told track ownership yesterday that he and other members of the Texas Racing Commission would travel to Bandera immediately to assist with the orderly closing of the facility. Neither racing nor simulcasting may be conducted at Bandera Downs until further notice. Bandera Downs' owners have announced that the track is for sale, and have emphasized that every effort will be made to satisfy creditors and horsemen, either from the proceeds of the sale of the track or from external funding. Scruby and Allan added that they are considering the operation of Bandera's backside barn area to stable horses and provide a training facility, but no decision has been reached at this time.

SMART STRIKE OUT OF QUEENS PLATE

Champion Dance Smartly's half-brother **Smart Strike** (Mr. Prospector) was declared out of the field for the July 9 Queen's Plate yesterday after injuring his right foreleg. "He has a slight strain to the ligaments in the right fore," said trainer Mark Frostad. "He's just too good a horse to go on with." Three-year-old Smart Strike broke his maiden in his second career start April 28 at Keeneland, and has gone on to win two straight Woodbine allowances since.

ECLIPSE MATERIAL

Gary Stevens was hobbling around Hollywood Park Sunday on crutches, his right foot in a soft cast. Just two hours earlier, a fractious filly had become unruly in the starting gate. She had slammed into the side of her stall, pinning Stevens' foot between 1,000 pounds of horseflesh and an immovable metal barrier, then reared and tossed Stevens out the back.

Stevens stubbornly had climbed back on the filly and rode her in the race, then took off for the hospital, where X-rays revealed a small fracture on the outside of his foot. To Stevens, it was only a flesh wound.

"This isn't going to slow me down anyway," he said with a confident smile."

Until Sunday, Stevens had been leading a charmed life this year. In February, he signed a contract for a fistful of money to ride for several months in Hong Kong, but was allowed to return to the United States for major races. He made the most of every opportunity.

Stevens flew home to California in March and scored an upset with Urgent Request in the \$1 million Santa Anita Handicap. A month later, after returning to Hong Kong, Stevens was back in California, where he rode Larry the Legend to victory in the Santa Anita Derby.

When Larry the Legend came out of the race with a chipped knee, it appeared as though Stevens had lost his best chance, his only chance, for a Kentucky Derby mount. But through a fortunate series of events over the next two weeks, Stevens wound up on Thunder Gulch. Mike Smith could have ridden Thunder Gulch, but chose Talkin Man. Pat Day could have ridden Thunder Gulch, but went with Timber Country. Corey Nakatani was in line to ride Thunder Gulch, but stuck with Serena's Song.

Stevens again made the trans-Pacific flight from Hong Kong, announced he was remaining in the states for good this time, then rode Thunder Gulch to a \$51 surprise in the Derby. And then earlier this month, Stevens

and Thunder Gulch teamed to win the Belmont.

Stevens also has picked up the mount on the nation's leading three-year-old filly, Serena's Song, with whom Stevens has won the Black-Eyed Susan Stakes and Mother Goose Stakes in recent weeks.

In less than six months, Stevens had won a career's worth of major races--the Kentucky Derby, Belmont Stakes, Santa Anita Handicap, Santa Anita Derby, Black-Eyed Susan Stakes and Mother Goose Stakes. He has become the undisputed frontrunner for this year's Eclipse Award as the nation's champion jockey.

Despite being one of the nation's elite riders for more than a decade, the 32-year-old Stevens never has won the Eclipse Award, but he has been deserving several times. His best chance was in 1990, when Stevens led the nation's riders in purse earnings with \$13.8 million. But the Eclipse went to Craig Perret, who that year won the Kentucky Derby with Unbridled and too had been overlooked previously for an Eclipse Award.

The decision to go to Hong Kong may have been Stevens' best move this year. He was burned out from a demanding schedule that saw him ride five days a week, 52 weeks a year, with time off only for injuries. Stevens also is going through a divorce.

"I was stressing out. It was a good time to freshen up," he said.

The pace of racing in Hong Kong, which has programs just two days a week, rejuvenated Stevens. On his first trip home to California in March for the Santa Anita Handicap, Stevens said he had been riding heavier because of the higher imposts regularly assigned horses in Hong Kong; for the first time in years, he didn't have to worry about reducing every day.

After three months in Hong Kong, however, Stevens wanted to return home. He was grateful to trainer Stephen Leung for giving him the opportunity to come to Hong Kong, but he missed being able to see his four children.

"The first month I was there I was relaxed," Stevens said. "But the last month and a half, I was homesick."

Because of Stevens' exhaustive travel schedule this year, he is only sixth in the nation in purse earnings, with approximately \$4.2 million through June 17. But his average earnings per mount is the best in the country.

This weekend, Stevens will be looking for another major stakes win. He is scheduled to ride Vaudeville in the \$500,000 Caesars International at Atlantic City. Stevens won't let a little thing like a broken foot slow him down.

"If the swelling's not down," he said, "I'll just get a bigger set of boots."
