CIGAR TO HOLLYWOOD GOLD CUP Allen Paulson's Cigar (Palace Music), America's leading handicap star with eight straight victories, will ship to California from his New York base for the July 2 Hollywood Gold Cup, trainer Bill Mott said Wednesday morning. "Our intention is to run," said Mott. "It's altering our original plan somewhat, but the horse is healthy and he's doing well. We're going to bring him out for the race." Mott had been pointing the five-year-old to the Aug. 5 Whitney H. at Saratoga, followed by the Woodward S, and the Breeders' Cup Classic at Belmont Park. But when Hollywood Park announced it would increase the Gold Cup purse from \$750,000 to \$1 million if both Cigar and '94 Breeders' Cup Classic winner Concern (Broad Brush) run, a decision was made to race in the Gold Cup. "Naturally we're worried about shipping to California," Mott added. "A lot of horses who go out there don't run their race. Maybe it will take a little more out of him than we would like, considering that we have the Breeders' Cup coming up in the fall. This has been pointed out to Mr. Paulson, and he seems willing to take all the risks." Cigar breezed five furlongs at Belmont yesterday in 1:02. "(The work) was very typical of him," Mott said. "Right now we plan to ship June 30." Concern, who came West to win The Californian at Hollywood June 11, is a possible starter in the Gold Cup. "The weight will be a big factor," said Concern's trainer Richard Small. "It's not as simple as it sounds. We are on the East Coast and there is a race for us here two days later (the GI Suburban H. at Belmont). It will cost us a lot to ship out there too. On the other hand, it's an enormous purse." Small added that Concern is doing very well, and would follow the same shipping strategy as successfully employed in The Californian if he does return for the Gold Cup. "We'd wait till the last minute," he said, "and probably ship Saturday night before the race." Weights for the Gold Cup are due Sunday.

METS, JETS EYE BELMONT STADIUM New York Mets co-owner Nelson Doubleday has had discussions with the Nassau County Sports Commission concerning a possible move for his team to a new multipurpose sports arena which would be located at Belmont Park, according to a story in Wednesday's Newsday. Doubleday also told the paper he had attempted and may reattempt to purchase the New York Jets and relocate them to the proposed arena as well. Under the proposal, racing would still be conducted at Belmont Park; the new stadium would be constructed near the racetrack. New York Racing Association President Kenny Noe, reached yesterday at Belmont, reacted with surprise to the report. "I don't know anything about it," said Noe. "Where are they going to put a baseball stadium? It's kind of off the wall." The report said, however, that Doubleday planned to meet yesterday with the state's economic development commissioner to discuss the plan, and quoted Doubleday as saying the Belmont location was perfect. "We have parking, we have zoning for parking," said Doubleday. "We have space, we have access. It's ideal in almost every way. There are no obstacles that I know of."

THOROUGHBRED OWNERS OF CALIFORNIA PROPOSE BONUS SERIES The Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) recently submitted a proposal to management at Santa Anita, Hollywood Park and Del Mar racetracks that would establish the "California Classic Crown" series. The C C C would tie three of California's most prominent "classic" distance (1 1/4mile) handicap races together--the Santa Anita Handicap, the Hollywood Park Gold Cup and the Pacific Classic--each offering a purse of \$1 million guaranteed. Through corporate sponsorship, TOC hopes to establish a \$3 million bonus award to any horse sweeping all three races. In addition, if no horse sweeps the series, TOC hopes to offer, also through sponsorship, a \$300,000 point system bonus which would reward the horse acquiring the highest point total after competing in all three races. TOC is currently seeking a sponsor or sponsors for the series.

HUSBAND RETIRED Husband (Diesis {GB}), winner of the GI Rothman's Ltd. International S. at Woodbine in '93, has reinjured a suspensory and has been retired. A stakes winner in France as well as North America, the Virginia-bred retires with three wins from 10 starts for earnings of \$753,566. Out of the King Emperor mare Beaming Bride (Ire), five-year-old Husband is a half-brother to multiple graded stakes-winners Alwuhush and Simply Majestic.

REGAL CLASSIC IS NEWEST SHUTTLE

STALLION Regal Classic (Vice Regent), Canada's Champion Two-Year-Old in 1987, will visit Muranna Stud, Merricks North, Victoria, Australia for the 1995 Southern Hemisphere breeding season, according to coowners Sam-Son Farm and Windfields Farm. The 10-year-old stallion will then return to Windfields' Oshawa nursery for the 1996 North American covering season. A winner of eight stakes and \$1,456,584, Regal Classic is the leading money-earner ever to stand in Canada. He has had 44 winners of over \$2.2 million in his first two crops. His oldest runners, now four-year-olds, include MSW Parental Pressure and SW Yonge Castlefield.

CATALOGUED Fasig-Tipton has catalogued 118 entries for its Selected Two-Year-Olds-in-Training Sale at Saratoga.
