GOLDEN GATE WRAP-UP Golden Gate Fields in Albany, California concluded its 1995 Winter/Spring season Monday, June 26. Work The Crowd (Political Ambition), winner of the GIII Miss America H, and GIII Yerba Buena H. over the Golden Gate turf, was named Horse of the Meeting, Best Grass Horse and Best Older Filly/Mare, GII Golden Gate H. winner Special Price (Bering {GB}) was voted Best Handicap Horse. The other equine "bests" were as follows: Petionville (Seeking the Gold), Three-Year-Old Colt/Gelding; Wish Of My Own (Imp Society), Three-Year-Old Filly; Ropersandwranglers (Endow), Two-Year-Old Filly; Double Brass (High Brite), Two-Year-Old Colt/Gelding; Lil Sneeker (Lil Tyler), Sprinter and Sekondi (Fr) (RB Chesne {GB}), Claiming Horse, Jockey Russell Baze, who won 172 races (including nine stakes), ran away with his 12th Golden Gate riding championship. Jerry Hollendorfer, who saddled 78 winners, took his 10th consecutive Golden Gate training title. The largest single day attendance and handle of the meet were recorded Kentucky Derby Day, May 6, when 27,710 fans wagered \$7,093,420.

MATCH RACE NEXT FOR SOVIET PROBLEM?

Trainer Greg Gilchrist was leaning toward sending the speedy filly **Soviet Problem** (Moscow Ballet) to Laurel for the GII \$300,000 Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial Dash July 15, but a prospective match race may alter his plans. The owners of the four-year-old colt **Abaginone** (Devil's Bag), a winner of four of five career starts by a combined 20½ lengths, have proposed a match race at Hollywood Park. "We'll consider it," said Gilchrist, "but we were looking at the De Francis Dash at Laurel." Soviet Problem, a winner of 11 stakes from 19 career starts for earnings of \$905,546, crossed the wire first in two match races last year. May 12, 1994, she defeated Lazor by 4½ lengths at Golden Gate, and August 21 at Del Mar she defeated Mamselle Bebette by 6½.

MARYLAND'S FULL-FIELD SUPPLEMENTS YIELD RESULTS Since the introduction of the Full-Field Supplement June 1, the average number of starters per race at Pimlico Race Course and Laurel Park has improved from 7.4 to 8.3. The Full-Field Supplement boosts purses by 40 percent for races that attract eight or more starters. The bonus does not apply to maiden claiming or turf events (unless the race is switched to the main track). Prior to June 1. 38.8 percent of all races had eight or more starters. Since that date, 61.6 percent of all races have eight or more starters. The most dramatic increase has come in Maiden Special Weights; since the inception of the bonus, 91.3 percent of Maiden Special Weights have drawn at least eight starters, compared to 65.8 percent prior to June 1.
