NEW YORK CASINO AMENDMENT

LAUNCHED Negotiators for the New York State Senate and Assembly have reached a deal on a constitutional amendment that would permit casinos on non-Indian land in three areas of New York State. The agreement provides for one casino in Niagara Falls, one in Buffalo, one in Warren or Saratoga counties and an unlimited number of casinos in the three Catskill Mountain counties. The amendment would also allow legalized slot machines at horse-racing tracks. However, a part of the deal that prohibits gambling within the borders of New York City would prevent slot machines from being set up at either Belmont Park or Aqueduct Racetrack. In addition, all casino activity at racetracks would be limited to live racing days and to no more than eight hours in a 24-hour period. The proposed amendment is expected to receive initial approval by the State Legislature today. Under state law, the amendment would then have to be passed by a separately elected Legislature, which could not happen until at least 1997, and then by voters in a statewide referendum.

VALIANT NATURE RETIRED Valiant Nature (His Majesty), winner of the GI Hollywood Futurity at two, has been retired from racing and will stand the 1996 breeding season at Mill Ridge Farm in Lexington, Kentucky for a fee of \$7,500 live foal. Mill Ridge Farm's Alice Chandler and Pin Oak Stud's Josephine Abercrombie recently acquired breeding interests in the four-year-old colt from owner-breeder Verne H. Winchell. Valiant Nature, winner of two of eight career starts for earnings of \$466,500, also placed in the GII Blue Grass S., GII Swaps S., GII San Felipe S. and GIII Will Rogers H. He is a full-brother to '91 Champion Turf Horse Tight Spot.

CAT'S CRADLE SIDELINED AGAIN Ridder Thoroughbred Stable's Cat's Cradle (Flying Paster), who had been expected to run in the GI Hollywood Oaks July 9, will miss the race and is expected to be out for two months. "Her ankle hasn't come around. It's more serious than I thought," said trainer David Hofmans of the three-year-old filly, who won the GI Acorn S. and GII Fantasy S. in her last two starts. "It's a severe wrench (of her left front ankle). We'll send her to the Ridder Farm in Hidden Springs July 1 and she'll be out for two months."

HOLLYWOOD GOLD CUP-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 10f Gl Californian winner Concern (Broad Brush) worked one-mile at Laurel Tuesday morning in 1:40 over a track labelled "good." "I got him in 1:39 and change," said trainer Richard Small. "The horse is doing great and we plan to follow the same shipping plan as we did for The Californian." Allen Paulson's Cigar (Palace Music), also prepping for the Gold Cup, breezed seven furlongs at Belmont Monday, "The track was off, a bit sticky," trainer Bill Mott said. Cigar was clocked in 1:30 over a "good" main track. Both Cigar and Concern are scheduled to ship to California Saturday. San Jacinto H. winner Let's Be Curious (Air Forbes Won) will not run in Sunday's Gold Cup. "The horse is fine, healthwise, but he's not doing as good as he should be to take on Cigar and Concern," said Eoin Harty, assistant to trainer Bob Baffert. BEVERLY HILLS H.-GI, \$300,000a, 3yo/up, f/m, 9fT Eleven-time stakes-winner Work the Crowd (Political Ambition) will try for her first Grade I victory in the Beverly Hills H. "She worked very well this morning (Wednesday) at Golden Gate and we're all set," said trainer Greg Gilchrist. "We're putting her on a van this evening and shipping." Work the Crowd, who drilled a half-mile in :46 2/5 over Golden Gate's turf course, will be shooting for her fourth straight stakes victory Sunday. Toting highweight of 124 pounds will be GI Gamely H. winner Possibly Perfect (Northern Baby). The Bobby Frankel-trainee, who breezed six furlongs in 1:13 over Hollywood's fast main track Tuesday, will be seeking her sixth straight turf win. The probable field also includes Aube Indienne (Fr) (Bluebird), Fondly Remembered (Skywalker), Lady Affirmed (Affirmed) and Wandesta (GB) (Nashwan).

"I am shocked to learn that the Florida HBPA is suing Hialeah Park when, in fact, we did everything possible to maximize purses to the owners and breeders during the racing meet concluded May 22, 1995," Brunette said. "The Florida HBPA tried to stop our ISW program and, when unable to do so, has now instituted a lawsuit against us and over 100 ISW facilities." The FHBPA, which contends that Hialeah breached its contract with the horsemen by underpaying purses during its meet, is seeking over \$1 million in purse money from 75 racetracks and casinos who took a simulcast signal from Hialeah without the horsemen's consent.
