Hamdan al Maktoum's consistent six-year-old strained sesamoidal ligaments in his right foreleg and will need to be rested before he takes up stud duties; it has not yet been announced where he will stand. "Whether it will be Northern or Southern Hemisphere has still to be decided, but he ought to make a good sire," said his trainer, John Gosden. "If his progeny prove half as good as he was, nobody will have cause for complaint." Muhtarram, the highweight older horse at 9.5-11 furlongs in Ireland in '93 and Italy in '94, was on the board in 12 of 19 career starts; he notched G1 victories in Italy and Ireland and G2 wins in England, including his second Prince Of Wales triumph June 20. In his lone U.S. start, the Kentucky-bred was third in the '94 Arlington Million; he retires with earnings of \$775,995.

WAYNE'S WORLD VI By Bill Finley

The question was neither asked nor answered. It didn't have to be: the answer was obvious. Satisfied? Not Wayne Lukas.

The morning after the Belmont Stakes--the record-breaking Belmont Stakes--brought a buzz of activity to the Lukas barn, more so than usual. It was not a time to rest on the laurels of still another win, the fifth in a row in the Triple Crown series, but an occasion to start laying the groundwork for a sixth. Five straight is nice. Six straight is nicer. Seven is even better.

"I'll be very in tune to this," Lukas admitted of his quest to add next year's Kentucky Derby onto the string of Classic wins he started with the '94 Preakness. "I don't need much more motivation, but there will be a special kicker to it. You know that we'll try and keep the string going."

Even Lukas will admit that winning six straight Triple Crown races takes not only a fantastic amount of luck, but it also takes talented horses--a lot of them--and a talented trainer, and Lukas gets high marks in both categories. There would be nothing implausible about him winning the 1996 Kentucky Derby. In fact, given the amount of talent with which he has to work, you might go so far as to say that Wayne Lukas should win the 1996 Kentucky Derby.

Lukas is not bashful about what he has in terms of two-year-old talent. It's a dream team, and he knows it. Most trainers would be perfectly happy to have two or three two-year-olds pointing for the Derby, and while Lukas' numbers change week by week with a few horses sold and new ones purchased, he expects to have about 47 two-year-olds at his disposal this year. They can't all be champions, but every one has a license to be.

"It's hard to compare this year's class to last year's because we had two champions last year in Flanders (Seeking the Gold) and Timber Country (Woodman)," he said. "But I will predict that top to bottom we have more depth. This group will win more graded stakes than last year's group."

The best of the bunch? While he says it's impossible to say at such an early point, he did list 10 colts that he believed were top prospects for the 1996 classic. They are: Best Result (Easy Goer), Chimes Castelli (Leo Castelli), Dr. Caton (Seattle Slew), Hennessy (Storm Cat), Grindstone (Unbridled), Pioneering (Mr. Prospector), Pleasant Returns (Pleasant Colony), Predictable (Unbridled), Prince of Thieves (Hansel) and Sierra Grande (Ogygian).

Grindstone has already won a maiden race at Belmont and finished fourth as favorite in the Bashford Manor. Hennessy broke his maiden in his second start and Lukas is already looking ahead to the GII Hollywood Juvenile Championship.

Sierra Grande was second in Grindstone's maiden, and bucked shins in the race. Pioneering, Chimes Castelli and Prince of Thieves are all nearing starts and will debut at either Saratoga or Monmouth. Dr. Caton and Pleasant Returns are being pointed toward future maiden races in California. Predictable and Best Result are both a little behind schedule.

Michael Tabor's recent purchase Victory Speech (Deputy Minister), who ran third in the June 28 Tremont Breeders' Cup at Belmont, rounds out the group.

And who's to say Lukas won't win the Derby with a filly? That opens up another long list of candidates. "We're deep," he said. That's putting it mildly.

Among the 10 colts he named, however, Lukas may be pulling a bit harder for the one named for Dr. Bill Caton, the neurologist who treated Lukas' son, Jeff, after his near-fatal accident involving Tabasco Cat. Caton did wonderful work with the younger Lukas and the family would very much like to honor him with a special horse.

"We told everyone to jot down the one horse we have who might be special so that we could name it after Dr. Caton," Lukas said. "I was surprised that almost everyone came up with the same horse. Four or five of us agreed, and that's quite an honor, that we all felt he had a chance of being the one."

There were an estimated 34,070 Thoroughbreds born in this country in 1993 and Lukas only trains 47 of them. Anyone can win the 1996 Kentucky Derby. Just don't be surprised if the horse is wearing a white bridle.
