AQUAARID'S FUTURE IN DOUBT Aquarid (Nashwan), winner of the G1 Fillies Mile at Ascot last

September and the G3 Gainsborough Stud Fred Darling S. at Newbury in April, will miss Sunday's Kildangan Stud Irish Oaks at The Curragh after bleeding in her final workout last weekend. Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum's three-year-old filly, sixth as the favorite in the June 9 Epsom Oaks after finishing second in the British 1000 Guineas, went to Goodwood Saturday for a racecourse gallop. But, on returning home to John Dunlop's stable at Arundel, she was found to have bled internally. A spokesman for Dunlop said Tuesday, "Her future, both in the short and long terms, is now in doubt. But it is already certain that she will miss the Irish Oaks." A total of 14 possible starters remain for Sunday's Group 1 event. They are: Alisidora (Ire) (Nashwan), Asterita (GB) (Rainbow Quest), Bluffing (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}), Crystal Bird (Ire) (Ela-Mana-Mou {Ire}), Fanjica (Ire) (Law Society), Fleet Hill (Ire) (Warrshan), Larrocha (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Llia (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}), Musetta (Ire) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), Pure Grain (GB) (Polish Precedent), Riyama (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}), Russian Snows (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Taibhseach (Secreto) and Valley of Gold (Fr) (Shirley Heights {GB}).

FIRST WINNER FOR BLACK TIE AFFAIR Firsttime starter Crystal River became the first winner from the first crop by 1991 Horse of the Year Black Tie Affair (Ire) (Miswaki) when the two-year-old chestnut filly won at Ak-Sar-Ben July 10. Bred in Kentucky by Russell S. Davis, Crystal River is out of Brunswick Dawn and thus is a half-sister to Canadian Champion Let's Go Blue. She was sold for \$120,000 at the '94 Keeneland September Yearling Sale to Bill and Marge Peters' Thunderhead Farms. Trainer Don Von Hemel said Crystal River will be pointed to the Lady Sponsors' Breeders' Cup Stakes at Ak-Sar-Ben July 22. Black Tie Affair, who was named Horse of the Year and Champion Older Horse in 1991 after winning the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and GI Philip H. Iselin H., stands at Vinery in Midway, Kentucky. His 1995 fee was \$15,000 live foal.

"I was in trouble for a few strides and then he just found another gear. He is a tremendously tough and game horse."
