AUGUST BELMONT IV DIES August Belmont IV, grandson of the founder of Belmont Park, died Monday in Easton, Maryland following a massive stroke. He was 86 years old. Belmont continued a family tradition in 1983 when Caveat (Cannonade), which he owned in partnership with Jim Ryan and Bob Kirkham, won the Belmont Stakes, named in honor of his great grandfather. Belmont was a member and former chairman of The Jockey Club who retired from the investment banking firm of Dillin, Read Inc., where he had served as president, in 1971. Belmont's grandfather, August Belmont II, the breeder of Man o' War, formed the Westchester Racing Association in 1895 and oversaw construction of Belmont Park. Belmont is survived by two sons, August Belmont V and John Belmont; two daughters, Alic Fisher and Priscilla Upon; as well as two stepchildren, 16 grandchildren and three great grandchildren.

**SLEW OF DAMASCUS BRINGS \$175,000 AT** BARRETTS The seven-year-old gelding Slew of Damascus (Slewacide), winner of the 1994 Grade I Hollywood Gold Cup as well as five other graded stakes, was sold for a sales-topping \$175,000 at the Barretts July Sale of Horses of Racing Age Including Two-Year-Olds in Training, held July 10 in Pomona, California. Sold by The Cumberland Agency (John O'Hara), agent for Harbeston, Losh and Naccarato, the chestnut Tennessee-bred was purchased by Dave and Jill Heerensperger. Slew of Damascus, an earner of \$1,213,050 to date, last started in the June 23 Bedside Promise H. at five and a half furlongs over the Hollywood Park turf, in which he finished second. Bringing the second highest price of \$97,000 was the four-yearold California-bred filly Miss Intergreen (Interco), a stakes-placed winner of \$133,145. Consigned by Hector Palma, agent, the bay filly was purchased by Mr. Bruno De Berdt, agent. Overall, 86 horses were sold for a total of \$544,700 and an average of \$6,334. The median price was \$2,300.

#### Sunday, Hollywood Park:

BEL AIR H.-GII, \$125,000a, 3yo/up, 1 1/16m Edmund A. Gann's You and I (Kris S.), winner of Belmont Park's GI Met Mile and GII Brooklyn H. in his last two outings, will be entered in Sunday's Bel Air H., trainer Bobby Frankel confirmed Wednesday. Jockey Chris McCarron, who rode the colt to victory in last year's GIII Riva Ridge S., has the mount. Burt Bacharach's GI winner Soul of the Matter (Private Terms), the 121-pound Bel Air highweight, breezed five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 yesterday at Hollywood Park, "It was real easy and nice," trainer Richard Mandella said. The top money-earner in the field with \$854,168, Soul of the Matter has not raced since finishing fourth in the Nov. 5 Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs. Also confirmed for the race are Argentine champion Cleante (Arg) (Kleiglight), winner of the Bates Motel S. at Santa Anita two starts back, and Constant Craving (Chief's Crown), who took a \$54,000 allowance at Hollywood in his last outing June 12.

MEADOWLANDS ANNOUNCES 1995 STAKES SCHEDULE The return of the \$500,000 Grade I Meadowlands Cup October 6 and increases for four of its other graded events highlight the Meadowlands 1995 Stakes Schedule. The September 4 opening day headliner, the GIII Boiling Springs H. for three-year-old fillies, has been increased to \$100,000 from \$75,000. Two other Grade III's, the Sept. 16 Cliff Hanger and the Sept. 29th Sheraton Meadowlands Violet H., will now also be \$100,000 events. In addition, the GIII Paterson H., slated for Nov. 3, has been increased \$25,000 to \$75,000. The Young America, a GIII race, will also see its purse go up. It will be contested for \$75,000 in 1995 with a \$25,000 Breeders' Cup supplement added to the \$50,000 purse. "The increases for these races reflect an effort to make our graded stakes even more appealing," said Mike Dempsey, director of racing, "We have strengthened the more meaningful races on our program and consolidated the remaining events." The Meadowlands will drop two of its previously ungraded sprint stakes, the Morven and Chief Pennekeck.

Juddmonte Farms' Wandesta (GB) (Nashwan) worked a half-mile over Hollywood's fast main track Wednesday in :49 1/5 in preparation for her main track debut in the July 23 Grade I Vanity H. In 11 career starts on the turf, the four-year-old filly has won stakes in both England and North America, including the GI Santa Barbara H. and GI Santa Ana H. at Santa Anita this year.

Trainer Richard Mandella said French stakes-winner Talloires (Trempolino), 2nd in the Jim Murray H. at Hollywood in his last start July 1, has been invited to run in the \$500,000 Grande Premio O.S.A.F. in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil August 5. "He'll go within a week of the race," the trainer said. Regular jockey Kent Desormeaux will ride.

Louisiana and Ohio Derby winner Petionville (Seeking the Gold) worked six furlongs at Hollywood yesterday in preparation for the \$500,000 Swaps S. July 23. "I caught him a little quicker than the clocker," trainer Randy Bradshaw said. "Sometimes they get them on the split, but I caught him in 1:11 and change." Petionville was timed in 1:12 2/5 on Hollywood's official work tab. "He'll have one more easy half-mile next week," Bradshaw added. Remington Park Derby, Arkansas Derby and Alabama Derby winner Dazzling Falls (Taylor's Falls) arrived at trainer Jack Van Berg's barn Wednesday morning for the Swaps, His trainer Chuck Turco is due in California Friday night. Kentucky Derby winner Thunder Gulch (Gulch), who hasn't started since winning the June 10 Belmont S., drilled seven furlongs in 1:25 1/5 at Santa Anita Monday. Also expected to contest the GII Swaps is MGSW Mr Purple (Deputy Minister).

Trainers Richard Mandella and Neil Drysdale confirmed yesterday that **Sandpit** (**Braz**) (Baynoun {Ire}) and GII Golden Gate H. winner **Special Price** (Bering {GB}) remain on course for the \$250,000a Caesars Palace Turf Championship H. at Hollywood July 22. If Sandpit, who won the GI Caesars International H. at Atlantic City June 25, wins next Sunday's race, he will earn a \$312,500 bonus for sweeping the two Caesars events. Also confirmed for the race is GI Santa Anita H. winner **Urgent Request** (**Ire**) (Rainbow Quest), who will be racing on the turf for the first time since finishing second in the 1½-mile Hong Kong International Vase last December.
