NEW YORK OTB SHOWS PROFIT After two straight years of posting net losses, New York City Off-Track Betting recorded a net profit of \$5 million during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995, it was announced yesterday by New York City Mayor Rudolph Giuliani. Including the surcharge levied on winning bets, OTB provided the city with \$24 million in total revenue during the same fiscal year. The turnaround came in the first full year of the Giuliani administration. Last year, OTB suffered a \$7.4 million loss. "After years of decline, New York City's OTB is finally running in the money and once again became an asset to the city," said Giuliani. The legalization of in-home simulcasting has played a major role in OTB's recent success. Since in-home simulcasting was legalized four months ago, OTB has opened up 12,300 new phone betting accounts and has received close to \$50 million in telephone bets. Overall, OTB has seen its total handle increase from about \$740 million to about \$820 million this fiscal year.

FULL-FIELD BONUS AT ARLINGTON Arlington Park will institute a full-field bonus program beginning today, the track announced Thursday. A bonus of \$2,000 will be added to any race when the field has nine or more betting interests. The bonus will apply to maiden special weight and allowance races, as well as to claiming and maiden claiming races with a \$25,000 claiming price or greater.

FAVORED ONE UNDERGOES SURGERY Mike Pegram's three-year-old filly **Favored One** (Son of Briartic), who broke down in the upper stretch of Sunday's GI Hollywood Oaks, will undergo surgery at Baker's Clinic in Los Alamitos, California Friday to repair two fractured sesamoids in her right front foot. Dr. Wayne McIlwraith is scheduled to be flown in from Kentucky to perform the surgery. "She shattered the sesamoids," trainer Mike Puhich said. "The doctor will put a steel plate in the foot and she'll never have the flexibility she had as a racehorse. But the foot will be supported, and the most important thing is there's a good chance she'll survive." Washington-bred Favored One won four of 11 career starts, including the GII Princess S. at Hollywood Park and Joe Gottstein Futurity and Emerald Lassies S. at Yakima Meadows, for earnings of \$212,965.

This was definitely the best sprinting performance of the European season to date, with Lake Coniston leading the break from the stalls and cruising along a length in front of the rest of the field. **MILLSTREAM** (Dayjur) had tried to challenge him at the start but was left struggling and it soon became clear that this was going to be a one-horse race. Many of the jockeys reported that the ground was not suitable for their horses, due to the course being watered Wednesday and then heavy rain falling yesterday. This was the first Group 1 winner in England for Lewis, a former jockey who partnered Mill Reef in many of his triumphs. "He is such a good horse, the best I have ever trained," said Lewis. "I would like to send him to the Breeders' Cup next, but we will have to see."

Abaginone (Devil's Bag) will be making his stakes debut. The four-year-old has won four of five career starts and has never raced outside California. Shipping with him to New York is regular jockey Gary Stevens. "It's true he hasn't faced anyone of stakes quality, but obviously we think he's this good and now it's time to find out," said trainer Sandy Shulman. Shulman also pointed out that Abaginone has shin trouble, which goes all the way back to when he was purchased by owner Ron Charles at the Barrett's Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale. "He set a record for the fastest eighth of a mile in the preview for that sale, but blew his shin," the trainer recalled. "Basically, he was lame and that's why we were able to get him for \$55,000. If he wasn't, he'd have gone for \$500,000 and Albert Broccoli would have bought him instead of (eventual Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner) Brocco."

TATTERSALLS JULY SALES RESULTS Tattersalls July Mixed Sale in Newmarket, England, held July 11 through July 13, ended on a high note with the gross comfortably topping the record of 1,344,950 guineas set last year. The largest ever July catalogue attracted buyers from all corners of the globe, which combined with strong domestic demand to ensure a lively sale throughout. Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony said, "It was a good catalogue for a sale of this nature and it showed. The Godolphin draft in particular created enormous interest. Their horses were presented magnificently and it was a tribute to their whole team that they not only topped the sale with Tej Singh, but sold consistently well to domestic and overseas buyers alike." **Tej Singh**, a five-year-old chestnut horse by Tejano--Deep River Woman (Miswaki), has won two of seven starts in England for earnings to date of \$12,266. Previously sold for \$90,000 at the 1991 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, he was consigned to Tattersalls by Godolphin Management Co. Ltd. and purchased for 70,000 guineas by Team Valor Inc. Overall, 261 horses were sold for a total of 2,292,545 guineas and an average of 8,783 guineas, up 5.3 percent from last year's average of 8,337 guineas.

SMART STRIKE MAY MISS REST OF '95

Smart Strike (Mr. Prospector), forced out of last Sunday's Queen's Plate with a right foreleg injury, is now probably out for the season, according to trainer Mark Frostad. "He's out for the season--probably," said Frostad. "We're going to give him all the time he needs. If you try to push to get him back to the races quicker, you're only asking for trouble." Smart Strike suffered a slight ligament strain in his right foreleg during a pre-Queen's Plate workout June 20. At that point, Frostad thought the injury would force the colt from the Queen's Plate, but that he might make it back in time for the Sept. 17 GI Molson Export Million. "We want to give him every opportunity, every chance to show how good he could be next year," said Frostad.

Local News: Hawthorne Race Course:

The Illinois Racing Board has rejected Hawthorne Race Course President Tom Carey's proposal to raise the purse of the GII Hawthorne Gold Cup to \$500,000, and ordered him to instead lower the purse to \$250,000. The 1 1/4-mile contest, which has been run for \$400,000 the last three years and is traditionally one of Chicago's marquee dirt races for older horses, is scheduled for November 18. Carey had hoped a \$500,000 purse would attract better horse and earn the Gold Cup Grade I status, but the Chicago Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective opposed the change. HBPA President Christine Janks successfully persuaded the Board that the money should instead be put into daily purses.
