SERENA'S SONG POSSIBLE FOR HASKELL

Serena's Song (Rahy), second last time out in the mile-and-a-quarter Coaching Club American Oaks, may run next against colts in the Haskell Invitational July 30 at Monmouth, according to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "It's speculative, but I won't lie to you and say it's out of the realm of possibility. They put her in the mix and weighted her (118). I looked at the others in there...it's not totally out of the question," said Lukas, who added that he would consult with owners Robert and Beverly Lewis before making a decision. Figuring in the decision will be the status of **Timber Country** (Woodman), who missed his scheduled work at Monmouth Park this weekend due to the heat. "I'm still considering him for the Haskell," said Lukas, who is currently attending the Keeneland July sale, "but I want to be careful. I'm here, and I want to see him work in person. We had the temperature flare-up; he had two strong works after that, then we got hit with the 100-degree heat every day. I felt, why stress the horse in this heat? That's why I'm taking it easy. The ultimate goal is to have him good in the fall."

ENGLISH DERBY HERO EYES ASCOT Epsom Derby winner **Lammtarra** (*Nijinsky II), unraced since his Classic win due to a minor training setback, has been confirmed a definite runner in Ascot's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. Saturday. The Godolphin runner was one of nine entries for the race; also possible are **Broadway Flyer** (Theatrical {Ire}), **Carnegie** (Sadlers Wells), **Environment Friend** (Cozzene), **Red Bishop** (Silver Hawk), **Strategic Choice** (Alleged), **Balanchine** (Storm Bird), **Pentire** (Be My Guest) and **Winged Love** (In The Wings). Doubts about Balanchine's participation persist after her disappointing seasonal comeback in Royal Ascot's Prince of Wales S. Last year's European champion has been the subject of mixed gallop reports since she trailed in fifth of six behind Muhtarram last month. A decision on her week-end challenge is expected after she works Wednesday.

ECLIPSE KIN TOPS AT KEENELAND

JULY A half-sister to Eclipse Award winner Dehere (Deputy Minister) and the first foal from Eclipse-winning sprinter Safely Kept were the top filly and colt, respectively, at the first day of the Keeneland July sale. The highest bid of the day was brought by the filly, a daughter of Seattle Slew out of MSP Sister Dot (Secretariat). The half to 1993's champion two-year-old colt was consigned by Hill 'N' Dale Sales Agency; she was purchased by Demi O'Bryne as agent for Michael Tabor. "I thought she was a lovely filly," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who can look forward to having the filly in his barn next year. "She was on our short list, and we're very excited about getting her." The day's top colt was a son of Danzig out of MGISW Safely Kept (Horatius); consigned by Ashview Farm, he brought a bid of \$725,000 from Reynolds Bell, Jr., acting as agent for Richard Santulli's Jayeff B Stables. "I owned a percentage of the colt going into the sale," said Santulli, who bred the colt and owned Safely Kept in partnership. "The filly gave me my greatest thrills in racing. Jayeff B Stables is looking forward to racing the colt; we hope he gives us half the pleasure his dam did." A total of 85 yearlings were sold at Keeneland Monday; the gross of \$22,395,000 was down 7.7 percent from last year, when 105 hips sold for \$24,270,000, but the first day's average, \$263,471, was up nearly 14 percent over 1994's \$231,143. The median price of \$210,000 showed an increase of 5 percent.

BELMONT TO OFFER SIX-DAY RACE WEEK

THIS FALL Racing will be conducted six days a week during the '95 Belmont Park fall meet, which runs from September 1 through October 29. Tuesdays will be dark. "After discussing the horse colony for the fall meet with (Director of Racing) Terry Meyocks, we felt that a six-day week, and nine races per day, was doable," said New York Racing Association President and General Manager Kenny Noe Jr. "The Breeders' Cup on October 28 and the implementation of the Lasix rule were also factors in the decision."

TOTAL HANDLE UP AT BELMONT SPRING MEET

Boosted by solid off-track and inter-track figures, the daily average handle at the just-concluded Belmont Park spring meet was up more than 20 percent over 1994. The track averaged \$8,594,785 in total daily handle for '95, as compared to \$7,149,605 last year. On track, attendance dropped 4.2 percent to a daily average of 9,623; the daily average on-track handle was \$2,363,043, down 4.6 percent.

HENRY PABST NAMED TOBA OWNER OF THE MONTH Henry Pabst, who campaigns Irish-breds **Via Lombardia** (Shardari {Ire}) and **Earl Of Barking** (Common Grounds {GB}), has been named the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association "Owner of the Month" for June. Three-year-old **Via Lombardia** captured the GIII Cinema H. at Hollywood June 3, while his older stablemate took the GI Hollywood Turf H. on Memorial Day and finished fifth in the GI Caesars International June 25. Pabst, a native of Minnesota, currently has 12 horses in training as well as 22 broodmares and foals.

THE GRASS IS GREENER

On Sunday at Belmont Park, a three-year-old named Green Means Go ran over the inner turf course and perhaps into the lower regions of stardom.

Should you desire a geographic fix on the lower regions of stardom, they are 1,000 miles south of Cigar; 500 west of Thunder Gulch, Timber Country and Serena's Song; and 250 east of Dwyer winner Hoolie.

Racing itself makes it terribly difficult for a grass three-year-old to emerge from the thicket of hype that surrounds three-year-olds "on the road to Churchill Downs," a road that more often than not ends in oblivion.

Green Means Go is owned by the Pin Oak Stable of Josephine Abercrombie, who raced '90 Female Turf Champion Laugh and Be Merry, as well as Green Means Go's half-sister, '93 Test winner Missed The Storm.

Bill Mott trains Green Means Go, and Jerry Bailey rode him to victory in the \$111,600 Lexington Sunday, adding it to a previous win in the \$113,600 Hill Prince. "He's a young horse," said Bailey after dismounting, "and there are older, more proven horses out there. But, in time, he could be the best." Mott added, "It seems he can do whatever he wants to do."

While the three-year-old grass horses get short-shrift most places, that is not true at Arlington International. Last year it put up \$1 million for a three-race turf series for the division and the results were extremely gratifying.

Eagle Eyed came from Southern California to take the Arlington Classic; Northern California's Vaudeville and England's Overbury dead-heated in the American Derby; Vaudeville won the Secretariat. Shortly thereafter, Vaudeville was beaten only a neck by eventual \$2 million Breeders' Cup Turf hero Tikkanen, a three-year-old himself, in the Turf Classic.

Unfinished Symph, yet another three-year-old of 1994, finished a distinguished third in last year's Breeders' Cup Mile, an event that the year before saw Lure and Paradise Creek finish 1-2--as three-year-olds.

In fact, there is a stunning statistic surrounding three-year-olds in the Cup. If you had bet \$2 to win on all the three-year-olds in the 11 runnings of the \$3 million Classic, you would be up \$30. That's excellent, but it doesn't warm up the performances of the three-year-olds on the grass.

A \$2 win wager on the 94 Mile and Turf three-year-old runners would currently have you + \$98.60. As hard as it might be to believe now, our best three-year-old grass specialist to run in the Breeders' Cup, Manila in 1986 at Santa Anita, paid a whopping \$19.60.

This Sunday, many of the nation's racetracks will simulcast the \$300,000 American Derby from Arlington, and it shapes up as one of the brightest three-year-old grass events one could imagine.

From out of the south comes Mecke, winner of the Tropical Park Derby on grass and fifth in both the Kentucky Derby and Preakness. He is over a colic that almost cost him his life. From Canada by way of a victory in the Austrian Derby comes Wild.

And don't forget Brother Mott, the man with a tie and a horse for every occasion. He will reserve the 4-5 Green Means Go for the \$400,000 Secretariat and saddle Claudius, the recent winner of the Lamplighter via a six-wide move from 10th-place at a mile and a sixteenth.

Perhaps as many as four Europeans could join a field that will include Arlington Classic winner Hawk Attack, who has his breeder, Kentucky Governor Brereton Jones, leading the cheering section for the Cavalier Stable. Arctic Explosion, Unanimous Vote, two-time Hollywood Park stakes winner Via Lombardia, Dixie Dynasty, Sikkim and Wild Syn should also start.

The dirt three-year-olds have provided us with a terribly bland spring, with the exception of Serena's Song and Larry The Legend, both of which put some jive into things. Perhaps the grass three-year-olds can turn things around.
