FILLY TOPS KEENELAND JULY FOR SECOND STRAIGHT YEAR A bay filly by Mr.

Prospector--Daring Bidder (Bold Bidder) brought a salestopping \$1,250,000 during last night's fourth and final session of the 1995 Keeneland July Selected Yearling Sale. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Allen E. Paulson's Brookside Farms, the filly, a halfsister to 1992 Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Eliza and GI Santa Anita Derby winner Dinard, was purchased by Demi O'Byrne, agent for the partnership of Michael Tabor and John Magnier. It was the second straight vear that a filly topped the Keeneland July Sale; in 1994, a filly by Mr. Prospector--Winning Colors (Caro {Ire}) took top honors with a final bid of \$1,050,000. The first foal out of GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner Miss Alleged (Alleged), sold during Tuesday's afternoon session, brought the second highest price of the day of \$950,000. Consigned by Fares Farms Inc., the bay colt was purchased by Graham Beck, owner of Gainesway Farm. "I've got no trainer picked out yet," said Beck. "I'll just send him to the farm and quiet him down. He'll stay in this country. I've got a lot of confidence in Danzig, and he's out of an extremely fine racemare. He's quite a nice individual." Also making some noise at the sale yesterday was a newcomer to the Thoroughbred industry, Stephen C. Hilbert, 49, of Carmel, Indiana, who owns Conseco Inc., a business which acquires and manages life insurance companies. Not only has Hilbert never before owned a racehorse, but Hip #168, a filly by Danzig--Glowing Honor (Seattle Slew), was the first he ever bid on, and he ended up bringing her home for \$600,000. Before the day was over, Hilbert also purchased a filly for \$575,000 by A.P. Indy --Prospectors Delite (Mr. Prospector) and a filly for \$530,000 by A.P. Indy--Chimes of Freedom (Private Account). All three of his purchases were consigned by Lane's End, agent. "I met (Lane's End owner) Will Farish and went to the Kentucky Derby with him," said Hilbert. "I thought this could be a rewarding and profitable enterprise. This is our absolute first horse. If you're going to start, you should start at the top." Overall, 188 vearlings were sold during the sale's four sessions for a total of \$46,450,000 and an average of \$247,074, up 5.9 percent from last year's average of \$233,325. The median price of \$200,000 was the same as the 1994 figure. For the fourth straight year, Mr. Prospector topped all sires in average price. Keeneland July Yearling Sale Continued, p. 2

In assessing the sale, Keeneland's Chairman of the Board James E. (Ted) Bassett said, "It exceeded all of Keeneland's expectations. We were very pleasantly surprised by the strong domestic buying support. We're particularly pleased by the decrease in the number of RNA's, which represented fair assessments by the consignors." Keeneland Director of Sales Rogers Beasley added, "We had done some additional advertising and promoting in Japan, which was evidenced by very strong Japanese support of the summer sale. The sale showed a deep market with strong foreign presence, along with some new domestic buyers and a strong showing by the pinhookers."

AUTOTOTE OFFERS PROPOSITION BET ON DEL MAR Autotote Enterprises, which owns and operates Connecticut Off-Track Betting, will offer a wager in which fans can bet on who will be the leading rider and trainer at the upcoming Del Mar meet. Money wagered will go into a pari-mutuel pool and payoffs will be calculated based on actual wagering. There will be three types of wagers offered: win betting on who the top jockey will be, win betting on who the top trainer will be and a double wager in which the bettor must select both the top trainer and jockey. Del Mar opens its 43-day meet July 26; wagering on the proposition bet will begin July 20 and close July 26 at 5 p.m. EST. "This wager is unique, easy and fun," said Rick Cowan, president and CEO of Autotote Enterprises. "We are always looking for innovative ways to develop a new market for Thoroughbred wagering in the country. This is a wager someone can make before the meet and be involved in every day of the entire Del Mar season." As of Tuesday, Corey Nakatani, at 2-1 odds, was the favorite to win the lockeys race, while trainer Mike Mitchell, at 7-2, was favored among the trainers.

CHAMPION CHEROKEE RUN RETIRED Jill E.

Robinson's Cherokee Run (Runaway Groom), the Champion Sprinter of 1994, aggravated an ankle injury during a July 8 workout and has been retired from racing. The five-year-old Florida-bred was shipped to Jonabell Farm in Lexington, Kentucky Monday where he will enter stud in 1996 for a fee of \$7,500 live foal. Purchased at the 1992 Ocala Breeders' Sales February Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training for a bargain \$85,000, Cherokee Run started out his career auspiciously, winning five of seven starts at two and finishing second in the GIII What a Pleasure S. at Calder. He was transferred to trainer Frank Alexander's barn for his three-year-old campaign, during which he triumphed in the GIII Lafavette S. (equaling track record time), the GIII Derby Trial and the GII Dwyer, in which he carried his speed over nine furlongs. During his four-year-old championship campaign, Cherokee Run never finished out of the money and recorded victories in the GII Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial Dash and the premier event for sprinters in North America, the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. In 1995, prior to his injury, Cherokee Run came back in his first start at five to win the \$100,000 Gulfstream Park Sprint Championship H. by 2½-lengths, giving nine pounds to the runner-up. He retires with a record of 28-13-5-5 and earnings of \$1,531,849.

VANITY INVITATIONAL H.-GI, \$300,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/8m

Wandesta (GB) (Nashwan), a MGI winner on turf, geared up for her first career start on dirt yesterday, drilling five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 at Hollywood. Paseana (Arg) (Ahmad {Arg}), the Champion Older Mare in '92 and '93, can become the all-time North American filly or mare money-earner by winning the Vanity. The seven-year-old, who took the Vanity in '92 and was second in the '93 edition, is tentatively scheduled to work Thursday morning. Paseana will carry highweight of 123 pounds, while Wandesta is listed next at 119. Pirate's Revenge (Pirate's Bounty), who defeated Paseana in the June 25 Gl Milady H., and Gll winner Top Rung (Seattle Slew) round out the probable field.

Sunday, Hollywood Park:

SWAPS S.-GII, \$500,000, 3yo, 1 1/8m

Kentucky Derby and Belmont S. winner Thunder Gulch (Gulch) heads the field for the Swaps. "He's doing very well," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He worked Monday morning (five furlongs) in a minute flat and galloped out in 1:13. I see no signs of him letting up from the Triple Crown races." New to the Swaps lineup is Da Hoss (Gone West), who took the GII Jersey Derby over the Garden State turf in his last start May 27. The Michael Dickinson-trainee will be ridden for the first time by Chris McCarron. Arkansas and Alabama Derby winner Dazzling Falls (Taylor's Falls) breezed five furlongs in 1:03 at Hollywood Tuesday under jockey Laffit Pincay Jr. "He's really consistent about his work habits...slow and slower," said trainer Chuck Turco. "The main thing with this horse is, even though his works are slow, he benefits from them. He knows the procedure." Also pointing to the race are Mr Purple (Deputy Minister), Petionville (Seeking the Gold), T.J.'s Gold (Candi's Gold) and To Be Khaled (Libanon). Oncefortheroad (Falstaff), who went five furlongs in 1:02 at Hollywood Tuesday, is considered a possible starter.

Saturday, Hollywood Park: CAESARS PALACE TURF CHAMPIONSHIP H.-GII, \$250,000a, 3yo/up, 1 1/2mT

GI Caesars International H. winner Sandpit (Braz) (Baynoun {Ire}), who can earn a \$312,500 bonus if he wins Saturday's race, breezed five furlongs in 1:01 3/5 over Hollywood's fast main track Tuesday. Other confirmed starters include Special Price (Bering {GB}), Urgent Request (Ire) (Rainbow Quest), Jahafil (GB) (Rainbow Quest) and Liyoun (Ire) (Shernazar {Ire}). MSW Twin Bet (Bet Twice), a five-year-old mare considered possible for the race, drilled five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 yesterday.

Monday, Hollywood Park: HOLLYWOOD JUVENILE CHAMPIONSHIP S.-GII, \$100,000a, 2yo, 6f

Don't Tell Wayne (Shanekite) drilled a half-mile in :47 4/5 over Hollywood's fast main track yesterday. Bridge of Royalty (Slew's Royalty), who set a track record of :50 2/5 for 4 1/2-furlongs in his career debut May 4, may run Monday. The Bill Spawr-trainee has since finished second in the June 4 Westchester S. "The horse is doing great; he's put on about 60 pounds since his last race," Spawr said. "But if we draw the No. 1 post, he definitely won't run." Also scheduled to go to the post are Ask Pete (Petersburg), Desert Native (Roanoke), Double Brass (High Brite), Hennessy (Storm Cat) and Houseafire (Housebuster).

Saturday, Atlantic City:

MATCHMAKER S.-GII, \$100,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 9.5fT Last year's Matchmaker heroine Alice Springs (Val de l'Orne {Fr}) will try to make it two in a row. The five-year-old worked Saturday at trainer Jonathan Sheppard's Ashwell Stables in Unionville, Pennsylvania, and will likely ship in to Delaware Park in the middle of this week to complete preparations. "She's doing fine," Sheppard remarked, adding that Alice Springs will be reunited in the Matchmaker with jockey Julie Krone, who rode her to a 3¾-length victory in last year's edition. Also expected to run are graded stakes winners Avie's Fancy (Lord Avie) and Northern Emerald (Green Dancer), stakes winners Plenty of Sugar (Ascot Knight), Vice on Ice (Vice Regent) and Kira's Dancer (Sun War Dancer) and MSP Che Sara Sara (Golden Act).

Local News, Florida:

Hialeah Park had 20 days to respond to a Federal suit filed by the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association over simulcasting rights. In their suit, the horsemen claimed Hialeah violated both the Interstate Horse Racing Act of 1978 and an agreement between Hialeah and the FHBPA for the 1995 racing season. Hialeah responded by asking the court to dismiss in its entirety the complaint brought by the horsemen. Hialeah notes the horsemen failed to state a claim for damages upon which relief may be granted, and claims the IHA precludes the FHBPA from withdrawing consent (of the simulcast signal).
