AVERAGE UP AT FASIG-TIPTON JULY

Fasig-Tipton Kentucky held its annual Selected Yearling Sale yesterday at its Newtown Paddocks in Lexington. There were 177 yearlings sold for a gross of \$6,580,500 and an average of \$37,178, up 18.5 percent over last year's average of \$31,361. The 50 yearlings reported as not sold were down from 65 in 1994. The sales topper was Hip #123, a chestnut filly by Silver Hawk--Speaking of Sweets (Elocutionist). Consigned by Brereton C. Jones, agent, the filly, a full-sister to recent Grade II Arlington Classic winner Hawk Attack, was purchased for \$200,000 by Curragh Bloodstock Agency.

SERENA WARMS UP FOR HASKELL DATE

Serena's Song (Rahy) arrived at Monmouth Park Tuesday to prepare for the July 30 Haskell Invitational, and got her first feel of the track Wednesday morning. "She jogged (Wednesday)," said Dallas Stewart, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "She worked at Belmont Monday, a half mile in :47 3/5, and she'll work again next Monday or Tuesday." Trainer D. Wayne Lukas was expected at Monmouth yesterday or today to observe the work of **Timber Country** (Woodman) and determine where the Preakness winner would make his next start.

DOMINION AWARD WINNER ANNOUNCED

Margaret "Peggy" Sprinkles, an agent for Hull and Smith Horse Vans and Morrissey's Horse Pullmans, is the winner of the 1995 Dogwood Dominion Award, it was announced yesterday by Dogwood President Cot Campbell. Presented annually to an unsung hero in racing, the award--\$5,000 and a bronze sculpture of Dominion, the horse--will be presented to Sprinkles Aug. 9 in Saratoga. "Peggy personifies what this award is all about," said Campbell. "She has contributed to the welfare of every living thing whose path she's crossed by opening her home to all--a teenager who needs to get away for awhile, a stablehand who's dying of AIDS, children whose parents simply can't care for them for a few years, countless stray animals, a suddenly homeless family, and by providing a holiday gathering place for those on the backstretch who are alone."

KING GEORGE VI & QUEEN ELIZABETH DIAMOND S.-G1, \$754,098, 12ft

Red Bishop (Silver Hawk), winner of the GI San Juan Capistrano in April, has sustained an ankle injury which will prevent his running in Saturday's event. The setback is expected to keep the seven-year-old out of action until the Grande Premio Brasil in Rio de Janeiro Aug. 6. Godolphin's **Balanchine** (Storm Bird), last year's European champion filly, is also considered a doubtful starter. She worked satisfactorily at Newmarket Wednesday, but connections are concerned that Ascot ground conditions will be against her. "We will make a decision Thursday afternoon, but she is no more than a possible runner," said Simon Crisford, Godolphin's racing manager. The current odds are: **Pentire** (GB) (Be My Guest), 6-4; **Carnegie** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), 11-4; **Lammtarra** (Nijinsky II), 11-4; **Broadway Flyer** (Theatrical {Ire}), 14-1; **Strategic Choice** (Alleged), 25-1; **Environment Friend** (Cozzene), 50-1.

D. Wayne Lukas trainee, **Country Cat** (Storm Cat), will be trying for her second stakes victory this year in the Oaks; the Overbrook Farm runner took the Edgewood S. at Churchill Downs June 18. **Russian Flight** (Ire) (Siberian Express) won her first three career starts by a combined 17½-lengths before finishing fourth in Monmouth's GII Reeve Schley Jr. S. June 24. According to trainer Mohammed Moubarak, there was a legitimate reason his filly ran fourth in the Schley. "At the head of the stretch she lost her hind, right shoe," said the trainer. "If you watch the race, she was going along very easily until that happened." **Kathie's Colleen** (Woodman), second to Kentucky Oaks winner **Gal in a Ruckus** (Bold Ruckus) in the June 18 Canadian Oaks, drilled six furlongs in 1:11 at Woodbine Monday. "If she runs a big race Saturday we may look at the Alabama (Aug. 12 at Saratoga) for her," said trainer Mike Keogh. Trainer Patrick Kelly reported that MSP **Transient Trend** (Time for a Change) is only a possible runner. "She's about 50-50 right now," he said. "She's either turf or mud. Based on what I've heard, it's not supposed to rain, so it doesn't look like we'll be running."

GI Milady H. winner **Pirate's Revenge** (Pirate's Bounty) will miss Sunday's GI Vanity H. due to sickness. Joining the Vanity field, however, will be **Private Persuasion** (Pirate's Bounty), third in the Milady in her last outing June 25.

Three candidates for Monday's GII Hollywood Juvenile Championship worked yesterday over Hollywood's fast main track. **Ask Pete** (Petersburg), a stakes-winner at Yakima Meadows, drilled five furlongs in 1:00. **Bridge of Royalty** (Slew's Royalty) went the same distance in 1:00 2/5. **Desert Native** (Roanoke) covered three furlongs from the gate in :36 flat.
