MOONSHELL OUT FOR THE SEASON Moonshell (Sadler's Wells), winner of the Epsom Oaks in June, looks certain to be sidelined for the rest of this season. The Godolphin colorbearer, third in the 1000 Guineas in her only other three-year-old appearance, suffered a training setback last month; details of her injury were not announced, but Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford said yesterday, "It's very unlikely that Moonshell will be ready for racing in Europe during 1995. She is back walking again now and we are obviously hoping she will make a full recovery. Now, though, all I can say for sure is that she will be taken back to Dubai this winter and that any further plans for her racing career will be made after that."

MATCHMAKER WINNER TO HOLY BULL The connections of Avie's Fancy (Lord Avie), a narrow winner in Saturday's Gll Matchmaker S. at Atlantic City, have chosen the season to Horse of the Year Holy Bull for their homebred. "Holy Bull is the perfect physical match for our filly," said owner Bo Smith of Gunsmith Stables. "Avie's Fancy is fine-boned, where Holy Bull is pretty big, so a foal from that match should be a nice size but not bulky." Plenty Of Sugar (Ascot Knight) finished second in the race for owner Eugene Dixon, who decided on a season to Eclipse Award winner Housebuster. Third-place finisher Northern Emerald (Green Dancer) also earned a season to champion Cherokee Run. All three stallions stand at Jonabell Farm in Lexington.

SERENA'S SONG TUNES UP FOR HASKELL Three-year-old Serena's Song (Rahy), who will attempt to become the first of her sex to win the GI Haskell Invitational this Sunday, had her final prep for the race yesterday, breezing five furlongs in 1:00 3/5. With jockey Donna Barton in the saddle, the filly went in fractions of :25 2/5, :36 3/5, :48 3/5, and galloped out six furlongs 1:13 2/5.

Stepping into stakes competition after an impressive maiden tally July 2, Hennessy was bet down to 1-2 and proved worthy of the support, closing on the far outside to take the lead on the far turn and striding away to another authoritative score. "We've always been high on this two-year-old," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He's got that Storm Cat fire and I think that's going to be his trademark. I think he's going to go on and do some pretty important things." Said winning jockey Gary Stevens, picking up his third graded stakes in two days, "He got real worked up before the race and kind of lost his composure...he got a little bit too excited. Thankfully, he was fine during the race, couldn't have been better. Once he saw the gate, he slowed his breathing down and regained his composure. He's got beautiful action and looks like he'll go on." Lukas added that the colt could ship east for his next start, mentioning the GII Sapling at Monmouth August 12.

Sent off the second-longest shot on the board, the veteran was last for a half but launched a strong bid on the far turn that brought him alongside second choice Fourstars Allstar, and the two sevenyear-old sons of Compliance raced to the wire as a team. The winner earned another paycheck for the 10 members of the Toc Stable partnership, golfing buddies who each put up \$30 to buy Pride Of Summer for \$300 in 1993. "This horse has never been better," said trainer Tony Bizelia. "He is a real tough horse and it didn't matter who was running in this race because it set up perfectly for him. I think he likes the soft turf--it really had a lot of give today." Bizelia added that his stable star would start next in either the restricted West Point H. or the GII Bernard Baruch H. The 8-5 favorite. THE VID (World Appeal), lacked a strong late kick and finished fourth. "He stumbled really bad and that pulled his quarter off," said jockey Jerry Bailey. "I thought we had a shot when we pulled within a length or so of the lead, but he just wasn't himself today."

NUMBERS UP AT LAUREL SUMMER MEET The 1995 summer meet at Laurel Park concluded Sunday, posting a 15.6 percent increase in total handle over 1994. Out-of-state wagering on the Laurel card was up significantly, showing a 65.4 percent rise over last year, while the in-state total was up 2.9 percent. In all, \$74,195,319 was wagered during the 30-day season, as compared to \$64,174,162 for the '94 meet. The Maryland Jockey Club, which operates Laurel and Pimlico, is showing a 20.4 percent increase in total handle for the year-to-date. Trainers Graham Motion and King T. Leatherbury ended the meet tied atop the standings with 14 winners each; the leading rider at Laurel this summer was Mark Johnston with 44 victories.

PIMLICO OPENS TODAY Pimlico Race Course will continue its 125th anniversary season with the opening of the 42-day Summer/Fall Meet today. Racing fans on hand for the opener will receive free admission, a free program and coupon book.
