TOTAL HANDLE SOARS DURING SPA'S

OPENING WEEKEND Total handle (commingled) zoomed 16.8 percent while on-track handle was up 1.8 percent during the opening weekend of the 1995 Saratoga meeting. The total handle of \$43,036,466 was up from \$36,856,121 last year, while the on-track handle of \$9,448,953 was up from \$9,282,653 in '94. The figures do not include twilight simulcasting. At the same time, however, the on-track attendance of 63,384 represented a 7.7 percent decrease from the 1994 opening weekend. "We're gratified with the upward surge in handle," said New York Racing Association Director of Communications and Development Steven Crist. "The response to Saratoga nationwide has been terrific. To be up over six million dollars in four days of racing is tremendous. At the same time, we're extremely happy that the on-track handle and per capita wagering is up. When you also take into account that we have run two less live races, it proves that the product being presented is very attractive to our customers both here and across the nation. At the same time, we are not surprised by the dip in attendance. Basically, we knew that some Sundays during the meet would not match up with last year's attendance figures. In 1994 on the opening Sunday, nine cars were given away. We couldn't match that."

SECRETARIAT NAMED CHEF DE RACE Secretariat (Bold Ruler), Horse of the Year in 1972 and 1973, has been elected an intermediate/solid *chef de race* by the Advisory Committee on Dosage. The announcement was made in the August 1995 issue of *Owner•Breeder*, a monthly journal which serves the Thoroughbred breeding industry. Secretariat was nominated by Robert D. Fierro, editor of the *New York Record* and a member of the committee. In his report, Fierro compares Secretariat's influence with that of *Princequillo, who is Secretariat's broodmare sire and also an intermediate/solid *chef de race*. Fierro cited Secretariat's excellent record as a sire of 55 stakes-winners and as a broodmare sire to argue that "he is qualified on the record to date and in the historical context of such appointees" to be accorded *chef-de-race* status. Secretariat's finest races--including his 31-length victory in the Belmont S.--were run in 1973. He first stood at stud in 1974 and died in 1989. Other members of the committee unanimously agreed with the appointment and with the classification.

Sayyedati, winner of the 1993 British 1000 Guineas, had been unlucky twice before in the Sussex S., finishing 2nd in '93 and 4th in '94. As expected, SULB (El Gran Senor), acting as pacemaker for St. James's Palace S. winner Bahri, made the running, setting a blistering pace. Darnay followed closely in second and Bahri in third with NICOLOTTE (Night Shift) in fourth. Turning into the straight Bahri began to make progress, battling it out with Darnay in the center of the course. Sayyedati then came with a late burst of speed to catch Bahri at the line. "That was a great performance," said winning trainer Clive Brittain. "It is what I have seen her do at home; she will work with something and then at the last minute go straight past it. It was never a question that she would not battle; she is very willing. I never had any doubts about putting (her regular exercise rider) Brett Doyle on her. At 22 years old to be prepared to sit and wait at the back and then come through the field like that shows great maturity. Sayyedati will be trained now for Deauville's Prix Jacques Le Marois next month. She will then go straight to the Breeders' Cup Mile--we won't run her in the Queen Elizabeth as she doesn't like Ascot--and I'd love to see her stay in training as a six-year-old if her owner agrees to it."

Kuantan (Gone West), a \$85,000 Keeneland September yearling, won his only prior start at Royal Ascot June 23; the Virginia-bred will be stretching out from five to six furlongs. **Polaris Flight** (Northern Flagship), successful against listed stakes company in the July 15 Doncaster Sales Rose Bowl S. at Newbury, was also sold at auction, bringing \$70,000 as a weanling at the 1993 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. The Richmond S. has been won over the past 20 years by the likes of multiple champions J.O. Tobin and Warning (GB).

Sunday, Monmouth Park:

HASKELL INVITATIONAL H.-GI, \$500,000, 3yo, 9f

Jockey Pat Day has picked up the mount on MGSW **Suave Prospect** (Fortunate Prospect) for the Haskell. Trainer Christophe Clement reported from his Belmont Park base that **Blu Tusmani** (Afleet), winner of the GII Withers S. May 3, turned in his final Haskell prep yesterday. "He worked a half-mile in :47 4/5 on the Belmont main track," Clement said. "The work was a good one. I think we'll either ship him the night before or early on the morning of the race." Breezing at Saratoga Wed. was GIII Round Table S. winner **Kingdom City** (Cryptoclearance). "He worked five-eighths in 1:02 and change and ran the last eighth in :11 4/5 on the main track," said trainer Elliot Walden. "(Jockey Craig) Perret worked him and he thought he went well. This horse is not a real strong work horse. This is as good as he's ever gone." New York-bred **John and Pat** (Shimatoree), unbeaten in three starts this year, had his final prep for the Grade I event at Monmouth yesterday. "He worked a slow half," trainer John Forbes said. "That's just what we wanted him to do." Sir Barton S. winner **Mighty Magee** (Cormorant) shipped into Monmouth from Pimlico Tuesday night.

Sunday, Saratoga:

JIM DANDY S.-GII, \$125,000a, 3yo, 9f

According to trainer Willard Freeman, everything is going according to plan with GII Dwyer S. winner **Hoolie** (Criminal Type) as he prepares for the Jim Dandy. "We're right on schedule; he's doing great," said Freeman. "All I hope for is a very fast track on Sunday." Trainer Pete Vestal said yesterday that **Peruvian** (Conquistador Cielo) will start next in the GII event. The chestnut colt won the GIII Iroquois S. and Ellis Park Juvenile S. last year, but is winless in two allowance tries at three. "We breezed him (Tuesday) and he did very well," said Vestal. *Daily Racing Form* clockers caught Peruvian in a bullet :59 3/5 for five furlongs over Saratoga's main track. "We'll most likely gallop him into the race and if I don't see anything wrong with his performance then we're definitely going to go. I think it's a pretty wide open field. I really believe that this race is a good opportunity for this horse."

Sunday, Fort Erie:

PRINCE OF WALES S.-GIC, \$100,000a, Canadian-Breds, 3yo, 9 1/2f

Regal Discovery (Regal Classic), 1 1/4-length winner of the Queens Plate July 9, will attempt to sweep the first two jewels of the Canadian Triple Crown when he goes to the post Sunday. The Roger Attfield-trainee drilled five furlongs in :59 flat at Fort Erie yesterday. "I couldn't be happier with this horse," said Attfield. "He could very well move on from the Plate. As far as I'm concerned his work couldn't have been better. He really came the last eighth of a mile smartly and he galloped out really, really strong." Queens Plate runner-up **Freedom Fleet** (Afleet) also breezed yesterday, covering six furlongs in 1:17 over Fort Erie's training track. "He's not really what you'd call a good work horse," admitted trainer Danny Vella. "But the training track seemed slower than usual this morning. This horse is better now than going into the Plate. He's put on at least 25 pounds." **Mt. Sassafras** (Mt. Livermore), third in both the Queens Plate and the Plate Trial S., worked a half-mile Wed. in :48, galloping out five furlongs in 1:01. Also working for the Prince of Wales yesterday were **Kiridashi** (Bold Ruckus), fourth in the Queens Plate, who drilled a half-mile in :47 4/5; **Counter Combo** (Geiger Counter), who covered the same distance in :48 4/5; and **Ice Agent** (Miswaki), 13th in the Plate, who went five furlongs over Woodbine's turf training track in 1:00. Considered possible for Sunday's race is Queen's Plate 12th-place finisher **Stanley Silver** (Silver Deputy).

Local News, Ohio:

During the Ohio State Racing Commission's monthly meeting at Northfield Park in Cleveland July 19, it voted unanimously to uphold the stewards' decision to declare a race at River Downs and Thistle-down July 2 no contest. All wagers on the race simulcast from El Presidente Hippodrome Remon in Panama City, Panama are refundable. According to the Ohio Revised Code, OSRC Executive Director Clifford A. Nelson said in the normal course of events, unless a simulcast is televised, wagering on the race cannot take place. River Downs and Thistle-down have refunded \$61,584 of the \$62,680 wagered on the simulcast. While refunds will continue, the tracks were ordered to place the remaining \$1,096 not refunded as of July 19 into wagering pools on one future simulcast race at an unspecified time.



Low Key Affair, a MSW in Ireland and winner of the GIII Chicago Budweiser Breeders' Cup H. in her last start June 24, allowed her four rivals to fight it out on the front end early while she lagged 8 lengths behind down the backside. Under new rider Pat Day, the bay filly closed the gap on the turn, swung four wide at the top of the stretch then gained steadily to wear down heavy 3-5 favorite Classy Mirage in the final 70 yards. "It was one of those races that on paper was set up just the way we had wanted it," said Todd Pletcher, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "We knew that with four fast fillies we would most likely have some early fast fractions and that's exactly what we got. We just wanted to lay off the pace and then make our move at the right time. You always worry when your horse is seven or eight lengths back, but it worked out just fine." Trainer Allen Jerkens said of Classy Mirage, "She ran hard. I guessed she would be beat after setting those early fractions and having a lightweight come down in the middle of the track. The rail was also tiring, but she gave her best." Pletcher added that the August 13 Ballerina would probably be next for Low Key Affair.
