PASEANA RETIRED Paseana (Arg) (Ahmad {Arg}), the Champion Older Mare in 1992 and 1993, has been retired. The eight-year-old Argentine-bred tore a suspensory ligament in her left foreleg during the running of Sunday's GI Vanity Invitational H. at Hollywood, in which she finished fifth. She will be retired to owner Sidney Craig's Rancho Santa Fe in California and will be sent to Kentucky for the 1996 breeding season. Paseana began her career in Argentina, where she took three Group events at ages three and four. She was then sent to Southern California and the barn of trainer Ron McAnally, who saddled her to victories in 10 Grade I stakes, including the 1992 Breeders' Cup Distaff, the Apple Blossom H. in '92 and '93, the Milady H. in '92 and '93 and the Santa Margarita Invitational H. in '92 and '94. She retires with a North American race record of 28-14-10-1 and earnings of \$3,115,012, more than any other North American-based filly or mare with the exception of Dance Smartly, who earned \$3,263,835 before her retirement in 1992.

NYSRWB REEVALUATES DRUG PROCEDURES

New York State Racing and Wagering Board Chairman Jerry Bilinski yesterday announced the Board has reevaluated its procedures for punishing drug positives and as a result has developed a graduated scale of penalties that now will be imposed for infractions of the rules. "All medications are not 'drugs' in the vernacular sense; horses do require medication from time to time," said Bilinski. "The regulatory system, therefore, must provide some flexibility." Drugs will now fall into three categories: those which have no generally accepted veterinary use in the racehorse and possess a high potential to alter performance; others that have the potential to affect performance but also have accepted therapeutic application; and therapeutic medications used routinely to treat racehorses and with little or no potential for enhancing performance. "The new guidelines have been developed in interest of fairness to participants in the sport, as well as to protect the public interest and assure there are significant penalties for those persons using performance enhancing substances," Bilinski said. "We plan to be much more strict regarding performance enhancing substances that do not belong on the racetrack, but also more fair when it comes to therapeutic uses of medications." The currently pending drug positives will be resolved based on this new initiative.

CARSON CITY FILLY TOPS SARATOGA TWO-YEAR-OLDS IN TRAINING SALE A chestnut filly by Carson City--Promiscuous Angel (Deputy Minister) topped Wednesday night's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale. The filly was consigned to the sale by Niall Brennan, agent and purchased for \$110,000 by Thomas R. Warfield, Bringing the second highest price of \$100,000 was Palace Lady, a chestnut filly by His Majesty--Torelia (Torsion). A registered New York-bred and a half-sister to stakeswinners Dr. Kiernan and Majesty's Time, Palace Lady was consigned by Louise McLean, agent and purchased by Robert Reinacher, agent. Overall, 44 two-year-olds were sold for a total of \$1,376,500 and an average of \$31,284, down 16.6 percent from the 1994 average of \$37,513. There were 42 horses reported as not sold.

PENNYHILL PARK RETIRED Pennyhill Park (Ascot Knight), Canada's Champion Older Mare in 1994, has been retired. The five-year-old mare finished fifth and last in Sunday's GI Go For Wand S. at Saratoga and the decision was made shortly thereafter by owners Rod Ferguson and Anderson Farms to retire her. Pennyhill Park won 10 of 36 starts, including the GIII Pimlico Distaff H. May 20 and the GII Turfway Breeders' Cup S. in 1994, for earnings of \$694,567. She will be bred to Seattle Slew in 1996.
