TRA NATIONAL OFFICE FOLDS The Thoroughbred Racing Associations announced yesterday that their national office, located in New York City and headed by Commissioner Brian McGrath, will close effective August 31. The office was expected to be funded by revenue from the National Best Seven, but the bet was cancelled due to insufficient handle at the beginning of April. "This was not any easy decision to make, but it became evident this was the only practical course to follow," said TRA President Cliff Goodrich. "The effectiveness of the national office was severely compromised by an inability among the membership to forge an agreement on a national direction. While many of our members believe in the concept and are deeply appreciative of the leadership and direction Brian McGrath has provided, we have not been able to develop the required broad-based support for specific initiatives to implement them successfully."

GROOM CONVICTED OF SCOTT MURDER

William "Clem" O'Brien, a 58-year-old groom, has been found guilty of murdering Newmarket trainer Alex Scott. O'Brien was convicted after a jury at Norwich Crown Court heard him admit to shooting Scott in the back at point-blank range following an argument at the trainer's Glebe Stud last September. Although he admitted to the killing, O'Brien had entered a plea of not-guilty due to extreme provocation, but Mr. Justice Blofeld, the judge presiding at the case, said, "It is a terrible thing you did. For reasons that are difficult to fathom, you lost your temper in a moment of passion." O'Brien was sentenced to life imprisonment yesterday.


