DEADLY BARN FIRE AT ELLIS PARK As many as 26 Thoroughbreds were killed in a barn fire at Ellis Park early Monday morning. Contained to Barn 10, the blaze was so intense that the flames could be seen for three miles. The barn was completely destroyed. Several horses were able to be freed from the barn, but only two escaped without injury; two horses got out of the stable area and ran across highway U.S. 41 before they were caught at a truck stop. Tejano Run, runner-up in this year's Kentucky Derby, had shipped to Ellis Friday and was stabled just one barn away from the fire, but he was uninjured. The trainers stabled in Barn 10 were Kenny Carneal, Arthur Zeis, Sarah Wells and Howard Brock. One horseman, John Wells, was slightly burned on the shoulder while trying to save the trapped horses. There was no racing scheduled for Monday at Ellis Park; Tuesday's card was cancelled. The cause of the fire has not yet been determined and is under investigation.

NATIONAL TURF WRITERS ANNOUNCE

AWARD WINNERS Jimmy Croll, Jay Hovdey and the late Mark Kaufman have been named 1995 award winners by the National Turf Writers Association. Croll, owner/trainer of 1994 Horse of the Year Holy Bull, won with the Mr. Fitz Award for typifying the spirit of horse racing. Hovdey, a free-lance writer from California, won the Walter Haight Award for outstanding achievement in turf writing. Kaufman was honored with the Joe Palmer Award for meritorious service in horse racing. The director of special projects for the Emerald Racing Association in Washington at the time of his passing, he died of a heart attack May 2 at the age of 47. The NTWA will hold its 36th annual awards dinner Wednesday, October 25 in New York.
