ELLIS PARK COPING WITH AFTER-EFFECTS OF FIRE One day after fire destroyed an entire barn

on the Ellis Park backstretch, the after-effects of Monday's tragedy were being felt. The fire, confined to Ellis Park's Barn 10, killed 27 Thoroughbreds including Coax for a Kiss and Deal Ya, both winners on Sunday's card. "Everyone involved is really shaken by what happened Monday morning," said Ellis Park Vice President and General Manager Richard T. Schnaars. "Horsemen have been very supportive to the owners and trainers that have suffered losses. Our general office switchboard has been inundated with calls from patrons and fans offering their support and condolences to everyone involved. Officials from the surrounding communities and even other racetracks from around the country have called to offer help and support in any way they can." Kentucky fire and arson investigators issued a press release late Monday afternoon stating that the fire was being investigated as accidental, but arson had not been ruled out. They are still on the scene working to determine the fire's exact origin and cause. Twenty of the horses killed were under the care of trainer Art Zeis. They included six owned by Tony Allen: Apple of Hera, Luck of the Broque, Blount County, Danzig Dawn, Tellico Lineman, Vanessa Margaret and Lady Gadomski; four owned by Yuliya Hansen: Ochlophobia, Deal Ya, Grey Bear and Wowzy; two owned by Elmer Miller: Coax for a Kiss and Miami Fort; two owned by David Morgan: Four Sisters and Twice the Ice; two owned by Barbara Finks Hancock: Starstripe and Snip and Lace N Shenanigans: Richard Taylor's La Fabulette; Sherry T. Schweikert's Orderly Princess; and Mark of Glory, owned by Zeis himself. Trainer Sarah Wells lost three horses she owned: J.W. Freebie, J.W. Willard and Lady Clever, Howard Brock lost two: Sassacsal, owned by his wife Martha; and Jack Heffington's Barrister Jack. Kenneth Carneal also lost two: Preston Dassel's Lostinabluenote; and Favoritetimeofday, who he owned himself. All the horses were covered by a joint insurance policy funded by Ellis Park and the HBPA. John Griffith, treasurer of the Kentucky HBPA, is in the process of sending the necessary information to the office of R.J. Katch Equine Insurance in Lexington, Kentucky for processing. "We've been told by officials of the insurance company that owners and trainers will start receiving their settlement checks in about two weeks," said Griffith. Training resumed Tuesday morning on the backstretch, and racing will resume Wed. afternoon.

"Golden Attraction is doing great. She worked Monday, a half-mile in :48 3/5 (at Monmouth)," said Dallas Stewart, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. The filly's record currently stands at three starts and three wins for earnings of \$155,587.
