SANDY HAWLEY INJURED AT WOODBINE Hall of Fame jockey Sandy Hawley sustained an injury Wednesday evening during the post parade for the sixth race at Woodbine, and was taken to Etobicoke General Hospital for further examination. Dr. Lou Teglas, Woodbine's examining physician, said Hawley "could possibly have a cracked pelvis." Teglas said Hawley was conscious and alert when he came into the track infirmary. but considering Hawley heard a "cracking sound" and knew where the pain was coming from, Teglas called the Etobicoke General Hospital Emergency Room and immediately sent the 46-year-old rider there for further X-rays. Hawley, winner of over 6,300 races in his career, suffered the injury after his scheduled mount for the sixth race, Regent's Revenue, reared and dumped him in the post parade, rolling over the two-time Sovereign Award-winning jockey. Hawley is currently having an outstanding season at Woodbine in 1995, leading the rider standings with 93 wins.

FHBPA/HIALEAH IN COURT The Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association is headed back to court to defend itself against new charges brought by Hialeah Park. Hialeah yesterday filed an action for a declarative judgement in Miami Circuit Court, challenging the one percent from purse money with which the FHBPA funds its organization. While the arrangement is a fairly standard one with horsemen's groups across the country, Hialeah cites a 1981 Florida Supreme Court case where the justice found the rule which permits the collection of the one percent as unconstitutional. In its ruling, the Supreme Court overturned a lower court's decision. According to Hialeah Vice President and General Manager John Van Lindt, the court ruling stated that the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering does not have the right to set aside one percent of purse money for horsemen. After the rule was struck down in 1981, it reappeared on the books in the mid-1980s and has been collected since.

COOLMORE BUYS LAKE CONISTON Lake Coniston (Ire) (Bluebird), who confirmed himself Europe's leading sprinter when winning last month's G1 July Cup at Newmarket, will be retired to Robert Sangster's Coolmore Stud in Ireland after a bid to land the Breeders' Cup Sprint. The four-year-old, purchased for 22,000 guineas as a yearling but now valued at about 2 million pounds, will race next in the Haydock Park Sprint Cup Sept. 2. His only other target before retirement is America's big November fixture at Belmont Park. Harry Herbert, son of the Queen's racing manager Lord Carnaryon and head of the syndicate which part-owns Lake Coniston, said, "This (deal) is a substantial reward for the shareholders. It's fantastic for syndication because it proves you can have a big horse and there is a chance of hitting the jackpot."

ARGENTINE CLASSIC WINNER TO MULHALL

El Florista (Arg) (El Basco), winner of the Carlos Pellegrini H., Argentina's equivalent of the Breeders' Cup Classic, has arrived at trainer Dick Mulhall's barn at Del Mar after completing seven days of quarantine at LAX airport. "He needs to get acclimated," said Mulhall. "The quarantine was rough on him. He lost some weight." Owned by The Thoroughbred Corp., El Florista was a three-time Group 1 winner in Argentina. Mulhall said he was unsure whether or not the five-year-old horse would be ready to run at the Del Mar meeting.

FAIR GROUNDS ANNOUNCES STAKES

SCHEDULE The Fair Grounds yesterday announced its stakes schedule for the 1995-96 meeting, which includes 56 Thoroughbred stakes and one match race. The 88-day meeting marks Fair Grounds' 124th season and begins Thanksgiving Day, November 23, 1995 and runs through March 25, 1996. Highlighting the schedule will be the \$300,000-guaranteed GIII New Orleans H. for older horses at 1 1/8-miles and the \$300,000-guaranteed GIII Louisiana Derby for three-year-olds at 1 1/16-miles March 17. Louisianabreds take the spotlight December 9 when Fair Grounds hosts the fifth annual Louisiana Champions Day in conjunction with the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders' Association. "We are excited about the upcoming racing season," said Mervin Muniz, director of racing. "We broke all our previous records last year in terms of total handle and average daily wagering. The construction on our new grandstand project will be finished in mid-January, but racing fans won't have to wait to see some of the best racing in the country."

FANJICA TO AMERICA Fanjica (Ire) (Law Society), winner of the July 8 G3 Lancashire Oaks at Haydock, has been bought by Gary Tanaka and will continue her racing career in America after running this Sunday in Deauville's Prix de Pomone. The filly, previously fourth in the Italian Oaks and a runner-up in Newmarket's Pretty Polly S., is currently trained by John Dunlop. But Tanaka said, "She'll definitely go to America by the end of the year, whatever happens this weekend." Tanaka has acquired several highclass British horses to race in the U.S.--including 1992 British and Irish Oaks winner User Friendly (GB) (Slip Anchor {GB}) and 1994 Epsom and Irish Derby third Colonel Collins (El Gran Senor). Tanaka's best current runner is probably Gold And Steel (Fr) (Shining Steel {GB}), winner of the GII American Derby 10 days ago.


