HAWLEY UNDERGOES SURGERY Jockey Sandy Hawley was resting comfortably in the intensive care unit of Etobicoke General Hospital after undergoing early-morning surgery Thursday to repair internal damage caused when a horse reared and fell on him during the post parade of Wednesday's sixth race at Woodbine. Hawley, who is currently leading rider at Woodbine, was bleeding internally and sustained damage to his bladder, according to his wife, Lisa. The 46-year-old rider also suffered a broken rib. "Sandy still has a lot of pain in the pelvic area and a specialist will be conducting further tests," said Mrs. Hawley. "It's likely he'll be out of action for at least two months." Relatively free of serious injury throughout his career, the Canadian Hawley missed a majority of the 1993 season after undergoing surgery to remove a "spot" on his lung; in 1985, he was diagnosed with malignant melanoma and had 32 lymph nodes and a tumor near his right shoulder blade removed. Twice named Canada's Athlete of the Year and the recipient of a special Sovereign Award as Canada's Man of the Year in Racing four years ago, Hawley was the first jockey in history to ride 500 winners in a single season; he is a member of both the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame and the National Museum and Racing Hall of Fame.

RIVA RANGER EUTHANIZED Riva Ranger (Video Ranger), who won Wednesday's Graduation S. for two-year-old California-breds at Del Mar before breaking down as he was being pulled up, was euthanized Thursday morning when it became obvious he was not going to be able to survive a shattered front left sesamoid and a fractured and displaced cannon bone. Trainer Brian Lynch said the decision was made by veterinarian Scott Merrill "as soon as we could assess the matter." The colt had been treated following the race and was kept in a stall at Lynch's barn. The Graduation S. victory was the first stakes win for trainer Lynch and owners Al and Neil Toffel.

Unaccounted For (Private Account), winner of the '94 GI Jim Dandy S., found the winners' circle for the first time this year July 1 at Belmont, when he wore blinkers for the first time and took a 1 1/16-mile allowance by a resounding 9 1/2-lengths. "We turned him out last winter," said trainer Scotty Schulhofer, "and we turned him out for too long, I think. It took him a long time to get back in gear once he came back. I ran him on the turf first time out to get a race into him and when he ran back on dirt, I don't know what happened, he just didn't run like we expected him to. So, we put a pair of blinkers on him and he ran a big race."

Four-year-old **Alpride (Ire)** (Alzao), the Highweight Filly at 2 in Italy, raced exclusively in Italy until coming to America this year. In her U.S. debut July 2 at Hollywood, the Ron McAnally trainee took the GI Beverly Hills H. at 9-1 odds to up her career record to six wins in eight starts for earnings of \$375,455. Alpride, a Christmas gift to Jenny Craig from husband Sidney, worked a half-mile in :47 3/5 at Del Mar Thursday under jockey Chris McCarron. "She went great," said McCarron. "She galloped easy the first part and I asked her a little toward the end so she'd finish and she did."

**Sunday, Del Mar:**

EDDIE READ H.-GI, \$300,000a, 3yo/up, 1 1/8mT Northern Spur (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), a two-time Group stakes winner in France last year, will make his North American debut for new owner Charles Cella in Sunday's GI Eddie Read H. The four-year-old, who sports a career record in France of 6-2-3-1 for earnings of \$147,969, last raced October 1, 1994 when he finished second in the G3 Prix de Lutece at Longchamp. He breezed five furlongs in 1:00 3/5 (dogs up) over the Del Mar turf yesterday. Also prepping for the Eddie Read yesterday was GI Santa Anita H. winner **Urgent Request (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest), who went three furlongs on the turf in a snappy :35 4/5. In his last outing July 22 at Hollywood, Urgent Request finished 4th in the GI Caesar's Palace Turf H.

DARLEY TO RAISE STALLION QUOTAS Sheikh Mohammed's Darley Stud Management has decided to increase the number of mares covered by its stallions next year. Company policy has until now been to restrict coverings to 50 per stallion per season. But, for 1996, that figure will be raised to 66. A statement released by Darley read, "The decision has been influenced, among other factors, by the views of shareholders in the syndicated stallions managed by Darley Stud Management. The company remains committed to the policy of restricting stallions to a limited book of mares." Darley has been criticized by some breeders who found difficulty in obtaining access to Darley stallions because the majority of nominations were required for mares owned by the Sheikh and his relations.

AMERICAN-BASED HORSES TRY FOR GLORY IN BRAZIL

The Richard Mandella-trained **Talloires** (Tremolino) and the Rodney Rash-trained **Celtic Arms (Fr)** (Comrade in Arms {GB}) have left their Southern California bases for Brazil in the hopes of winning Sunday's Group 1 Grande Premio Brasil, the country's most important horse race. Worth \$1,232,590 to the winner, the Grande Premio Brasil is for four-year-olds and up at a distance of 1 1/2-miles on the turf. Kentucky-bred Talloires comes into the race off a close second in the July 1 Jim Murray H. at Hollywood, while Celtic Arms, a MG1 winner in France last year, finished second to the Brazilian-bred Sandpit in the GI Caesars International H. at Atlantic City June 25. Both runners went out on the turf track at La Gavea in Rio de Janeiro Thursday. Talloires covered one circuit (10 1/2-furlongs) and quickened nicely over the final three furlongs. Celtic Arms also did a circuit. The favorite going into Sunday's

event is last year's winner and reigning Brazilian Horse of the Year **Much Better (Braz)** (Baynoun {Ire}). The six-year-old completed a sparkling final preparatory work at the nearby farm of his trainer Joao Luis Maciel yesterday, clocking a second quicker than when doing his last work over the same distance a year ago, just days before winning the Grade Premio Brasil.

NATIONAL SIMULCAST CONFERENCE TO BE HELD IN SEPTEMBER The American Quarter Horse Association (AQHA), Harness Tracks of America (HTA) and the Thoroughbred Racing Associations (TRA) announced Wednesday they are jointly conducting a national pari-mutuel simulcasting conference this September 25-27 at the Westin Hotel in Indianapolis. This is the pari-mutuel industry's third annual simulcasting conference. The conference, open to all members of the pari-mutuel industry, has a dual format, with one agenda dedicated to accounting issues and a second focusing on other components of simulcasting. There will also be several general sessions for all attendees that will provide an overview of the simulcast operation and identify new technologies and opportunities for the future. "Simulcasting has become a major portion of the wagering handle and, as an evolving operation, requires industry-wide education and cooperation to function efficiently and realize its full potential," TRA Executive Vice President Chris Scherf said. Pre-registration is required, and attendance is limited to 225. For more information, contact the TRA at (410) 392-9200.
