Regularly employed by trainer Leo O'Brien, Vizcarrondo was freelancing aboard the filly Lavender Blue for trainer Tom Walsh when the accident occurred. According to O'Brien, who was in Saratoga at the time of the accident, one of his own horses was galloping in company with Lavender Blue out of the starting gate. Lavender Blue began lagging behind shortly into the work; when Vizcarrondo went to pick up his whip, the horse ducked and hit the rail, throwing the rider. Vizcarrondo also hit the rail and suffered multiple fractures of the upper body and chest area, which Detective Richard Brock of the Nassau County Police Department said were the cause of death. The rider was taken to Franklin General Hospital, where he was pronounced dead on arrival. An autopsy will be performed. According to Walsh, Vizcarrondo was not wearing a protective vest, currently mandatory for exercise riders at Florida and New Jersey racetracks, at the time of the accident.
