BIDDING READY TO START AT

SARATOGA The 75th annual Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Summer Yearling Sale gets underway tonight at 8:00 p.m., with 75 yearlings scheduled to pass through the sales ring in Saratoga Springs, New York. A total of 212 colts and fillies will be offered over the course of the three-day sale, which concludes Thursday night. "We think we're going to have a good sale," said Geoffrey Russell, Director of Sales Administration for Fasig-Tipton. "The comments from the people on the grounds about the confirmation and physical attributes of the horses have been very favorable. The right people are here." Among the expected highlights are Hip #46, a colt by Danzig--Safely Home (Winning Hit); consigned by Gainesway Farm as agent for Dark Hollow Farm/Wild Oak Plantation, the bay is a half-brother to champion Safely Kept (Horatius); Hip #67, a colt by Storm Cat--Stick to Beauty (Illustrious); consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Wycombe House Stud, he is a half-brother to champion sprinter Gold Beauty (Mr. Prospector), herself dam of MGISW Maplejinsky and European Horse of the Year Dayjur; and Hip #110, a colt by Gone West--Ambassador of Luck (What Luck); out of a champion, the yearling is a half to two stakes winners. Top filly prospects include Hip #2, a daughter of Deputy Minister--Meadow Star (Meadowlake); she is the first foal from the champion and six-time Grade I winner who is best remembered for her gallant photo-finish victory over Lite Light in the 1991 Mother Goose. "The consignors have been saying that they've been showing horses non-stop since Saturday morning," said Russell. "This year, our thought has been to cut out a couple of horses at the bottom and hopefully improve at the top." Last year, 192 yearlings were sold for a gross of \$18,566,000 and an average of \$96,698. (DEVIL HIS DUE DISPUTE ENDS--news cont. p2-3)

DEVIL HIS DUE CASE SETTLED One year after the Internal Revenue Service attempted to seize multiple Grade I winner Devil His Due (Devil's Bag) due to alleged financial ties between owner Edith LiButti and her father Robert LiButti involving the horse, Edith LiButti has been ruled the rightful owner of the six-year-old. The levy placed on Devil His Due by the IRS last August was "wrongful," ruled Judge Thomas McEvoy, the Chief Judge of the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of New York. In a 26-page ruling handed down Thursday and delivered to Edith LiButti's lawyers over the weekend, McEvoy said Libutti had met her burden of proof in showing the levy was wrongful and the government had failed in its burden to show any financial relationship between Robert LiButti and Devil His Due. The court ordered the levy be lifted and the IRS be permanently enjoined from enforcing such a levy. Libutti's lawyers are now deciding whether or not to claim damages and attorney fees from the IRS. Devil His Due last raced May 13, finishing second in the GI Pimlico Special. His current earnings total \$3,920,405. IRS officials from the Newark, New Jersey office which handled the matter declined to comment.

RECORD CATALOGUE FOR KEENELAND SEPTEMBER SALE Keeneland will catalog a record 3,705 horses for its annual September Yearling Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. The 10-day auction begins Monday, Sept. 11 and continues through Wednesday, Sept. 20 in the Keeneland sales pavilion. The total consists of 1,951 colts, 1,749 fillies and five geldings. It tops by 147 the previous record of 3,558 yearlings catalogued for the 1990 sale. Last year, Keeneland catalogued 3,492 horses for the fall auction. The September Sale has produced 186 individual stakes winners who have won 240 stakes races through the first seven months of 1995. Successful fall sale products include Japanese Group 1 winner Dantsu Seattle, Kentucky and Canadian Oaks winner Gal in a Ruckus and British 2000 Guineas victor Pennekamp. In 1994, for the second year in a row, the September Sale set records for gross sales (\$104,709,900) and average (\$37,171). A total of 2.817 horses were sold.

PURSES UP AT ELLIS PARK Officials at Ellis Park announced yesterday that effective Tuesday, August 8, purses for all races except stakes will get a five-percent boost. "Our racing product and our purses are both the best they have ever been," said Ellis Park Vice President and General Manager Richard Schnaars. "We're glad to be able to offer a purse increase to horsemen because of the result, which is good business." The 61-day Ellis summer meet ends Labor Day, Monday, September 4.

ARLINGTON HANDLE SUFFERS Full-card simulcasting from out-of-state has generated a seven percent increase in total handle at Arlington International Racecourse, but betting on the cards from Arlington has nosedived during the first 30 days of the 55-day meeting. On-track betting on Arlington programs is down 27 percent; Illinois intertrack betting has declined 51 percent; and Illinois off-track betting has fallen 45 percent when measured against the numbers from June 24-July 31 last year when Arlington raced 131 days. The figures were released Monday by Scott Mordell, the track's chief executive officer. "More than 40 percent of the consumer choices are going to full-card simulcasting," pointed out Mordell. "This is dramatic when you consider that three months ago (in Illinois) there was no full-card simulcasing. At the same time, total purses are up 11 percent from 1994. The key is to maintain quality racing, but horses per race have not increased from 1994, even with the purse increase. There has been no influx of Kentucky horsemen after the close of Churchill Downs. The 300 stalls set aside eventually were declined. The cash we're putting on the board isn't enough to make the horsemen want to come. Ellis Park is drawing horses which used to come to Arlington." Legalization of full-card simulcasting and raising purses were key components in the legislature's revision of the Illinois racing statute this year.

RACING WELCOMES NEWEST HALL OF

FAMERS Jockey Jerry Bailey and trainer Bobby Frankel were at Saratoga Springs yesterday to accept their accolades as racing's latest inductees to the Hall of Fame. Said the normally reticent Frankel, "It was a very emotional day and I didn't think I'd get emotional, to be honest with you. But we still have to go back to work tomorrow." Bailey, who has narrowly missed out in the Eclipse Award voting for top jockey, remarked, "I certainly appreciate that being in the Hall of Fame takes precedent over so many things. An Eclipse Award would be nice, but it's an affirmation of one year's worth of work, while the Hall of Fame is an affirmation of years worth of work." Also inducted yesterday were racing greats La Prevoyante, Crusader and Foolish Pleasure. Hall of Famer Leroy Jolley, who trained Foolish Pleasure, said, "He was a wonderful horse to have. He had great ability as an athlete, along with courage and determination. To all of us associated with him, Foolish Pleasure was a great pleasure."

CARD CLUB FOR SANTA ANITA COMPANIES To further the value of its gaming and entertainment franchise in Southern California, The Santa Anita Companies yesterday announced an agreement to participate in the development of a proposed 80-table card club in Irwindale, California. The project of businessmen Frank Santin and Michael Meczka is subject to, among other things, the passage of an October 24 Irwindale City ballot measure to permit card clubs in the city. The proposed club would be located five miles from Santa Anita Racetrack and 18 miles from downtown L.A. Under the terms of the agreement, Santa Anita will actively participate in the planning and development of the property, and will provide the financial resources for the construction of the facility. In an unrelated matter, Santa Anita reported that, as a result of the closing of the 45-table Bell Jackpot Casino August 5, it will take a charge in the third quarter of \$2 million. Santa Anita had paid \$2 million for an option to acquire a 50 percent interest in the operation once California legislation changed to permit public company ownership of card clubs. The Bell Jackpot Casino's management, not affiliated with Santa Anita, cited intense competition as the principal cause for closing.
