SARATOGA FIRST SESSION AVERAGE UP

NEARLY 30 PERCENT A bay filly from the first crop of 1992 Horse of the Year A.P. Indy topped yesterday's first session of the 75th annual Saratoga Select Yearling Sale, held Tuesday night at the Fasig-Tipton Sales Paddocks in Saratoga Springs, New York. Out of the multiple Grade III-winning mare Naskra's Return (Naskra), the Pennsylvania-bred filly was purchased for \$430,000 by Laddie Dance of Sparks, Maryland. "She'll go back to the farm in Maryland and then (trainer) Scotty Schulhofer will get her," said Dance. "I thought she was the loveliest filly on the grounds. We looked at all the A.P. Indys in Kentucky and we just fell in love with this filly. We think she has a lot of residual value." Dance also purchased the session's co-highest priced colt at \$400,000, a dark bay or brown individual by Storm Cat--Stick to Beauty (Illustrious). The colt is a halfbrother to champion Gold Beauty and stakes-winners The Prime Minister, Majestic Venture and Miraloma. "He is a nice, well-balanced colt," said Dance. "There's not a hole in that pedigree anywhere. We had three we really wanted and we got two of them." Overall, 64 yearlings were sold for a total of \$8,228,000 and an average of \$128,563, up a sharp 29.6 percent from last year's first session average of \$99,214. There were 11 yearlings reported as not sold. "This was a great display of the American marketplace," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "The sale was up sharply with very little purchasing by foreign owners." The three-day sale concludes Thursday.

His final competitive action will almost certainly be a bid to improve on last October's second to Carnegie in the Arc at Longchamp Oct. 1. Hernando, last year's Highweight Older Horse in France from 11-14 Furlongs, is a halfbrother to MGSW Johann Quatz (Fr) (Sadler's Wells) and Walter Willy (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), a MSW in France. He will be an appropriate addition to the Lanwades team, as his sire Niniski, winner of the Irish St. Leger, has been housed there throughout his stud career.

TATTERSALLS SEPTEMBER YEARLING SALE CATALOG AVAILABLE AUGUST 29 Catalogues

for the Tattersalls Houghton Yearling Sale in Newmarket, England, scheduled for September 26-28, will be available August 29. Over 300 yearlings have been catalogued. Of the 97 sires represented, 34 stallions are North American-based and an additional 35 are North American-bred. MONMOUTH INCREASES OVERNIGHT

STAKES PURSES Monmouth Park's overnight stakes program will get a boost for the rest of the meeting, as purses for the remainder of the schedule will each be increased by \$10,000, the racing office announced Tuesday. Eleven overnight stakes remain on the schedule, and their enhanced purses will range from \$40,000 to \$50,000. The increases are a direct result of the successes of both the live racing and full-card simulcasting programs at the Jersey Shore track this season.

THOROUGHBRED OWNERS OF CALIFORNIA SUPPORT NEW BAY MEADOWS TRACK The

Board of Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) met with the senior management of Bay Meadows August 3, 1995. The purpose of the meeting was for TOC to evaluate Bay Meadows' announced plan to sell the land currently occupied by the track's backstretch, removing all training facilities and in their place constructing a complete training center in the Livermore area. After thorough discussions and evaluation. TOC endorsed the concept of a new and state-of-the-art training facility if, and only if, it is simultaneously constructed and opened with a new state-of-the-art racetrack and grandstand. and if it is in an acceptable location which will serve the San Francisco area fan base. TOC is opposed to the announced plan of Bay Meadows Management to eliminate all training at their track and relocate at Livermore while racing at Bay Meadows. Subsequent to the meeting, the California Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association Board members advised TOC that they supported the above stated position. Bay Meadows Management has assured TOC that under no circumstances will they demolish any existing barns within the next two to three years, and until a complete and final plan is formalized.

KENTUCKY CUP HIGHLIGHTS TURFWAY'S

FALL MEET Turfway Park's fall meet will offer record stakes purses of \$1,225,000 and will be highlighted by the second edition of the Kentucky Cup Day of Champions Saturday, September 23. The 23-date fall meeting opens Wednesday, September 6 and runs through Friday, October 6. The Kentucky Cup Day of Champions will offer six stakes worth a total of \$1 million, highlighted by the \$400,000 Kentucky Cup Classic for ages three and up at 1 1/8-miles, won last year by Preakness and Belmont S. winner Tabasco Cat (Storm Cat). Also on the Kentucky Cup program are the \$100,000 GII Kentucky Cup Juvenile, the \$200,000 Gll Turfway Budweiser Breeders' Cup for fillies and mares, the \$150,000 Kentucky Cup Sprint, the \$100,000 Kentucky Cup Juvenile Fillies and the \$50,000 Kentucky Cup Starter Stake. Three other Turfway stakes have received substantial purse increases for 1995. The Turfway Championship for three-year-olds and up at 1 1/8-miles will kick off the fall stakes season Sept. 9 with a \$75,000 guaranteed purse. Sept. 16, the Breeders' Cup Marfa H. at six furlongs will carry a \$75,000added purse. The fall stakes program concludes Sept. 30 with the running of the \$75,000-added Breeders' Cup Weekend Delight, for fillies and mares at six furlongs.


