STORM CAT COLT TOPS SARATOGA'S SECOND SESSION A dark bay or brown colt by Storm Cat--Buy the Firm (Affirmed) topped Wednesday night's second session of the Saratoga Select Yearling Sale, Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who purchased the colt on behalf of owners Robert and Beverly Lewis for \$410,000, said, "I liked the pedigree. We've had a lot of luck with Storm Cats so the pedigree fit. He was an individual who appealed to me in a lot of ways and he's going to change a lot in the next six months." Bringing the second highest price of \$375,000 was a bay colt by Storm Bird--Aquakiss (Fr) (Kings Lake). Said the colt's purchaser Jim Spence, "We would have bought perhaps a couple if we didn't buy a colt of this quality. We liked his breeding, of course, and that breeding is about the hottest thing there is today on the track. He has wonderful conformation and he could be a classic colt." Spence said the colt will be trained next year by D. Wayne Lukas. Ironically, a year ago yesterday Spence bought Bright Launch (Relaunch), one of the favorites for today's GII Saratoga Special, out of this sale. The top-priced filly selling last night was by Danzig out of the GIII Honey Bee H. winner Under Oath. Tim Sams, agent for buyer Bayard Sharp, said, "She's a beautiful filly. I had marked her as one of the best fillies in the sale. She has really good hindquarters and good balance." Overall, 61 yearlings sold Wednesday night for a total of \$8,079,000 and an average of \$132,443, up 24 percent from last year's second session average of \$106,677. There were 8 yearlings reported as not sold. The sale concludes tonight.

It had been the plan to sit behind the speed and make one run. I had been working her in behind horses and she seemed to enjoy it. She put in a real game effort and that has to be applauded." Kimmel indicated that as long as his filly comes out of the race in good shape, she will run next in the GI Spinaway at Saratoga August 28.

STRODES CREEK RETIRED Strodes Creek (Halo), second and third respectively in last year's Kentucky Derby and Belmont Stakes, has been retired from racing and will stand the 1996 breeding season at Arthur B. Hancock III's Stone Farm in Paris, Kentucky, Bred by Hancock, Strodes Creek raced for a partnership consisting of trainer Charlie Whittingham, Robert and Janice McNair and Hancock. The colt did not race at two, but broke his maiden by eight lengths in his first start in January of his three-year-old year. Later in 1994, the bay colt came flying at the finish to be third in the GI Santa Anita Derby before his second-place effort in the Run for the Roses. "I really believe that with just a little luck, we would have won the Derby with him," said Whittingham. "He was turned sideways on the turn and just lost too much ground to make up." In his first start back after the Belmont, Strodes Creek became a stakeswinner with a score in the Dec. 7 J.O. Tobin S. at Hollywood. In his only two starts this year, the four-year-old finished fourth in both the San Fernando S. and the GI Strub S. at Santa Anita. "We always hoped he would be able to realize his vast potential on the race-track, but we didn't want to get him hurt, so we decided to bring him home," Hancock said. "This is a very good racehorse who had some very bad luck. He has wonderful conformation and a world-class pedigree. I'm very excited to have a Classic-placed son of Halo going to stud with this kind of potential." Strodes Creek retires with a record of 9-3-2-2 for earnings of \$430,006.

FASIG-TIPTON AND KEENELAND SET NOVEMBER SALES DATES The possibility of conflicting sales dates between Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland in Kentucky in November has been averted. Breeders had voiced concerns over a recent release that Keeneland's sale would commence November 11, a date previously announced as a Fasig-Tipton sales day. Fasig-Tipton Chairman D.G. Van Clief Jr. noted that while no commitment had been made by either organization, the two auction companies prefer to avoid a clash. "It would be counter-productive for sellers and buyers alike to go head-to-head in Lexington in November," said Van Clief. Presently scheduled for Fasig-Tipton is an open sale Friday, November 10 and selected sessions of foals and mares Saturday and Sunday, November 11 and 12. Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale is scheduled for November 12 through November 21.

LAKEWAY RETURNS SUNDAY Sharing Sunday's spotlight at Del Mar with the \$1,000,000 Pacific Classic will be the return of one of the top three-year-old fillies of 1994, Lakeway (Seattle Slew), in the \$100,000-added GIII Rancho Bernardo Breeders' Cup H. Lakeway has recorded six victories and two secondplace efforts in eight career starts for earnings of \$594,520. Her triumphs last year included victories in four Grade I events: the Santa Anita Oaks, Hollywood Oaks, Mother Goose S. and Las Virgenes S. When she runs Sunday it will be for the first time in exactly a year, as she last went postward in the August 13, 1994 GI Alabama S., finishing second to eventual Eclipse Award-winner Heavenly Prize (Seeking the Gold) before being diagnosed with a lung infection. "The idea, depending on how hard this race is on her, is to run back in the Chula Vista H. (Sept. 3), which is asking for a bounce because it's awful guick," said Lakeway's trainer Gary Jones. "Then if those two things are accomplished, we're looking at either the Spinster (at Keeneland) or the Beldame (at Belmont) and then back in the Breeders' Cup Distaff."

DAMASCUS DEAD AT 31 Damascus (Sword Dancer), Horse of the Year, Champion Three-Year-Old Colt and Champion Handicap Horse in 1967, died August 8 in his paddock at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky. The 31-year-old Kentucky bred enjoyed great success on the racetrack, winning 17 stakes in 32 starts from 1966 to 1968. Among his triumphs were victories in such prestigious events as the Preakness and Belmont S., Jockey Club Gold Cup, Travers, Wood Memorial, Brooklyn H., Woodward S., Remsen S., Malibu S. and Dwyer H. He retired to Claiborne for the 1969 breeding season with earnings of \$1,176,781 and great expectations. He went on to sire 72 stakes winners, including champions Belted Earl and Lord Durham and Grade I winners Crusader Sword, Desert Wine, Eastern Echo, Gold and Myrrh, Highland Blade, Judger, Lover John, Ogygian, Pacific Princess, Private Account, Soy Numero Uno and Time for a Change. Pensioned in 1989. Damascus will be buried at Claiborne.

GOVERNOR PATAKI SPEAKS AT SARATOGA

Not getting into any specifics, New York Governor George Pataki met with horsemen, New York Racing Association management and the press yesterday at Saratoga and had this message, "I'm here to help." Pataki assured the leadership of the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association that if casinos are legalized in New York, he will take every step to see it is done in a way that protects the racing industry. "If it is done in an intelligent way and with the knowledge of the need to protect the racing industry, I think (the marriage between casinos and racing) can be cooperative as opposed to confrontational," Pataki said. Initial steps have been taken in New York to legalize casinos, but they cannot exist until being approved by the voters. Pataki added he wants to privatize the off-trackbetting operation, but again offered no specifics. Mostly he was there to let the industry know he is supportive of it. "We have to increase purses and continue with capital investment, not just this year but into the future," he said. "We also want to reduce the takeout and do whatever else it takes to make sure New York is once again the preeminent racing circuit in the country."

PACIFIC CLASSIC-GI, \$1,000,000, 3vo/up, 1 1/4m Likely favorite Concern (Broad Brush) was scheduled to leave Baltimore at 3 p.m. EDT Wednesday on a flight expected to have the '94 Breeders' Cup Classic champ bedded down on Del Mar's backstretch late last night. Trainer Richard Small said he wanted to get to the West Coast in plenty of time to let Robert Meyerhoff's colt get a breeze over the seaside track before the race. Concern has already shipped west twice this summer, taking the GI Californian S, at Hollywood in June and most recently finishing sixth in the million dollar Hollywood Gold Cup. Trainer Richard Mandella sent Soul of the Matter (Private Terms) five furlongs Tuesday morning at Del Mar in 1:00 1/5. The four-year-old returned from an eight-month layoff to take the GII Bel Air H. at Hollywood in his last start July 16. "He's done really well since his last race, and he's ready to go," said Mandella, Kent Desormeaux will ride. Also pointing to the race are GII San Diego H. winner Blumin Affair (Dynaformer), '94 Pacific Classic victor Tinners Way (Secretariat) and Kissin Kris (Kris S.). In addition, it was confirmed vesterday by trainer Ron McAnally that Cleante (Arg) (Kleiglight) will be supplemented to the race at a cost of \$30,000. The 1993 Horse of the Year in Argentina, six-year-old Cleante was most recently second to Soul of the Matter in the Bel Air. Cold Snap, undefeated in two career starts, most recently won the \$30,000 Gilded Time S. at Monmouth Park at five furlongs on the turf. "He looks like a real nice horse," said Lukas assistant Dallas Stewart. "He's pretty mature for a two-year-old." Calder-based Built For Pleasure (Homebuilder), winner of his last two outings by a combined 61/4-lengths, breezed a half-mile at Monmouth Tuesday in :48. "Buddy Raines has a horse who can really run (Tyro winner Foolish Pole (Polish Numbers)), and the Lukas horses are going to be tough," said Built For Pleasure's trainer Thomas Heard. "But I have to give this horse a shot. We won't know how good he is unless we try." Also pointing to the Sapling is Cashier Coyote (Regal Humor), who has already notched stakes wins in the Hialeah Juvenile S. and the Magic City Juvenile S. at Birmingham. The Florida-bred will be using Lasix for the first time Saturday.
