#### A.P. INDY TOPS AT STRONG

SARATOGA SALE Trainer Angel Penna Jr. can look forward to having this year's sales topper from Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Yearling Sale in his barn next year. The colt, by A.P. Indy out of the graded-stakes winner Immerse (Cox's Ridge), was consigned by Will Farish's Lane's End, agent; he went for a bid of \$440,000 to Frank Mansell and Martha Gerry during last night's final session of the three-day auction. Said Penna of the buy, "I liked his pedigree and the way he looks. Mr. Farish is Mrs. Gerry's nephew; while there are no guarantees, we think he is going to be a good one. He'll go back to Lane's End to be broken, and from there he'll go to Ocala." A filly by A.P. Indy--Naskra's Return (Naskra), purchased by Laddie Dance on the sale's opening night, was this year's high-priced filly. going for a bid of \$430,000. Russell Drake, agent for Martin and Pam Wygod, purchased Thursday's top filly. Drake bid \$400.00 for a daughter of Storm Cat out of the multiple-stakes winner Great Escape (Relaunch). "Basically, we were just looking for a nice pedigree," said Drake. "I thought she was one of the nicest fillies in the sale. We like Storm Cat, and how can you argue with that? I actually thought she would go for a little more. The mare is a little light in her pedigree, but the filly is a nice individual." A total of 51 yearlings passed through the ring Thursday night, bringing a gross of \$6,238,000, an average of \$122,314; 12 were not sold. Last year's final session saw 71 hips sold for \$6,076,000, an average of \$85,577. The 1995 Saratoga Yearling Sale showed a marked increase in gross, average and median prices. In all, 176 yearlings sold for \$22,545,000, up 21.4 percent from last year's sale, when 192 horses sold for a total of \$18,566,000; the '95 average, \$128,097, was up 32.4 percent from the '94 figure of \$96,698. The median price posted an astonishing 42.8 percent gain, from \$70,000 in 1994 to \$100,000 this year. There were 31 not sold this year, as compared to 49 a year ago. Said Fasig-Tipton Chairman D.G. Van Clief, Jr., "It was obviously a very, very spirited horse sale. The numbers speak for themselves. The feedback was great from the first day we started showing, and that carried through to the end. The demand is obviously up, and the overall quality of the sale generated an enthusiasm we haven't seen in years." (Thursday's top colts & fillies - p6) News cont. p2-3

**DUE PROCESS STABLE UNAFFECTED BY BANKRUPTCY** Robert Brennan, who has filed for protection under Chapter 11 of the U.S. Bankruptcy Act, said yesterday that he did not expect the filing to have any impact on his racing and breeding interests. "The application for protection under Chapter 11 is designed to protect the integrity of my various business interests, including racing," said Brennan yesterday at Saratoga Racecourse. "The filing will serve to benefit all of the employees of my various interests, as well as myself and any and all creditors." Brennan, whose financial dealings have been under investigation for three years, filed for bankruptcy Monday, just days before a \$75 million civil judgement owed the Securities

MUHTARRAM TO NUNNERY Muhtarram (Alleged), retired after seriously injuring a foreleg in last month's Coral-Eclipse Stakes at Sandown, will stand at owner Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum's Nunnery Stud in Norfolk, England in 1996. The stud fee will be £3,000, with a live foal concession. The six-year-old amassed more than \$800,000 in prize money during his racing career, which included two Group One victories. "We are delighted," said Nunnery Stud Manager Richard Lancaster. "He was a high-class racehorse with excellent form from two to six, plus a first-class pedigree and extremely good conformation."

#### **GULFSTREAM OFFERS RECORD STAKES**

PROGRAM Gulfstream Park, the showcase for both Cigar and Thunder Gulch in 1995 as they began their run toward national titles, will offer a record stakes schedule worth \$4,750,000, for the 1996 meet, January 3 - March 16. The Florida track has carded 39 stakes for '96, with 27 carrying graded status. Highlighting the schedule are a trio of Grade I events: the \$500,000 Florida Derby, March 16; \$300,000 Donn H., February 10; and \$500,000 Gulfstream Park H., March 2. Horses pointing for the Dubai Cup March 27 could use the Donn and Gulfstream Park handicaps as stepping stones to the \$4 million race. "The average temperature in South Florida during the first few months of the vear is very similar to that of Dubai," said Gulfstream Director of Racing Robert Umphrey, "and it is possible to connect to Dubai right out of Miami.'

#### COMPOSER, PYRAMID PEAK PREP FOR

TRAVERS Trainer Bill Mott said Thursday GII Jim Dandy winner Composer (Easy Goer) is "looking good" as he prepares for the August 19, \$750,000 Travers S. The bay colt breezed six furlongs over Saratoga's fast main track in 1:13.12 Wednesday; Mott said Composer will breeze again Monday or Tuesday. Haskell runner-up Pyramid Peak (Mt. Livermore) is also in good shape for the Travers, according to Donna Ward, assistant and wife to trainer John Ward. The colt drilled five furlongs at Saratoga yesterday in :59.92. "This is the last hard work he'll put in before the Travers," Ward said. Trainer Dominick Schettino said yesterday he may take a shot at the Midsummer Derby with Rank and File (Forty Niner), winner of a 1 1/8-mile allowance at Saratoga last Saturday. "At this moment it's a strong possibility," Schettino said. "We'll have to see how the field comes along and how sharp he is."

SKYWALKER TO STONE FARM Skywalker (Relaunch), sire of champion Bertrando and 24 other stakes horses, will be moved to Arthur B. Hancock's Stone Farm in Paris, Kentucky for the 1996 breeding season. The 13-year-old stallion had stood at Cardiff Stud Farms in California. A Grade I winner of more than \$2.2 million, Skywalker has sired 21 percent stakes horses from starters; to date, his six crops of racing age have earned more than \$8.2 million. "Skywalker has had a somewhat limited opportunity at stud, but still sired a champion," said Hancock. "That, and the fact he is from the In Reality sire line, makes me very pleased to see him stand at Stone Farm. He was foaled and raised here, and we're glad to have him back." The stallion is the property of a syndicate.

NUMBERS DROP AT CALDER Since the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering forced Calder Race Course to end its 13-day full-card simulcasting experiment, the track has experienced a decline of 9.2 percent in daily handle and 9.5 percent in daily attendance over last year's figures. Calder began the year with handle off 3 percent and attendance down 5.5 percent, but business rebounded significantly during the 13 days of full-card simulcasting, with a 25.8 percent increase in handle and a 4.3 increase in attendance. "I've been a general manager in this business for 20 years...and I have never been so frustrated. I have no explanation why we should be off three times as much after simulcasting," said Calder President Ken Dunn. "I don't want to play psychologist and try to figure people's minds. We haven't changed our advertising, the weather is the same, there's no stock market crash." And, because of the decreased handle, purses have had to be cut. "Purses averaged \$101,000 a day last year and we started this year at \$104,000 a day. With the decline in handle, we cut purses to \$99,000 a day, and we will evaluate that on a weekly basis," said Dunn, who is working with industry leaders on an attempt to regain permission for full-card simulcasting. But, he said yesterday, "If we can't get permission from the state in the next couple of weeks, we're going to leave it until the legislative session (set for March, 1996)."

LORD DERBY TO STAND OWINGTON Lord Derby has purchased a major interest in last year's July Cup hero Owington (Green Desert) and will stand the now four-year-old at one of his two Newmarket studs from 1996. Bred by the current Lord Derby's late uncle, Owington was sold as a yearling; the deal to reacquire the horse values him at upwards of \$2.4 million. Third in this year's July Cup last time out, the colt is expected to run in the Haydock Park Sprint Cup and the Breeders' Cup Sprint before his retirement; he will stand at either New England Stud or Woodland Stud and cover 65 mares in his first year and 70 in each subsequent season.


