TRA MAKES PLANS FOR FUTURE The Thoroughbred Racing Associations' Board of Directors met for an hour and a half yesterday in Saratoga Springs and approved the recommendation of its Executive Committee to close the Commissioner's National Office August 31. Also approved during the session was a plan to restructure the Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau; the plan will implement cost-cutting measures while maintaining the organization as an effective national investigative force. The Directors will formulate a 1996 business plan which will continue the initiatives of the National Office, including the ESPN2-aired "2Day at the Races," the discussion of a possible racing series structured around selected three-year-old races, and the exploration of sponsorship opportunities.

NEW SPONSOR FOR ST. LEGER Pertemps, one of Britain's biggest recruitment agencies, has stepped in to support the St. Leger only days after the world's oldest Classic lost its previous sponsor. Officials at Doncaster announced last weekend that TeleConnection (UK), with whom they had signed a deal for three years, had pulled out of their main event due to financial problems and with the race set for September 9, prospects of making alternative arrangements seemed bleak. But Pertemps stepped into the breach yesterday, offering a four-year sponsorship which guarantees added prize money of £200,000 each season until 1998.

ATTEMPTED SUICIDE AT DEL MAR A 38-vearold man ran onto the track 50 yards from the finish line during the feature race at Del Mar Thursday in an apparent suicide attempt. But, thanks to the skill of the jockeys and a lot of luck, the horses were able to steer clear, and no one was injured. Russell Howard Caputo tried to escape into the infield after the incident but was taken into custody by track security, who turned him over to the San Diego County Sheriff's Department. Caputo was later sent to the county's mental health facility for 72 hours observation.

DANZIG SEASONS TOP STALLION ACCESS

SALE A pair of 1996 No Guarantee Nominations to the exceptional stallion Danzig topped last night's Stallion Access Champagne Sale of Selected Seasons and Shares at Saratoga Springs. The first Danzig nomination offered brought a bid of \$125,000, while a second did not reach its reserve of \$124,000; the third Danzig season was knocked down for \$109,000. In all, a total of 51 seasons sold for a gross of \$1,135,000, an average of \$22,269. The total gross of \$1,207,700 for the sale included the one share sold; a share in Phone Trick was purchased for \$72,000. Numbers were up for the sale; last year, a total of 57 seasons and shares sold for \$1,080,100, an average of \$18,949. The average showed a gain of 17.5 percent, while the gross was up 11.8 percent.

GENEROUS OFFER ACCEPTED Generous (Ire)

(Caerleon), winner of the 1991 Epsom and Irish Derbys, is virtually certain to leave Britain and continue his stud career in Japan, A bid from the Japan Racing Association, valuing the seven-year-old stallion at nine million pounds, has been accepted by a majority of shareholders. Only unfavorable reports from Far Eastern veterinarians can now prevent the chestnut horse from joining the exodus of high-class European and North American stallions. The JRA made an offer for Generous earlier this year but was turned down. However, this week's new bid--putting a value of £200,000 on each of 45 shares--seems to have secured his services. Philip Mitchell, manager at Banstead Manor Stud where Generous currently stands, said, "I can confirm the offer has been accepted by the required 75 percent of shareholders. It's now subject to contract and the necessary veterinary tests from Japan." Generous, voted Horse of the Year and Champion Three-Year-Old in Ireland in 1991, raced in the colors of Fahd Salman before retiring to stud in 1992. His first crop to race is now two; from four starters he has not yet sired a winner. Losing his services to Japan is sure to be seen as bad news in European breeding circles as it means the last four Epsom Derby heroes (including Dr. Devious, 1992; Commander In Chief, 1993; and Erhaab, 1994) have been taken away by the power of the yen.
