FRANKEL HITS GRAND SLAM IN

PACIFIC CLASSIC Bobby Frankel owns the Pacific Classic. Still flying high after his enshrinement in racing's hallowed Hall Monday in Saratoga, Frankel caught a jet back to California in time to saddle Tinners Way (Secretariat) in his quest for a fourth straight win in Del Mar's \$1,000,000 signature event, and the big red horse came through with a sure cure for jet lag, powering to a four-and-a-half length victory under jockey Eddie Delahoussaye. "I wanted this so badly." said Frankel. "I had faith in the horse and I didn't want to be wrong. I feel really, really good." It seems Frankel can do no wrong when it comes to this race. In just five runnings, the newest Hall of Fame trainer can claim four winners: Missionary Ridge (Caerleon), 1992; Marquetry (Conquistador Cielo), 1993; and Tinners Way, 1994 and '95; he also sent out the runner-up in '92, and finished 1-2-4 in '93--and not one of his runners has been favored. Tinners Way, 7-1 last year, was only the 5-2 second choice vesterday but proved much the best. Sitting just off moderate fractions cut out by the speedy Slew Of Damascus (Slewacide), the five-year-old moved with Soul Of The Matter (Private Account) as they headed around the far turn but quickly put that one away and galloped clear. "We drew a great post and the race shaped up just like I thought it would," said Frankel. "He actually ran a better race this year than last." Frankel, who has yet to win a Breeders' Cup race, becomes the first trainer to take a \$1 million stakes four years in a row, rivaling trainer D. Wayne Lukas' feat of four straight Triple Crown events. But he downplays his success, saying, "I was lucky with the right horses." Or the horses were lucky with the right trainer.

HENNESSY FUTURITY-BOUND Trainer D. Wayne Lukas said yesterday that star two-year-old Hennessy (Storm Cat) came back from his impressive Sapling victory in good order and will make his next start in the Del Mar (Sept. 13) or Belmont Futurity (Sept. 16). "We haven't decided on which one," said Lukas. "We may be leaning towards Del Mar, because (owners Bob and Beverly Lewis) live around there. That won't be the deciding factor, but we'll have to take that into account." Hennessy will remain at Monmouth for now. "We'll give him a chance to recover and probably ship him out around the first of the month," said Lukas. News cont. p2

Tinners Way was making only his fourth start since that victory and his third of the year. Second to Cigar in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup last out, the gleaming chestnut found no such rival in his path this time, rallying from just off the lead to put a head in front at the top of the lane and drawing clear. "Down the backside. I felt like I was in control of the race," said winning rider Eddie Delahoussaye. "I knew I had a ton of horse under me; when I asked my horse he fired--he fired big. I think he's just coming into himself. I'd like him against most any man's horse. Oh, you've got to beat Cigar, no doubt about that. But if Bobby wants to try that, I'll be there." Trainer Bobby Frankel will be trying for another big payday with the Juddmonte homebred next time, switching to the turf for the Arlington Million with an eye towards the Breeders' Cup Turf in October. CONCERN (Broad Brush), favored at 8-5, lost a three-way photo for third while lacking his usual late punch. "He broke in a bit on me and then he never handled the track at all," said rider Gary Stevens. "It was too loose for him. He gave it his best, but he never was comfortable out there."

ROUND TABLE LOOKS TO FUTURE Though the speakers came from diverse backgrounds, there was a central theme to yesterday's annual Jockey Club Round Table Conference For Matters Pertaining to Racing: how the industry can adapt to changing times. John Reardon, former President of MTV, told the audience gathered at the Gideon Putnam Hotel in Saratoga Springs, New York, that racing must not only strive for more television exposure, but must format its programming in a way that will lure a younger audience. "Do what the National Basketball Association did--make your sport an exciting entertainment experience that will attract the younger audience your sport so desperately needs to survive," he said. Steve Crist, New York Racing Association Director of Communications and Development, took virtually the opposite position, recognizing that while racing needed far more t.v. time, "racing must not be reinvented for television; sold as something it is not..." Masayuki Goto, New York representative for the Japan Racing Association, reported on the state of the industry in Japan, where a flourishing sport has been able to attract more young people and more women. He said that advertising campaigns focusing on the excitement and entertainment involved with the sport have been highly successful. In 1975, with advancements in off-track betting, on-track attendance at Japanese tracks eventually dropped 44 percent, but thanks to the JRA's recent efforts, on-track figures have rebounded to their pre-1975 levels. Will Farish, Vice Chairman of The Jockey Club, and Richard LeBere. CEO, Equibase Co., both spoke of the role Equibase can play in the gambling market of the future which will more and more include the information superhighway. "As racing moves forward with full-card simulcasting and into the age of interactivity, Equibase will provide for the industry the information and thus the freedom to promote racing in the very best manner possible. I am totally convinced there is no industry initiative more important than Equibase," said Farish.

RETAMA CANCELS SATURDAY CARD Retama Park was forced to cancel the final five races from Saturday's card after the jockeys deemed the track surface unsafe. A steady downpour of rain had turned the track into a sea of slop; it was the first time it had rained during live racing at Retama, and the first cancellation due to inclement weather for the Texas park. Fans in attendance were given rainchecks, and racing resumed Sunday. "We hope that fans in this new market understand that this is not a normal course of action for horse racing when it rains," said Retama President Bob Quigley.
