MONMOUTH INCREASES PURSES AGAIN

Purses at Monmouth Park's 1995 race meet have been raised for the fourth time with the announcement of an additional \$10,000 in purse monies offered daily until the end of the meet September 3. The increase is effective beginning with Friday's card. Overnight purses will average \$215,000 a day, a new all-time high for New Jersey and Monmouth Park. Overnight purses have risen 34 percent since the meet started May 31. They began at an average of \$160,000 a day. "The increases will range from \$500 to \$2,000," said Michael P. Dempsey, Monmouth's director of racing. "Four purse increases at a Monmouth Park meet is unprecedented, but the business and the horsemen's support certainly justifies it. This has to bode well, not only for the remainder of this meet but for the strong momentum we should carry into the Meadowlands."

MACOUMBA RETIRED Macoumba (Mr. Prospector), winner of last October's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp, has been retired due to a foot injury. The three-year-old bay filly suffered a chipped knee following her Longchamp score. But after undergoing successful surgery, she came back this spring to win the April 15 Prix Imprudence at Evry. Since then, however, she has failed to find the winners' circle, finishing sixth in the British 1000 Guineas and last in both the Coronation S. at Royal Ascot and the July 30 Prix d'Astarte at Deauville. Trainer Criquelette Head said, "Unfortunately, Macoumba broke a bone in her foot on her last run and will not be able to race again. It's a real shame; she was top-class on her day." Out of the Green Dancer mare Maximova (Fr), Kentucky-bred Macoumba is a half-sister to Graded/Group winners Septieme Ciel (Seattle Slew) and Maxigroom (Blushing Groom {Fr}).

JOCKEY CLUB PROJECTS FOAL CROP

INCREASE FOR 1996 The Jockey Club is projecting a 1996 registered foal crop of 35,700, a slight increase over the 1995 estimate of 35,200 and the second straight increase in annual foal crop numbers following eight consecutive years of decline. The projection, traditionally announced at the time of The Jockey Club Round Table Conference, is computed from Reports of Mares bred received for the 1995 breeding season. The North American registered foal crop reached an all-time high of 51,293 in 1986 and decreased each year until 1994, for an eight-year decline of 33 percent.

ELTISH (Cox's Ridge) set the pace in the initial stages of the race, with NEEDLE GUN (IRE) (Sure Blade) and Halling behind him. Annus Mirabilis was fourth, with ELA-ARISTOKRATI (IRE) (Danehill) fifth and G1 St. James Palace S. winner Bahri sixth. The order remained the same until the 1/2-mile pole, when Needle Gun started to go on from Eltish. With three furlongs to go, Bahri came with a challenge but by this time Halling was poised to take the lead. With 2 1/2-furlongs left it was a one-horse race, and Halling went on to win in impressive style. Halling is the third horse to win the G1 Coral Eclipse S. and the G1 Juddmonte Int'l in the same year, following in the footsteps of Ezzoud (Ire) (Last Tycoon {Ire}) last year. Winning jockey Walter Swinburn said, "There were no particular race plans today. The pace was just right; it was a brilliant result. Halling is just the most willing partner you could wish to find." This was Halling's eighth win in a row; he will head next for the Dubai Champion S. at Newmarket in October. Sheikh Mohammed, who is behind the Godolphin operation, said wintering the horse in Dubai had undoubtedly helped him, and that he may travel to compete in the Breeders' Cup Classic and then possibly return to Dubai to race. "He was very weak when in training (in Europe) last year, but improved a lot in Dubai," said Sheikh Mohammed. "He will almost certainly go to the Champion S. next before we think about preparing him for the Breeders' Cup."

Trainer Luca Cumani, successful in the last two runnings of the G1 Yorkshire Oaks with Only Royale (Ire) (Caerleon), banks this year on **Noble Rose (Ire)** (Caerleon). The Newmarket-based trainer had intended to run listed stakes winner Larrocha (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), also owned by Sheikh Mohammed, here. But she has been switched to Thursday's Galtres S., a move which enables her to avoid another clash with Irish Oaks heroine **Pure Grain (GB)** (Polish Precedent). The Sheikh is also represented by **La Confederation (GB)** (Nureyev), winner of last year's G2 Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket, from David Loder's stable.

Royal Applause (GB) (Waajib {Ire}), winner of Royal Ascot's G3 Coventry S. June 20, puts his unbeaten record on the line in the Gimcrack S. Trained by Barry Hills, the bay colt will face only four rivals, but the opposition may prove a lot stronger in quality than quantity. GSP **Take A Left (GB)** (Formidable), representing the same stable as last season's winner Chilly Billy (GB) (Master Willie {GB}), and **Tamhid (Gulch)**, an Ascot maiden scorer in his debut last month, are both highly-rated by connections.

Saturday, Saratoga:

TRAVERS S.-GI, \$750,000, 3yo, 1 1/4m

GII Jim Dandy winner **Composer** (Easy Goer) completed his final preparations for the Travers Tuesday at Saratoga. "We worked him on the main track," said trainer Bill Mott yesterday. "I caught him going five-eighths in 1:01 and change, but the clockers caught him going three-quarters in 1:14 and change. He did it very well and looked good. He was relaxed enough and did everything we wanted him to. Now he'll just gallop into the race." Trainer Alfredo Callejas reported Tuesday he is pleased with the way Jim Dandy runner-up **Malthus** (Temperence Hill) is training for the Travers. "We worked him five furlongs on the main track (Tuesday)," said Callejas. "He finished in 1:00 2/5, and galloped out in 1:13 3/5. He did it so easy. He came back feeling very good and I am now more happy with his training after this work than I was when he finished second in the Jim Dandy. He definitely improved off that race."

The Leo O'Brien-trainee, who won this event in 1991, '92, '93 and '94, will carry highweight of 124 pounds in today's running, spotting her six rivals from 11 to 18 pounds.

Luso broke first, setting a very slow pace, with Singspiel and Pentire in behind him. The order remained the same until, with three furlongs to go, Singspiel started to make up ground on Luso. He managed to take the lead with just 2 ½-furlongs to go, and was then challenged by Pentire. Pentire ranged almost ½-length in front of Singspiel, but then seemed to lost momentum, which spurred the latter on, resulting in the pair battling all the way to the line. After a lengthy wait for the result of the photo finish, Pentire was judged to be the winner. "It was very close; even the jockeys did not seem to know who had won, and I was far from certain," said Pentire's trainer Geoff Wragg. "He's very tough, but he might just have a complete break after this. He's in the Irish Champion, but I am inclined to rest him and then think about his preparation for the Breeders' Cup. We'll have to see how he comes out of this."
