COLONIAL DOWNS ATTRACTS NEW

INVESTOR Stansley Management Corp. announced Wednesday it has reached an agreement in principal for an immediate infusion of \$1 million in equity and a commitment for up to an additional \$9 million in equity funding for its Colonial Downs racetrack, Virginia's first parimutuel horse racing track, and its six Satellite Wagering Facilities. The investor, Jeffrey P. Jacobs, is president of Jacobs Investments Inc., a commercial and residential real estate development firm and a member of the Jacobs family, who owns the Cleveland Indians major league baseball team. Pending approval of the investment by the Virginia Racing Commission and satisfaction of certain other conditions, Jacobs will become at least a five percent shareholder in Stansley Management Corp. A former Ohio Republican state representative, Jacobs is also president of Jacobs Entertainment Inc., which is currently building a \$60 million casino in the Denver, Colorado area. Bond financing for Colonial Downs has been delayed since November, 1994 by an appeal filed by James Wilson and the Virginia Jockey Club. The appeal, which was rejected by the Richmond Circuit Court, is pending in the Virginia State Court of Appeals. Speaking about his investment, Jacobs said, "We believe Colonial Downs is a blueprint for successful horse racing and view the pending appeal as nothing more than a nuisance suit. We feel this is a flat out win-win investment for us and the horse industry in the state of Virginia." Colonial Downs was awarded the license to construct Virginia's only Thoroughbred and Standardbred pari-mutuel race track on a 345-acre site in New Kent County midway between Richmond and Williamsburg.

Winning trainer Michael Stoute said, "Pure Grain is tremendously game. She refused to settle and used up a lot of petrol as a result; otherwise, I'm sure she would have won much more impressively, especially if the pace had been stronger. She's in all the major races for the rest of the season, including the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe." Third-place finisher and German G1 winner Wind In Her Hair, 119 days in foal to Arazi, was running her last race before retirement.

COURTLY DEE DEAD Early Wednesday morning, August 16, Courtly Dee (Never Bend) died quietly in her paddock. She was 27 years old. Courtly Dee, Broodmare of the Year in 1983, produced eight stakes winners from 18 foals, including 1983 Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Althea and additional graded stakes winners Ali Oop, Ketoh, Native Courier, Aishah, Aquilegia and Twining. In addition, Courtly Dee's daughters have produced nine stakes winners to date, including Foreign Courier's son Green Desert, a Group 1 winner and champion in Europe and now a successful sire. Courtly Dee was owned by Alexander-Groves. She was boarded at King Ranch in Lexington, Kentucky.

WAAJIB TO JAPAN Celebrations were in order at Japan's Shadai Farm after the narrow victory by Royal Applause (GB) in the G2 Gimcrack S. at York Wednesday, as only hours before it was revealed that the twoyear-old's sire Waajib (Ire) (Try My Best) is to stand at stud there next season. The 12-year-old stallion goes to Shadai after Teruya Yoshida reached a deal with former owners Coolmore Stud. Details of Waaiib's valuation have not been released. Irish-bred Waaiib, a Group stakes winner in both France and England, stood his first season at Coolmore Stud in Ireland in 1989 after notching seven career victories for earnings of \$304,885. From four crops of racing age, including twoyear-olds of 1995, he has sired 35 winners and nine stakes-winners for progeny earnings-to-date of \$941,944.

CONSTRUCTION PROGRESSES AT FAIR

GROUNDS Construction is progressing on Fair Grounds' new \$27.5-million, 217,000-square foot grandstand/clubhouse project. The building is scheduled for completion January 11, 1996, midway through the live racing season beginning Thanksgiving Day, November 23, 1995 and running through March 25, 1996. A seven-alarm fire destroyed Fair Grounds' old grandstand December 17, 1993 and since then, the track has conducted its race meetings from temporary facilities. "We're halfway finished with the steel," said Fair-Grounds President and General Manager Bryan Krantz. "I think when the horsemen get back this fall, they're going to be surprised at the progress we've made." Construction began in July 1994, and the first permanent structure to be completed since the fire was an OTB building which has doubled as a temporary clubhouse. The OTB building was opened to the public in December 1994 at a cost of \$2.9 million.

CTHS YEARLING SALE AVERAGE UP The Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society, British Columbia Division, held its 1995 Summer Yearling Sale August 13. There were 103 yearlings sold for a gross of \$1,136,700 and an average of \$11,036, up 15.8 percent from the 1994 average of \$9,529. There were 33 individuals reported as not sold. The sales topper was a dark bay or brown filly by Vice Regent--Excruciation (Bold Hour), consigned by Salishan Meadows and purchased by L.S. Nordahl of British Columbia for \$50,758.
