TIMBER COUNTRY RETIRED Preakness

winner Timber Country (Woodman) suffered a tendon tear in his left foreleg during a workout at Monmouth Park and will be retired from racing, trainer D. Wayne Lukas said Thursday. "He worked tremendous Sunday with everyone watching," said Lukas. "He came back with what I thought was a little filling as he was cooling out. We iced it and the swelling went down. We had it scanned Monday and had Dr. Robert Copelan read it. He confirmed there is a small tear there, two inches above the ankle. Those things can heal but it takes forever and his career is pretty much enhanced. We're not going to try and bring him back." The three-year-old colt had not run since winning the GI Preakness S. May 20 and was being pointed toward the Sept. 4 Jerome H. when the injury occurred. "I thought he had a tremendous fall in front of him," said Lukas. "But he's the two-year-old champion, a classic winner, with a nice little bankroll. He's impeccably-bred with a great conformation. What more could you ask?" Lukas said Timber Country, owned by William T. Young, Graham Beck and Bob and Beverly Lewis, will remain at Monmouth until a decision is made about his future as a stallion. "There are three guys who own him and two of them are breeders," Lukas said. "There are some things being kicked around, but there will be an announcement soon." The 1994 Champion Two-Year-Old Colt retires with five wins from 12 starts for earnings of \$1,560,400. Along with the Preakness, his triumphs include the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, GI Moët Champagne S. and GIII Balboa S.

VISA SPONSORS TRIPLE CROWN CHALLENGE

Visa U.S.A. has signed an agreement with Triple Crown Productions and ABC Sports to become the Official Sponsor of the Triple Crown Challenge through the year 2000. As a part of the multi-year agreement, the Kentucky Derby, Preakness and Belmont S. will continue to be telecast by ABC. With this announcement, Visa becomes the "Official Credit Card of the Triple Crown Challenge." Additionally, Visa will receive the rights to conduct national and regional advertising and promotions using the Visa Triple Crown Challenge and ABC Sports logos. And, of course, Visa will be the only credit card accepted to purchase tickets to the three Triple Crown races. A spokesman for the Chrysler Corporation told the Daily Racing Form his company decided withdraw its sponsorship of the event because of a change in their target market; Chrysler has also withdrawn from several major golf tournaments.

SAFETY VESTS MANDATORY FOR ALL IN

NEW YORK The rule did not come in time to save exercise rider Antonio Vizcarrondo, but the New York State Racing and Wagering Board vesterday announced that beginning October 11, 1995, all persons riding horses on the grounds of a Thoroughbred pari-mutuel racetrack in the state will be required to wear safety vests. Currently, only jockeys are required to wear the vests. The announcement comes just two weeks after Vizcarrondo was killed in a training accident at Belmont Park; the 47-year-old exercise rider was thrown coming out of the starting gate and died after suffering massive trauma to the chest. The new rule will not become effective immediately as the Board wanted to allow enough lead time for the vests to become available from the manufacturers, but they recommend that all riders begin wearing them as soon as possible.


