# SEATTLE SLEW FILLY TOPS DEAUVILLE DAY

**TWO** Sunday's second day of the Deauville Summer Yearling Sale saw eight hips sell for more than 1,000,000FF; the session topper was a Haras du Quesnay filly by Seattle Slew--Navratilovna (Nureyev), who went for a bid of 3,700,000FF to English agent Tim Bulwer-Long, acting for Wafic Said. The yearling is a half-sister to Maximova (Green Dancer), dam of French G1 winners Macoumba and Septieme Ciel. The top colt went for 2,200,000FF to Horse France, bidding on behalf of Michael Tabor and John Magnier; the bay is a son of Caerleon out the Shirley Heights (GB) mare Infamy, who captured the GI Rothmans International. Sunday's total of 55 yearlings brought 33,770,000FF; the average of 614,000FF was down slightly from the '94 average of 621,521FF.

FOURSTARDAVE TO BE RETIRED Failing in his bid to win a race at Saratoga for the ninth straight year, New York-bred Fourstardave (Compliance) finished fifth in yesterday's fourth race at the Spa and is now likely to be retired. The 10-year-old, winner of 21 races and more than \$1.6 million, began his streak in 1987 with a win in the restricted Empire S.; over the next eight summers, he also picked up wins in Saratoga's Albany H. ('88), West Point H. ('89, '91, '93) and Daryl's Joy ('90-'91) as well as allowance races the last three seasons. "I'll have to speak to (trainer) Leo (O'Brien), but we're pretty sure we will retire him now," said owner Richard Bomze. "He's still physically fit and competitive, but he just doesn't have the punch he used to."

SARATOGA CUP, \$200,000, 3yo/up, 10f

GI Whitney H. winner Unaccounted For (Private Account) worked a bullet five furlongs in :58.71, breezing on the main track at Saratoga Saturday as he prepares for this Saturday's main event at the Spa. "It took him a little time to get on track this year," said trainer Scotty Schulhofer. "But he's a much better horse than last vear. He has matured well. I know he'll be picking up a few more pounds from his last race, but I don't think it will be significant." As for the future, Schulhofer said, "If he does well in the Saratoga Cup, he'll run in the Jockey Club Gold Cup, then possibly the Breeders' Cup Classic, I'm going to skip the Woodward. I don't want to run him against Cigar and Thunder Gulch at this time." The four-year-old, now a two-time graded stakes winner over the course, has won six of his 13 career starts.

# Sunday, Saratoga

HOPEFUL S.-GI, \$200,000, 2yo, 7f

Trainer Rick Schosberg said yesterday that Maria's Mon (Wavering Monarch), winner of the GII Sanford S. on opening day at Saratoga, is right on schedule for his Grade I debut. "It will take a good horse to beat him," he said, but added, "It is a very competitive field; there are no walk-overs in there." Describing his budding star, Schosberg said, "He was long and gangly at first. His action was not as coordinated as we would have liked. But he developed rapidly. He now has amazing action-he's about as fluid a two-year-old as I've seen in a while."

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas will send out two for the Hopeful, saddling both Sapling winner **Hennessy** (Storm Cat) and Saratoga Special victor **Bright Launch** (Relaunch). "We won't do much with Hennessy now," said Lukas. "We'll just try to keep him sharp and go from there." The colt will be bidding for his third straight stakes after taking the Hollywood Juvenile Championship and the Sapling at Monmouth.

**DEFRERE RETIRED Defrere** (Deputy Minister), who returned sore after winning an allowance race at Monmouth Sunday, has been retired with a hairline fracture of his right front cannon bone according to John Perrotta, stable manager for Due Process Stables. "He never changed leads turning for home," said Perrotta, "and (jockey) Jerry Bailey said he could tell he was off." The bone is the same one Defrere fractured prior to his first start as a two-year-old. "Vets have told us after that sort of operation you increase the bone density and that can cause hairline fractures," said Perrotta, who added that stud plans for the three-yearold colt remain uncertain. The full brother to 1993 twoyear-old champion Dehere retires with three wins from five starts and earnings of \$65,300.

**TIKKANEN TO NEW YORK** The 1994 Breeders' Cup Turf winner **Tikkanen** (Cozzene) has been transferred from Jonathan Pease's European stable to the New York barn of trainer Christophe Clement. Gearing up for a fall campaign at Belmont, he worked four furlongs in :49 2/5, breezing, over the Belmont training track Saturday. As Tikkanen was scheduled to ship to New York for the 1995 Breeders' Cup Turf, owner Geroge Strawbridge has decided to stable him there for the entire Belmont meet and once again shoot for major turf preps such as the Man o'War and the Turf Classic, a race he won last year. Tikkanen last raced in the July 2 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, finishing fourth.


