TRAINERS' BOOKKEEPER INVESTIGATED

Southern California-based trainers Bill Shoemaker and Craig Lewis believe their former bookkeeper embezzled over \$215,000, and the claim is being investigated by the Arcadia, California Police Department, according to a story in Tuesday's L.A. Times. Lewis fears he may have been overbilled by as much as \$200,000 by bookkeeper Susan Bradley, while Shoemaker guesses he lost about \$15,000 through his association with her. "She added workers to the payroll who weren't with me anymore, made up names, and endorsed and cashed the checks," Shoemaker told the paper, "but about two or three months ago she sent me a bill for about \$9,000 for helping on the case (Shoemaker's malpractice lawsuit). I called (my lawyer) and he said she wasn't working on the case." Susan Webb, Lewis new bookkeeper, told the Times Lewis became suspicious about six months ago, but believed Bradley was mismanaging, rather than stealing the money. "Craig couldn't figure out where the money was going, especially considering the year he had," Webb told the paper. Bob Anderson of the Arcadia Police Department told the Times they are close to issuing a warrant for her arrest. Lewis said Bradley disappeared after he told police of the missing money in July.

SALLY BAILIE DEAD Sally Bailie, the first female trainer to win a \$100,000 and a \$200,000 stakes race, died of cancer Monday morning at Winthrop Hospital in Mineola, New York. She was 58. Bailie saddled Win to back-to-back victories in the Bernard Baruch in 1984 and 1985 and came close to defeating John Henry in the 1984 Turf Classic at Belmont. A native of Somerset, England, Bailie was the leading female steeplechase rider in her native country before coming to New York in 1965 as an assistant to trainer Tommy Waller. She went out on her own in 1970 and later became the first woman to saddle a horse in the Japan Cup.

European invader Kaldounevees (Fr) (Kaldoun {Fr}) cleared quarantine early Tuesday morning and took to the Arlington track for the first time yesterday, jogging once around the oval. The four-year-old gray colt has won two Group 3 events in France this year; in his last start July 30 he finished second in the G1 Dr. Poth Baverisches Zuchtrennen in Germany. AVERAGE AND PERCENT OF HORSES SOLD DOWN AT DEAUVILLE The cumulative average is down four percent and the percentage of horses sold down 13 percent midway through Agence Francaise's Deauville Yearling Sale in France. Through Tuesday, a total of 215 yearlings had sold for an average of 360,358FF (\$71,358), down from 375,514FF (\$74,359) after three days of last year's sale. The percentage of horses sold during the first three days is 69.13 percent; 81.34 percent of horses passing through the ring the first three days of last year's sale were sold. There has been suspicion that a number of Japanese buyers would boycott the sale because of the French government's decision to go ahead with nuclear testing in the South Pacific. During Tuesday night's session, 105 yearlings were sold for an average of 178,685FF (\$35,383). The top seller of the day was a colt by Kenmare--Light A Star, who sold for \$655,000FF (\$129,702). The half-brother to Lights Out (Crystal Glitters), a G2SW in France, was consigned by Haras de la Louviere and purchased by J.F. Bernard, agent for Mme. Desmarais.

DEVELOPMENT, FINANCING APPROVED AT

LONE STAR The Grand Prairie, Texas sports corporation chose 'Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie' as the name for its proposed track and approved plans Monday night that will allow development and financing, according to a story in Tuesday's Fort Worth Star-Telegram. The paper said if the financing of \$55 million in bonds closes as expected Sept. 19, construction of the track will begin soon after with a projected Dec., 1996 opening. The Grand Prairie City Council was scheduled to approve the bond issue Tuesday night; it must then pass to the Texas attorney general. This Sept. 12, the Texas Racing Commission is scheduled to consider the track's construction plan as well as a proposal to offer simulcasting beginning in June, 1996.

NOT FOR LOVE TO STAND AT NORTHVIEW

Not For Love (Mr. Prospector), a full-brother to champion two-year-old and Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Rhythm, will enter stud at Northview Stallion Station in Chesapeake, Maryland in 1996. A stakes-placed winner of \$178,870 to date, Not For Love will stand for a projected stud fee of \$3,500. Rhythm is currently a freshman sire in Japan. "Not For Love's female family is one of the richest in the American stud book," said Northview President Richard Golden. "It's exciting to offer a horse with this much quality to the breeders in the Mid-Atlantic." The five-year-old will continue to race for Golden through November.

AUTOTOTE ANNOUNCES RESTRUCTURING

DETAILS Autotote Chairman and CEO A. Lorne Weil yesterday told shareholders that as a result of cost-cutting and restructuring programs, the company is confident it will meet its forecast of \$15 million in savings on an annualized basis. Speaking at Autotote's 1994 annual meeting, Weil outlined facility closings, personnel cutbacks and streamlined operations changes the company has undertaken to lower overhead and increase productivity.
