FOURSTARDAVE TO RACE AGAIN The

Fourstardave (Compliance) team has rethought its earlier decision to retire the 10-year-old gelding and will instead run him in an allowance race Monday at Saratoga on the closing day of the meet. Trainer Leo O'Brien has also fired jockey Richard Migliore and replaced him with 56vear-old Jean Cruquet. Still attempting to win at this year's meet and keep his eight-year Saratoga winning streak alive, Fourstardave is 0-for-3 at Saratoga in '95 and has yet to finish in the money. Following his most recent race, owner Richard Bomze said he would "likely be retired," but O'Brien and co-owner Bernard Connaughton apparently had other ideas. "We have to give him one more chance to redeem himself," said Connaughton. "He's entitled to another chance. He didn't run that badly the other day." Fourstardave hasn't finished in the money in six starts since breaking a bone in his left front ankle last year.

PRAIRIE MEADOWS FINDS SUCCESS WITH

SLOTS Prairie Meadows in Altoona, Iowa, a \$51 million facility that opened March 1, 1989 and guickly experienced problems with sagging attendance and handle, is now thriving after a \$24 million renovation that made way for 1,100 reel-style slot machines. The countyowned racetrack, which had over \$60 million in debt, now expects to wipe out that obligation in less than two vears. The slots have been in place since April 1 and daily average win is \$319 per machine. Horsemen receive a portion of the slot revenues and purses have increased more than \$1 million in 1995 over the previous year. "We really think we can be one of the premier tracks in the Midwest in the coming years," said Tom Timmons, vice president of parimutuel operations. "With the additional monies available to lowa-breds through the lowa Breeders Fund, the future of the horse industry as a whole in Iowa looks very promising." Prairie Meadows' 1995 Thoroughbred meet ended August 6.

Despite winning the GIII Finger Lakes Budweiser Breeders' Cup and GII A Phenomenon H. in his last two outings, Not Surprising was sent off the 9-2 third choice in this short four-horse field. Ridden once again by Robbie Davis, the gelding rated behind pacesetters Lite the Fuse and SLICK HORN (Red Ryder) down the backside, gradually gained while three-wide on the turn, accelerated to the front in midstretch then drew clear for the victory. "I never thought he could beat this field with such ease," said winning trainer Judson Van Worp. "This horse has to be the leading candidate for the Breeders' Cup Sprint with this victory. I'm considering the Vosburgh (Sept. 16 at Belmont) next, but I'll wait and see how he comes back. I want him to have at least one more prep before the Breeders' Cup." Overwhelming 3-5 chalk Lite the Fuse, also trying for his third straight graded stakes triumph, had the lead in upper stretch but failed to hold off challenges from the first two finishers. MGSP Our Emblem trailed the field for 1/2-mile, then rallied late to prove second best.

DEAUVILLE DAY FOUR Fifty-one yearlings sold for a gross of 6,440,000FF (\$1,275,247) and an average of 126,274FF (\$25,004) on the fourth day of the Agence Francaise yearling sales at Deauville Tuesday night. The average was off 12 percent from last year's figure of 141,039FF (\$27,928). Overall, 266 yearlings have been sold through day four, compared to 255 last year. The cumulative average of 315,477FF (\$62,470) trails last year's average of 328,619FF (\$65,073) by four percent. The percentage of RNAs also continues ahead of last year's figure. Sixty-nine percent of the horses passing through the sales ring have found buyers, compared to 79% at this stage of last year's sale. The sale continues through Thursday night.

OBS CONTINUES ON UPSWING The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company held the third session of its August yearling sale Wednesday, and both gross and average price continued to rise from last year's numbers. There were 174 yearlings sold Wednesday for a total of \$1,409,500 and an average of \$8,100. This represented an 8.4 percent increase over the '94 third session average of \$7,471, when 171 yearlings brought a total of \$1,277,600. Wednesday's session topper was **Mismarked Momma**, a bay filly by Notebook--Momma Laura (Rexson). Consigned by Red Sunset Farm, the Florida-bred filly was purchased by Walmac Bloodstock, agent for \$50,000. The sale concludes today.



BANDITOS YANQUIS By: Frank Carlson

The last three miles out of Mexico were the longest and the hardest. The same distance on Interstate 5, north of San Diego, takes three minutes; here, it takes three hours. The four-lane highway grinds to a halt and becomes a surrealistic view of a burgeoning colony of street people hawking their wares. Waifs, last seen in a Dickens novel, ply the captive tourists with straw baskets, candies of unknown origin, Power Rangers in all five colors. Less inventive teens wield water bottles and squeegees.

The three-hour delay, gratis U.S. Attorney General Janet Reno's get-tough border policy, was the end result of a Butch Cassidy/Sundance Kid foray into Tijuana. The purpose? Gambling, South of the Border, at the fabled Agua Caliente Race and Sports Book.

Opened in 1915, Caliente saw its glory days during Prohibition. It became the playground for Hollywood's playboys and idle rich during the Flapper Era. The thermal waters in the vicinity were used for therapeutic reasons and gave the track its name. Agua Caliente, the Hippodrome de Tijuana and gambling casino together with more sinful attractions, made the Tijuana of the '20s and '30s one of the wickedest towns in the world.

Most of that ended in 1935, when the Mexican government shut down Caliente for two years. It reopened without many of the attractions that had made it so notable.

But with Caliente's history and allure, it appeared to have all the ingredients of an excellent trip. It didn't.

Caliente is now more illusion than reality; all memories, no purpose. The casino was closed in the 1970's to be used as the headquarters of the Mexican Pacific Military Region. Horse racing continued on weekends until 1989, when management discontinued it in favor of simulcasting.

Imagine Belmont Park with just 50 patrons seated in the grandstands. The skeleton of the Thoroughbred track stands as a silent reminder of what once was. Greyhounds have replaced the horses. An elevated dog track rises over the surface where the great Phar Lap once thrilled the crowd, setting a track record for a mile-and-a-quarter in what would turn out to be his final performance.

The Caliente Classic was last run in 1988, won by Rayo Laser. Phar Lap prepped in the event in 1932, before a planned assault on Santa Anita. But Phar Lap died under mysterious circumstances after his race at Caliente and never had his chance to run in the U.S.

A dollar now buys a parking spot and admission to the Race and Sports Book, housed in buildings painted an electric red and featuring an architectural style somewhere between Aztec temple and Chinese restaurant. In its heyday, the Caliente stands would be filled, seating 25,000. Now the locals hang out on the first floor, with its scattered T.V.s for the simulcast signal from four U.S. Thoroughbred tracks plus the live dog races.

The second floor holds a Turf Club, which would not admit Butch and Sundance without jackets. Admission was the cost of a \$10 voucher.

All the money passed back and forth was in U.S. currency. *Racing Forms* were on hand for the Del Mar/Santa Rosa races, but you were betting blind on the Saratoga/Calder cards. However, the Whitney Handicap was part of the program at Del Mar that day, so the Del Mar *Form* contained the Whitney past performances. With the race available for betting at Del Mar, Calder and Saratoga, shopping the boards was an option. It was the highlight of the day.

Despite signs bragging of its existence, a search of the premises could not produce the Sports Book. So, with the East Coast races over, a junket further into the Baja for refreshments at a cantina seemed in order. The sleepy seacoast town of Rosarito offered a true taste of Mexico, and a walk to the edge of the Pacific Ocean gave us our only glimpse of live horses. Out of the sun rode a posse of tourists on the backs of horses of an unknown breed. They yipeed and yahooed like escapees from a spaghetti western, but they were obviously in search of bigger banditos. Butch and Sundance slipped out of town undetected.
