SETBACK FOR LITE THE FUSE Trainer Dick Dutrow reported from his barn at Saratoga Thursday morning that **Lite The Fuse** (Buckaroo) came out of Wednesday's GII Forego H. "with a little bit of a filled ankle." Dutrow added, "I don't anticipate any problems. It's just a jam-up. What's there will be gone within days. But I think I found the reason why he quit." The four-year-old sprinter had won three graded stakes this year, the GI Carter H., GII Tom Fool H. and GII Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial Dash, before fading in the stretch to finish third as the 3-5 favorite in the Forego. "Julie (Krone) said when he changed leads at the three-sixteenths pole, she felt him feel something and that's why she didn't really pursue with him through the lane," said the trainer. According to Dutrow, who also bred and owns the Light The Fuse, the colt is still on target to run next in the Sept. 16 Vosburgh H. at Belmont.

ALYWOW RETURNS SATURDAY **Alywow** (Alysheba), Canada's Horse of the Year in 1994, will make her much anticipated 1995 debut this Saturday in the one-mile \$32,600 Victoriana Prep over Woodbine's E.P. Taylor Turf Course. The four-year-old filly makes her return to racing after recuperating from minor surgery to repair a hairline fracture to a cannon bone, an injury which likely occurred during the Nov. 27 running of the Matriarch S. at Hollywood Park, in which she finished seventh. Following time off in Florida healing her injury, Alywow, owned and bred by Kinghaven Farms, returned to Woodbine in early summer to prepare for a fall campaign. Trainer Roger Attfield has set the Oct. 15 Rothmans Ltd. International as the Canadian-bred's long-term goal. Alywow, who was also Canada's top three-year-old filly and grass horse last year, won three stakes in '94 including the GIII Nijana S. at Saratoga. Her race record currently stands at six wins from 15 starts for earnings of \$558,403.

DEAUVILLE WRAP-UP During the six-day Deauville 1995 Yearling Sale, held in Deauville, France from August 19 to August 24, 320 lots, or 70.95 percent, of yearlings were sold, down from 77.14 percent sold last year. The gross of 89,547,000 francs (\$17,711,036) was up from 88,406,000 francs (\$17,485,364) in 1994. The average of 279,834 francs (\$55,347), however, represented a six percent decrease from last year's average of 297,663 francs (\$58,873).

SPINAWAY S.-GI, \$200,000, 2yo, f, 7f
Summer Squeeze (Summer Squall), winner of a maiden and allowance in her last two starts by a combined nine lengths, will start next in the Spinaway. "We've got a shot," said trainer Peter Vestal. "I've got a filly that wants to run all day. My main competition will probably be the filly that won the Adirondack (**Flat Fleet Feet** {Afleet}) and possibly (GII Schuylerville S. winner) **Golden Attraction** (Mr. Prospector), if she goes." **Birr** (Farma Way) will make her second career start in the Spinaway; trainer W. Elliott Walden purchased the filly privately on behalf of Prestonwood Farm after she trounced a field of maiden claimers by nine lengths in her Aug. 2 debut at Saratoga. Birr worked a half-mile yesterday in :47.14. "It was a very good move; it's the last thing that she'll do of any consequence before the race," said Walden. **Crafty But Sweet** (Crafty Prospector), who took the GIII Sorority S. at Monmouth August 6, will also contest the Spinaway. "She came back fine from that race and she's doing well," trainer Robert Barbara said. Barbara may also send **Strawberry Clover** (Darn That Alarm) postward; the Florida-bred filly, fifth in the Adirondack, breezed three furlongs in :35.87 at Saratoga Thursday.

**News Continued.****STRONG OBS YEARLING SALE CONCLUDES**

Getyourpantsdirty, a bay colt by Prospector's Halo--Tales of Pleasure (Honest Moment), took top honors at Thursday's fourth and final session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales August Yearling Sale. Consigned by Johnson Hollow Farm, agent, the colt was purchased for the day's highest price of \$58,000 by McKathan Brothers, agent. Overall, 159 yearlings were sold for a total of \$1,137,000 and an average of \$7,151, up 7.3 percent from last year's fourth session average of \$6,663. Through the sale's three open sessions, held Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, 508 yearlings brought \$4,141,800 for an average of \$8,153, up a solid 12.3 percent from last year's combined open session average of \$7,258.

ENJOY THE SILENCE RETIRED Red Oak Stables'

Enjoy the Silence (Valid Appeal), a six-time stakes winning sprinter of \$263,251, has been retired. Hialeah-based trainer Gregory D. Sacco said of the six-year-old Florida-bred mare, "Enjoy the Silence has been retired 100 percent sound and will be shipped to the Brunetti family's Red Oak Farm, located in Ocala, Florida, by private van Saturday morning." The mare is scheduled to be bred to **Gulch** (Mr. Prospector) this February.
