FULL-CARD SIMULCASTING BOOSTS

SARATOGA HANDLE Buoved by solid inter-track wagering, the total handle for the 1995 Saratoga meet was up 6.6 percent; a total of \$384,769,883 was wagered during the 34-day season which ended yesterday, up from \$360,798,301 in 1994. While on-track handle was down 7.2 percent and wagering at the Aqueduct simulcast was off 25.9 percent from 1994, the ITW numbers were strong, showing a 72 percent increase over last year's figure; the ITW total was \$114,683,672 this year as compared to just \$66,512,701 a year ago. Total attendance both on-track, 753,278, and at the Aqueduct simulcast, 176,402, was off from 1994, down 4.1 percent on-track and 19.5 percent at Aqueduct. In the trainer and lockey races, Bill Mott led the conditioners for the third time in four years with 18 victories, and '94 jockey champ Jerry Bailey topped the rider standings once again with a Saratoga record 47 wins.

LAKE CONISTON HEADS HAYDOCK SPRINT

Lake Coniston (Bluebird), top-rated sprinter in Europe following his impressive win in Newmarket's July Cup last time out, looks certain to start an odds-on favourite for Saturday's six-furlong G1 Haydock Park Sprint Cup, and a change in the weather has his trainer, Geoff Lewis, optimistic about his chances. After what has been Britain's hottest summer in 20 years, nearly a half an inch of rain fell on the Haydock course Sunday, ensuring perfect conditions for the four-year-old sprint star. "The horse goes well enough when it's fast, but good ground would be fair to everyone and there should be no excuses," said Lewis. Also expected for the race are Cool Jazz (Lead On Time), Owington (Green Desert), So Factual (Known Fact), Branston Abby (Risk Me), Cherokee Rose (Dancing Brave), Lavinia Fontana (Sharpo), Mind Games (Puissance) and Princely Hush (Prince Sabo). Lake Coniston is currently being quoted at 4-7, with So Factual next in the early betting at 3-1. News cont. p2
