DEFRERE TO STAND AT HILL 'N' DALE Defrere

(Deputy Minister) will stand the 1996 breeding season at the new stallion facility at Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Winchester, Ky. Campaigned by Due Process Stables, the 3year-old full brother to 1993 Champion two-year-old Dehere was retired Aug. 21 after returning lame from a winning effort at Monmouth, X-rays revealed he had suffered a fracture in his right front cannon bone, the same bone he broke as a two-year-old. The syndicated stallion will stand for \$5,000, live foal, "I'm very excited about having him here," said Hill 'n' Dale President John Sikura. "He was a horse with a world of ability which was compromised by physical ailment. He was very fast and has a very active pedigree, and Deputy Minister is emerging as a sire of sires." Response to the colt has already been strong, according to Due Process stable manager John Perrotta. "Obviously, we were disappointed he wasn't able to show more of his brilliance as we've all along felt he had as much talent as his brother," said Perrotta, "but he apparently showed plenty to the breeders, who had already put in requests to breed to him before we had even finalized the details." Stakes-placed, Defrere retires with three wins from five starts and earnings of \$65,300.

BELMONT OPENS TODAY Belmont Park opens its gates today for the 1995 Fall Meeting. Racing returns to a six-day-a-week schedule, with Tuesdays dark, throughout the meet, which ends Sunday, Oct. 29. The 56 stakes races to be run include 19 GI contests. A trio of events--Super Saturday, Sept. 16; Breeders' Cup Preview Day, Oct. 7; and Breeders' Cup Championship Day, Oct. 28--shape up as a coronation march to championship honors. The Horse of the Year category could come into question early as Thunder Gulch (Gulch) and Cigar (Palace Music) both have the \$500,000 Woodward S. on Super Saturday on their dance cards. Two weeks before the Breeders' Cup, New York-breds get their shot at a championship day of their own. New York Showcase Day, Saturday, Oct. 14, features seven New York-bred stakes topped by the \$250,000 Empire Classic H. Belmont will offer one daily simulcast program from such tracks as Arlington, Calder, Keeneland and Monmouth Park, with nightly twilight simulcasts after the day's races. Post time is 1:00 p.m. except Breeders' Cup Day, which has an 11:00 a.m. first post and closing day, Oct. 29, with a noon first post.

RACING COMES TO INDIANA Hoosier Park at Anderson will make Indiana history when it presents the first thoroughbred card in the state's annals at 7 p.m. tonight. The first parimutuel track in Indiana, Hoosier Park opened one year ago today when it presented a standardbred meet. Since that time, an additional \$3 million in improvements have been made to prepare for the 42-day thoroughbred meeting, which will be highlighted by the Indiana Derby Saturday, Oct. 7. A total of 11 stakes are scheduled for the meet, which runs through Oct. 28. A five-day week is scheduled, with a first post Wednesday through Saturday set at 7 p.m. A Sunday day card begins at 1:30 p.m. Races will be conducted on a 7-furlong track, with simulcasting offered daily, except Tuesday. Hoosier Park is a public/private partnership between the city of Anderson and Hoosier Park, LP, a limited parntership between the Churchill Downs Management Company and Pegasus Group.

Balboa S. winner **Cobra King** (Farma Way), is expected to be the Del Mar Futurity favorite.

The 1993 Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Cardmania (Cox's Ridge) is back in the spotlight, but on a different stage. The retired 9-year-old gelding will warm up for an appearance in the Tournament of Roses Parade on New Year's Day with an appearance in the Norco, California Labor Day Parade. He will be ridden by Helen Meredith, wife of trainer Derek Meredith, a driving force in the Pegasus Foundation, which serves as a haven for retired racehorses in Mira Loma.
