TIMBER COUNTRY SALE FINALIZED The sale of 1994 Champion Two-Year-Old Colt **Timber Country** (Woodman) was finalized Friday, September 1, after the Kentucky-bred successfully passed all the veterinary tests required. This year's Preakness S. winner was purchased by Narvick International (Emmanuel de Seroux), agent, for Mr. Teruya Yoshida. He will stand at stud beginning with the 1996 breeding season at the Yoshida brothers' Shadai Stallion Station, in Hokkaido, Japan, where he will be syndicated. Timber Country will leave trainer D. Wayne Lukas' Churchill Downs stable for Stone Farm in Paris, Kentucky very shortly, and will be shipped to Japan in October.

DATES WAR IN CHICAGO? A bitter clash over 1996 Chicago racing dates is anticipated in the wake of Arlington International Racecourse's request for an unprecedented 144-program meet, beginning May 1 and ending November 17. If Dick Duchossois' \$200-million track is awarded the dates, a week would be slashed from the normal Sportsman's Park spring meet, and nearly five weeks from Hawthorne Race Course's fall meeting. Hawthorne President Tom Carey called Arlington's proposal "preposterous." Sportsman's President Stormy Bidwill said, "When Duchossois starts to kill my meeting and Carey's, it's not right. We tried to work with him and help him this year. We never have done anything to try and hurt his meeting." Duchossois, who had originally threatened to close his track for 1995, agreed to a 55-day mini-meeting only after both Bidwill and Carey pledged to subsidize his purses if they fell below \$190,000 per day because of competition from the riverboat casino in nearby Elgin; purses at Arlington are now in the neighborhood of \$266,000 daily without the aid of the two tracks. Defending the 1996 dates request, Arlington CEO Scott Mordell said the proposal "puts us in the ballpark of having the opportunity to make some money." Mordell, a graduate of Northwestern business school, projects losses of between \$5 million and \$8 million for the current Arlington meeting. He added, "We want as much industry unity as possible. We could have applied for the whole schedule, but we didn't. We want other tracks to be profitable as well." The Illinois Racing Board will conduct its annual dates hearing September 19 and is expected to release the 1996 schedule that day.

ROY TO DARBY DAN Darby Dan Farm in Lexington, Kentucky yesterday announced the acquisition of Roy (Fappiano) from Haras Figuron in Chile. The 12-year-old stallion has been the leading sire in Chile every year since 1991, when he was the number one two-year-old producer as well as number one on the general sire list. John Phillips, managing partner of Darby Dan, said, "This son of Fappiano has sired 45 stakes winners, including 16 Group 1 winners, since 1991. Even more impressively he is the leading sire of stakes-winners, winners and starters by foals in the world. The evidence that Roy moves his mares up profoundly is overwhelming. His statistics so thoroughly dominated South America that he financially outgrew the continent. This is the most exciting importation of a proven stallion by Darby Dan since Ribot." Florida-bred Roy was multiple graded stakes-placed during his North American racing career, finishing second in the GII Sanford S. at Saratoga, third in the GIII Jaipur S. at Belmont and fourth in the GII Withers S. at Aqueduct. He retired with three wins from 17 starts for earnings of \$91,567. Plans are to syndicate the stallion and stand him for \$10,000 live foal guaranteed, beginning with the 1996 breeding season.

D'ACCORD RETURNS TO NEW YORK D'Accord

(Secretariat), who stood at Sugar Maple Farm in Poughquag, New York until he was moved to Jonabell Farm in Lexington, Kentucky for the 1995 breeding season, will be leaving Jonabell within the next few weeks to return to New York. The 16-yearold stallion will stand the 1996 season at John Hettinger's Akindale Farm in Pawling, New York. The decision to relocate D'Accord to the Empire State was made by his syndicate members. A winner of five of ten starts including the 1981 GII Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland, D'Accord has sired 15 stakeswinners and the earners of \$9,013,058 to date. From nine crops to race, including two-year-olds of 1995, his progeny include MGSW's Lady D'Accord and Montreal Red, as well as GII winners Warfie and Yestday's Kisses.

JOCKEY CLUB ON THE INTERNET The Jockey Club formally unveiled a new presence on the Internet's World Wide Web Friday, Accessible through http://www.equineonline.com, the new "home page" incorporates news, services and information from each of The Jockey Club's affiliate and subsidiary organizations, including The Jockey Club Information Systems Inc., Equibase Company and the Performance Horse Registry Inc. TURFWAY INCREASES FALL PURSES Turfway Park has announced a purse increase for its Fall Meet before it has begun. The increase comes in the form of Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF) supplements to all non-claiming maiden events as well as allowance races. In Kentucky, these races have a base purse from the track, plus KTDF funds for eligible Kentucky-bred horses. Races will receive a KTDF boost of \$3,000 to \$4,000 (21.4% to 22.1%) from the amounts listed in the first condition book. "These purses more accurately reflect the level of business we have been able to achieve and that we are projecting for the Fall Meet," said Turfway President Mark Simendinger. "We are anticipating a very successful meet, so it was our decision to pay this high level of purses from the beginning rather than announcing a purse increase midway through a short meet." Turfway's 23-day Fall Meet begins Wed., Sept. 6 and runs through Friday, Oct. 6.

SENATOR MCCONNELL AWARDED ROLAPP

AWARD Senator Mitch McConnell of Kentucky was awarded the Rolapp Award at a luncheon at Keeneland Racetrack Sept. 1. The award, established in memory of R. Richards Rolapp, American Horse Council president from 1978-1993, is presented each year to a member of Congress who has been of great service to the horse industry. Will Farish, vice chairman of the AHC, presented the award to the Senator. "Senator McConnell has worked tirelessly and with great success on behalf of the horse industry," Mr. Farish said. "He understands the horse business and its economic importance to Kentucky and the nation. The AHC is pleased to recognize that kind of leadership in Washington." Most recently, Senator McConnell introduced legislation to amend the Internal Revenue Code to modify the application of the passive loss limitations to individuals in the business of breeding, racing or showing horses.


SECOND WINNER FOR MISTER FRISKY Superb
