SERENA TO TURFWAY Serena's Song (Rahy), an impressive winner of Sunday's GI Gazelle H. at Belmont Park, will make her next start in the Sept. 23 \$200,000 Turfway Budweiser Breeders' Cup at 1 1/16 miles, trainer Wayne Lukas confirmed yesterday. Pre-Breeders' Cup plans beyond that point remain uncertain, however. "I don't know if that will be her only start before the Breeders' Cup," said Lukas. "We'll run in that one and take a look at it. This race is good timing. It's a good distance and it's around two turns. There are a lot of things to like." Lukas still has not made a definite decision on Thunder Gulch (Gulch)'s next start, but the Kentucky Derby winner appears to be headed to Turfway as well, with Lukas reiterating Tuesday that he is "leaning" toward the Sept. 23 Kentucky Cup Classic.

GUINNESS CHAMPION S.-G1, 3yo/up, 1 1/4mT Pentire (GB) (Be My Guest), whose only defeat in six

starts this year came at the hands of Epsom Derby hero Lammtarra, will sign off for 1995 in the Guinness Champion S. The Geoff Wragg-trained three-year-old worked well at Newmarket over the weekend, so his connections, who had been considering giving him a rest until next year, have now decided on one more run before giving him the winter off. "Pentire worked exceptionally well and is all set to go to Leopardstown, but that will be it for the year," said Wragg. "He stays in training next season and there's no point asking him to do any more. He's done tremendously well already." Among Pentire's six victories so far this year were the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York and the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot. His opposition is likely to include '94 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe runner-up Hernando (Fr) (Niniski) and G1 winner Valanour (Ire) (Lomond). Spectrum (Ire) (Rainbow Quest), winner of the Irish 2000 Guineas this past spring, will also run if the ground is good or softer. But trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam insisted, "He will not travel if the going is firm." Dermot Weld's Definite Article (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), second in the Irish Derby, heads the home defense of the G1 prize.

Tonight, Woodbine:

Tonight Woodbine hosts the Canadian Breeders Sales Yearling Sales Stakes, which will feature 59 Canadianbred Thoroughbreds who "graduated" from the local sales ring. The Sales Stakes will serve as a prelude to the CBS Select Canadian-bred Yearling Sale, to be held at Woodbine Sept. 7 and 8. Among those featured on tonight's card are Charlie's Dewan (Charlie Barley), winner of the third jewel of the Canadian Triple Crown, the Breeders' S., who was bought back by his breeder Kinghaven Farms when bidding at the yearling sales stopped at \$9,000; and Scotzanna (Silver Deputy), a \$7,584 yearling bargain who has won of five of six starts including the GII Prioress S. at Belmont for earnings of \$206,610. Charlie's Dewan is entered in the Halton S. (GIIIC) at 1 1/8-miles on the turf, while Scotzanna will run against the boys in the six furlong Kenora S. (GIIIC). Other Canadian-bred stars entered in tonight's six Sales Stakes, worth \$104,750 each, include MSW Holly Regent (Steady Growth), SW All Firmed Up (Affirmed), SW For Pete's Sake (Clever Trick) and Canada's Champion Older Horse in 1993 Cozzene's Prince (Cozzene). First post is at 6 p.m.

SAYYEDATI HAS DATE WITH GULCH Savvedati (GB) (Shadeed), heroine of the Newmarket 1000 Guineas in 1993 and winner this season of the Sussex S. at Goodwood, has a date with Kentucky-based stallion Gulch (Mr. Prospector) when she retires after a bid for next month's Breeders' Cup Mile. The five-year-old mare, fourth behind Ridgewood Pearl in last Sunday's Prix du Moulin at Longchamp, has run her final race in Europe now and will take a short break before flying to Belmont Park for the Oct. 28 Breeders' Cup. Joe Mercer, manager for Sayyedati's owner Mohamed Obaida, said, "She will be staying in the States after she's run in the Breeders' Cup Mile. It would be a wonderful way to finish if she could win it." Sayyedati has run in the Breeders' Cup once before, finishing 12th in the 1993 Sprint.

TURFWAY OPENS TODAY Turfway Park in Florence, Kentucky, with record purses and a brand new Grand Entrance Plaza and Paddock Saddling Area, opens for its 23-date Fall Meet today. The meeting will be highlighted by the second running of the \$1-million Kentucky Cup Day of Champions, to be held Saturday, Sept. 23. Post time for the first race is 7 p.m. Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and 1:30 p.m. Saturdays and Sundays, with the exception of Kentucky Cup Day, which will have a 12:30 p.m. first post. The record purses will total more than \$5 million, or in excess of \$225,000 a day, and the season extends through Friday, October 6. Stakes purses for the meet total \$1.2 million; the stakes action kicks off Saturday, Sept. 9 with the \$75,000 Turfway Championship.
