THUNDER GULCH TO KENTUCKY CUP Thunder Gulch (Gulch) will join stablemate Serena's Song (Rahy) at Turfway Park Sept. 23 and will start in the \$400,000 Kentucky Cup Classic, trainer Wayne Lukas confirmed yesterday. "I want to do everything I can to have him the best he can be on Breeders' Cup Day," said Lukas. "This gives me more time and gives me a nice break (before the Breeders' Cup)." The trainer added that while it is "doubtful" Thunder Gulch will start between the Kentucky Cup and the Breeders Cup, a start in the Oct. 7 Jockey Club Gold Cup is not out of the question. Lukas also said avoiding Cigar (Palace Music) in the Woodward had nothing to do with his decision to go to Kentucky. "The time to meet Cigar is now," he said. "If that were one of my concerns, I would go to the Woodward. Cigar will be coming off a 10-week layoff and may not be as sharp as he can be. We're giving him the edge by giving him a couple of races."

CIGAR WORKS FOR WOODWARD Cigar (Palace Music), winner of all nine of his starts since being switched from turf to dirt last October, worked a mile Wednesday morning at Belmont in an even 1:41.93 in preparation for the Sept. 16 GI Woodward S. "Considering he worked by himself, it's what I would have expected him to do," said trainer Bill Mott. "It was a good move. He'll have one more breeze the middle of next week." The five-year-old has not raced since winning the \$1,000,000 Hollywood Gold Cup July 2. "He's responded well to his layoff," Mott said. "He's a nice horse to train because he's sensible...very smart. He's a willing work horse but he won't do more than he has to do." Among those scheduled to face Cigar in the Woodward is Belmont S. runner-up Star Standard (Risen Star).

The four-year-old made her first start on the turf July 19 at Hollywood Park, finishing second by 1/2-length to Morgana (El Gran Senor) in the one-mile Melvin Durslag S. "She was just beat in her last race and I expect improvement," said Mandella. A victory would put Phone Chatter's earnings over the \$900,000 mark. Expected to face the chestnut once again is Gary Jones-trainee Morgana, who has raced just once since defeating Phone Chatter, finishing second to Possibly Perfect in the GI Ramona H. at Del Mar Aug. 5. "Morgana is doing well and all systems are go," said assistant trainer Marty Jones. "Hopefully we'll get an honest pace for her. If we don't, (frontrunner) Yearly Tour (Half a Year) could be tough."

ELTISH TO FRANKEL Eltish (Cox's Ridge), runnerup in last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile and sixth in the Kentucky Derby, is set to leave Henry Cecil's yard to join Bobby Frankel's stable in California. "Eltish has left my yard and will now race in the States," said Cecil. "He has run two good races there and it makes sense for him to have another chance to prove himself on dirt. He's tough, strong and very sound." Eltish has yet to win as a three-year-old, coming closest when second by a short head to Muhtarram (Alleged) in the Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot.

SOUL CITY DESTROYED Soul City (Carson City), one of the more impressive two-year-old winners in New York this year with his six-length debut victory at Belmont Monday, was humanely destroyed Tuesday following an operation to repair two broken front cannon bones. The \$225,000 two-year-old purchase was vanned from the track following Monday's race and was euthanized during surgery the following day. "Dr. (Stephen) Selway got in there, examined the joints and felt it was impossible to get any stability in the legs," said trainer John Kimmel. "Both were condylar displaced fractures, and he recommended we put the horse down. This was a tough pill to swallow."

NUMEROUS RETIRED TO HILL 'N' DALE Numerous (Mr. Prospector) has been retired due to a foot injury and will stand at Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Lexington, Ky. for the 1996 breeding season. "Numerous is a superb individual who sold for \$1.7 million dollars as a yearling and is the full brother to Jade Robbery, one of the most prominent young stallions in Japan," said Hill 'n' Dale President John Sikura. Numerous earned \$255,348 in his career, including a win in the 1994 GIII Derby Trial S. The four-year-old colt made his last start Monday at Arlington Park.

### AUTOTOTE SHOWS THIRD OUARTER LOSS

Autotote Corporation announced losses of \$29.2 million, or \$1.01 per share, on 28.9 million shares outstanding for the third fiscal quarter ending July 31. The company recorded unusual charges of \$22.8 million in the third quarter, resulting from their restructuring, bank credit agreement fees and valuation adjustments. Recurring service revenues increased by 30.4%, to \$34.6 million, which the company attributed to improved operations in Connecticut OTB, North American parimutuel and simulcast operations.


