KEENELAND INTRODUCES "FALL STARS

WEEKEND" Keeneland will kick off its 16-day fall race meeting with "Fall Stars Weekend," during which five stakes races worth \$950,000 will be run Saturday and Sunday, Oct. 7 and 8, Included in "Fall Stars Weekend" are the GI Spinster, GII Breeders' Futurity, GII Alcibiades S. and GIII Keeneland Breeders' Cup. "By scheduling several of our most important fall features on the first two days, it gets the meeting off to an exciting start and gives horses plenty of time between Keeneland's races and the Breeders' Cup," explained Keeneland President Bill Greely. The traditional centerpiece of the fall meeting, the \$300,000a, weight-for-age Spinster for fillies and mares, ages three and up at 1 1/8-miles, will be run Sunday, Oct. 8. That same day, Keeneland will run two, \$200,000a races for two-yearolds, the Breeders' Futurity for juveniles of either sex and the Alcibiades for fillies. Opening day features two turf races, the \$175,000a Keeneland Breeders' Cup for ages three and up and the \$75,000a Valley View Breeders' Cup for three-year-old fillies.

JOCKEY CLUB RELEASES 1993 BREEDING

STATISTICS The Jockey Club yesterday released breeding statistics on 6,335 Thoroughbred stallions reported as having covered 62,003 mares in 1993. These coverings resulted in 38,152 foals of 1994. The figures indicate an overall average live foal percentage of 61, the same as the previous year. The number of stallions decreased by 7.6 percent from the 6,858 reported in 1992. There was a 5.7 percent decline from the 65,759 mares reported bred in 1992, reflecting a similar decrease in the 1994 registered foal crop. Thoroughbred breeding activity in Kentucky topped all other regions. In the Bluegrass state 14,409 mares reported bred in 1993 produced 10,133 live foals. California reported 5.976 mares bred and 3,960 live foals. Florida was ranked third with 5,841 mares and 3,758 live foals. Remaining states on the top ten breeding activity list were: Texas, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Maryland, Washington, New York and Illinois. The complete list of U.S.bred foals dropped abroad is as follows: Brazil (35), India (31), Mexico (25), Ireland (23), Argentina (18), France (17), Philippines (8), Colombia (7), Australia (4), Peru (4), Trinidad and Tobago (2) and Italy (1). Countries failing to file reports included Chile, the Dominican Republic and Thailand.

ELLIS PARK SHOWS GAINS The recently concluded 60-day Ellis Park meet showed positive gains in most areas. Attendance on-track was up 1.7 percent from 1994, and on-track handle rose 1.4 percent. A record \$36 million was wagered on Ellis Park's races from outside of Kentucky, up a whopping 290 percent from last year. Total wagering on Ellis Park's races in 1995 was \$91,927,618 (a daily average of \$1,532,127), up 31.3 percent over the near \$70 million in 1994. Full fields of horses vied for record levels of purse money in 1995. An average of 9.6 horses were entered per race (up from 9.3) to compete for a daily average of \$148,640 in purses (up from \$114,132).
