STORM CAT COLT TOPS STRONG

KEENELAND OPENER Bringing in a bid of \$700,000, a colt by Storm Cat--My Ballerina (Sir Ivor) topped vesterday's opening day of Keeneland's 1995 September Yearling Sale. Consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, agent, the dark bay went to Demi O'Byrne, acting on behalf of John Magnier of Coolmore Stud and Michael Tabor. The horse will be trained by D. Wayne Lukas, who said, "He's very good looking--one of the best Storm Cats I've ever seen. He's got a pedigree to stay. He could be a horse for the Derby." Alice Chandler. agent for Mill Ridge, was delighted by the bid. "This has exceeded my expectations," she said. "It has been very exciting. I feel that people in general are really upbeat--I think the mood has changed in the last 18 months." The first day of the 10-day auction certainly reflected an upswing. A total of 290 yearlings went through the ring, bringing in \$32,551,000 for a solid average of \$112,245. The gross was up nearly 33 percent, from \$24,494,000 in 1994, while the average rose nearly 32 percent, from \$85,049 a year ago. One beneficiary of the strong bidding was pinhooker Gerry Dilger. Dilger's Dromoland Farm, acting as agent for a pair of partnerships, sold five yearlings that had been purchased as weanlings for a total of \$273,000; the quintet brought in \$1,135,000 for a profit of \$862,000. "I'm no genius, I'm just lucky" said Dilger. "I didn't feed them any different; I got them ready for the sale the same way. I just had the right horses." Dromoland's top seller was a Majestic Light--Perfect Point (Nijinsky II) colt; picked up for \$50,000 from last year's Keeneland November sale, the bay brought down a bid of \$410,000 from Centennial Farms. The session's top filly, a daughter of Seeking the Gold out of the MGISW Dontstop Themusic (Stop the Music) consigned by Woodlynn Farm, Inc., was purchased for \$600,000 by Clarence Scharbauer, Jr. The chestnut will be sent to Lukas, who has not trained for Scharbauer before; the owner has big plans for his new acquisition. "I want to win the Kentucky Oaks," he said. Added Lukas, "We rated her the number-one filly in the sale, and her residual value is absolutely great. She is by as popular a stallion as there can be, out of a great race mare. It was a marriage made in heaven that worked great--they got a very, very strong filly." The Keeneland September Sale continues through Wednesday, September 20.

CONCERN OUT OF WOODWARD Following a subpar workout yesterday morning in Maryland, trainer Dick Small announced that 1994 Breeders' Cup Classic winner Concern (Broad Brush) will not be making the trip to Belmont Park for Saturday's Woodward. "He had a kind of ho-hum work just now," said Small. "It was okay, but it wasn't sparkling. He went a mile--went the first half in :50 and then came up empty the second half. We got him in 1:44, 1:45, something like that. For any other horse it would have been all right, but going up there with anything less than his best to face those horses wouldn't be right." Small added that future plans for the colt are up in the air. "We had him scoped and he didn't bleed," he said. "We're trying to puzzle out what the problem is."

EQUINE TRAUMA CENTER NAMED FOR

GALBREATH The Ohio State University announced yesterday that it will name the College of Veterinary Medicine's new equine center "The Daniel M. Galbreath Equine Trauma, Intensive Care and Research Center" to honor the memory of the late Colombus area developer, civic leader and Thoroughbred breeder. "Ohio State would not be quite the same were it not for the attention, love and support of Dan Galbreath," said Ohio State President E. Gordon Gee. "He was an exceptional university citizen whose legacy to Columbus, Ohio State and all of higher education will be long remembered." The 40,000 square foot, \$6.9 million equine center is scheduled to open in 1996. It will include a modern research center where faculty can develop, conduct and teach medical and surgical procedures; two state-of-theart surgeries; intensive care units; and a high-speed treadmill.

CANADIAN BREEDERS SALE CONCLUDES

During Friday night's second and final session of the Canadian Breeders' Sales select Canadian-bred yearling sale at Woodbine, 68 horses were sold for a gross of \$1,684,500 and an average of \$24,772. The session topper was **Darby Jane**, a dark bay or brown filly by Silver Deputy--Lady D'Arbanville (Cornish Prince). A full sister to Deputy Jane West, the Champion Two-Year-Old and Three-Year-Old Filly in Canada in 1992 and '93 respectively, Darby Jane was consigned to the sale by Trifactor Stable, agent for Lady Slipper Farm, and purchased by R. Glenn Sikura, agent, for \$95,000. Overall, the 1995 sale saw 131 yearlings bring a gross of \$3,251,900 and an average of \$24,823, down 5.8 percent from last year's average of \$26,353.
